# Vote on the amendment to Bylaw article 8.f

### Bylaw article 8f (related to the jury for the DMSPPF)

- Current Bylaw article 8f: Applications are judged by a three members committee chaired by David
  Martell or by a delegate nominated by him or otherwise by the SIG President. The two other judges are,
  preferably, the Forestry SIG President and the OR in forestry program chair but delegate could be
  nominated by the Forestry SIG President
- Proposition of Jean-François Audy and David Martell, modified by Gregory Paradis

The Forestry SIG President, in consultation with David Martell, should form a PRELIMINARY jury panel of three FSIG members. If needed, the latter will make the final choice (decisional). The composition of the jury should aim for complementary expertise/experience/background among the jury members and one of the jury members should be a junior researcher. It is desirable that jury members are rotated after serving a few years.

Phase 1 of the competition: selection of up to 3 finalists among the applications (note: eligibility of the applications has been validated by the Forestry SIG President)

If a member in the PRELIMINARY jury panel is co-author in one (or more) of the applications, this member should be substituted by a FSIG member that has no co-authorship on the applications. The selection of this substitute is discussed among the remaining member(s) of the preliminary jury panel and David Martell. If needed, the latter will make the final choice (decisional). The FSIG President should address any conflicts of interest within the jury before distributing submitted papers to jury members.

Phase 2 of the competition: selection of the winner(s) among the finalists by the jury panel in phase 1.

(initial sentence: The full list of papers submitted should not be sent by the Forestry SIG President to anyone that will be asked to withdraw from the jury panel because one of their students has submitted a paper that he or she has co-authored.)





Q2: Have you participated in FSIG activities (e.g. CORS special sessions in forestry, FSIG meetings, etc.) in the past?





Q6: Do you have any suggestions for improving FSIG work?


- Prepare a special forestry issue for INFOR






