 - **Mission statement** - a single sentence that describes the purpose of your group's existence.
 - **Vision statement** - what the group aims to achieve long term.
 - **Value Statement** - expresses the priorities of your group and describes the standard and principles that drive you

Collaboration: We recognize that improving perinatal and neonatal care requires collaboration and coordination among stakeholders. We are committed to working together with partners across Idaho to advance our shared goals.

Through these values, we aim to create a community of sharing, learning, and improvement that benefits all Idahoans.

AIM Patient Safety Bundles



- **Patient Safety Bundles (PSB)** are a structured way of improving processes of care and patient outcomes. They are clinical, condition-specific, and follow an evidence-based structure.
- A bundle includes actionable steps that can be adapted to a variety of facilities and resource levels.
- **PSB Goal:** improve the way care is provided to improve outcomes.

Severe Hypertension in Pregnancy

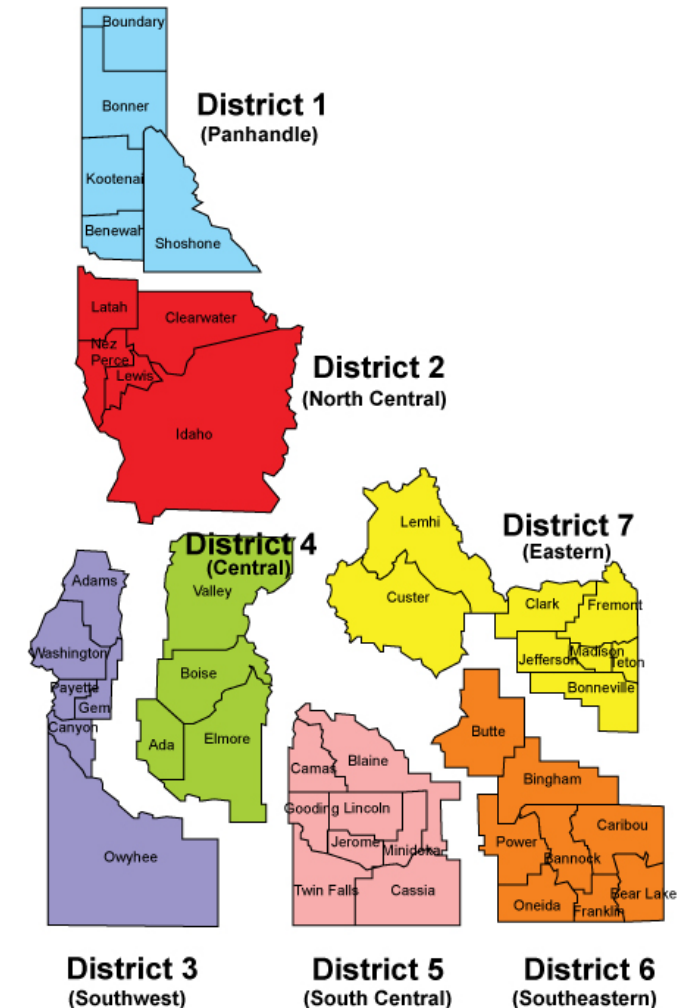
- Improve coordinated processes of care for people with severe hypertension during pregnancy and the post-partum period.

Virtual Regional Stakeholder Engagement Sessions

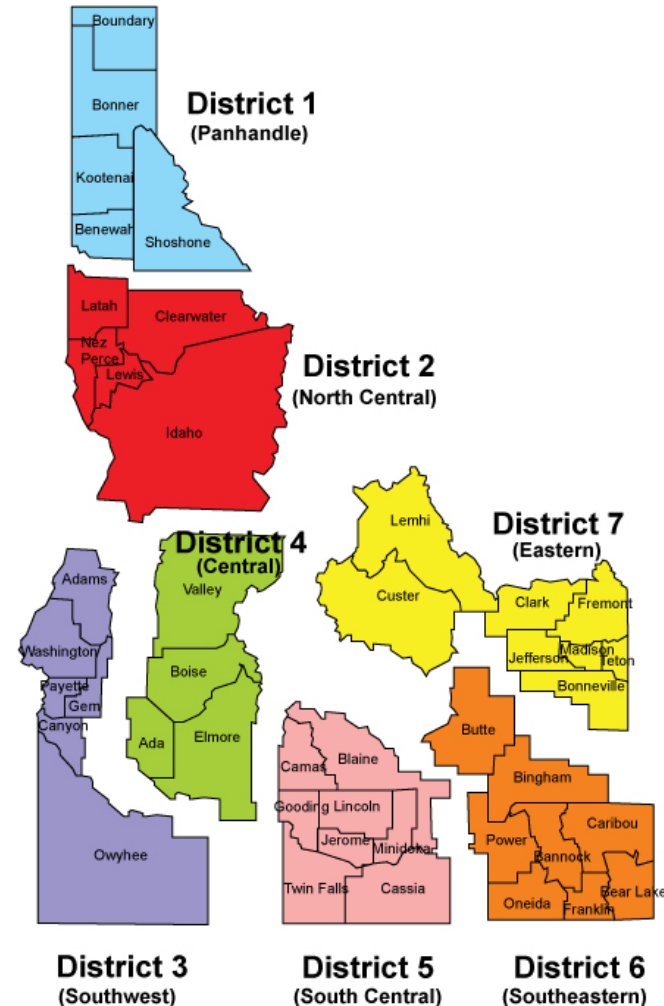
- In July, we will be conducting three regional stakeholder meetings to increase awareness of the PQC and recruit potential members.
