#### 2022 Journey to Excellence – NEW INFO from BSA

*Journey to Excellence* is the Boy Scouts of America program to help Packs, Troops, Crews, Ships and Posts to plan, monitor and evaluate their performance and their ability to serve youth. There are specific criteria for the unit to plan and accomplish. These standards are reviewed each year and revised standards are published.

The 2022 Journey to Excellence Standards are now available.

Here are the major changes in the JTE scorecards for 2022.

- 1. The standards are written as activities that the unit will do. This is to emphasize that JTE is primarily a planning tool.
- 2. The Cub Scout scorecard has many changed standards. This is because of changes in the Cub Scout program.
- 3. For standard #10, Gold now includes recruiting a new leader. We have found that the best units continually recruit parents and other adults who have never been involved in Scouting.

There is no requirement, no expectation and, in fact, we might discourage a unit from believing that they should achieve Gold in all JTE criteria. A great unit is balanced in the service that it provides to youth. There is no shame and no problem if a unit achieves Silver or Bronze. That unit is serving youth. We regard the various colors as meaning:

Bronze – Effective Silver – Excellent Gold – Exceptional



# George Mason District Award of Merit

The District Award of Merit is presented by the District to Scouters who have rendered service of an outstanding nature to youth, both in the community and in Scouting. George Mason is limited to two Awardees.



# District Award of Merit - Alan Harvey

Alan served as Assistant Scoutmaster in Troop 681 from 2004 to 2020 and as Scoutmaster from 2020 to the present. Alan was Troop 681's Eagle Advisor for 8 years.

Alan has been a District Eagle Representative since 2018. In that role, he has worked with many Life Scouts on their Eagle Scout Service projects and has served on Eagle Boards of Review. Alan is an Eagle Scout and has two sons that achieved the rank of Eagle.

Before becoming a Scouts BSA leader, Alan served as treasurer of Pack 681. He also coached McLean youth soccer for 9 years. Alan has been serving for 5 years on the St. James Catholic Church social outreach program which provides 150 food sets per month to needy parishioners.

# District Award of Merit – Scott Willey

Scott planned and led the 2018 Greek and Roman Fall Camporee, developed on-line maps for the District Scouting for Food and has been the Scouting for Food Coordinator for the last two years, collecting more than \$50,000 pounds of food last year. Scott also is the District Coordinator for Scouts with Special Needs.

An active member of the community, Scott has been a confirmation instructor for years at his church and assisted the Wilson High School marching band for the last six years.

#### **Merrimac Farm Wildlife Management Area**

Thinking about a different outdoor experience for your scouts? The Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources (DWR) maintains 46 Wildlife Management Areas (WMAs) totaling more than 225,000 acres that support a variety of outdoor recreational activities.

Approximately 30 miles away from Fairfax, the Merrimac WMA, with its 301 acres of diverse habitat in nearby Prince William County, offers hiking, birding, warmwater fishing and other opportunities. One of its unique features is large concentrations of Virginia Bluebells (Mertensia Virginica) in the floodplain along Cedar Run. There are two public parking areas open year round with informational kiosks.


Merrimac Farm Wildlife Management Area is located adjacent to the northwestern boundary of Quantico Marine Corps Base near Nokesville on Deepwood Lane (State Route 645). Follow Aden Road (SR 646) east from Rt. 28 at Nokesville or west from Rt.234 at Independent Hill to the crossroads at Aden (Jct. Aden Road and Fleetwood Drive (SR 611). Turn south on to Fleetwood Dr. and go approximately 1 mile to Deepwood Lane. The first access point (North Parking Area) is located one-half mile down Deepwood Lane. There take a right turn onto a gravel road and follow it to its end (0.3 miles). The Cedar Run Parking Area can be accessed by continuing on Deepwood Lane for an additional mile to its end.



Please follow these guidelines for submission:

- For large events (50+ expected participants) a minimum of six (6) months' notice to the NCAC Shooting Sports Committee is required to allow time to arrange for scheduling instructor staff and equipment.
- For other events (under 50 expected participants) a **minimum of three (3) months' notice** to the NCAC Shooting Sports Committee is required to allow time to arrange for scheduling instructor staff and equipment.
- All shooting sports events must comply with BSA Guide to Safe Scouting and BSA Shooting Sports Manual guidelines.
- If the event coordinator is requesting any support for qualified supervision, arranging for appropriate equipment, range inspections etc. from the Shooting Sports Committee, that must be CLEARLY INDICATED on the form, otherwise it is assumed that the unit/district event planners will be covering staffing and equipment per statements in the request.

#### Leave No Trace Trainer Course - Outdoor Ethics



#### **Purpose of this Course**

Participants in the Trainer Course learn Leave No Trace skills and ethics as well as techniques for educating others about these low impact practices. Research has shown that this course significantly improves participant knowledge and understanding of how Leave No Trace protects the outdoor places we love. The goal of this course is to teach students taking the course how to introduce the concept of Outdoor Ethics in a fun and engaging way to a group with little experience in outdoor ethics. It should help youth and adults at all program levels understand the general principles behind Scouting's outdoor ethics program. Graduates of a Trainer Course are prepared to lead Outdoor Ethics Orientation and BSA Leave No Trace 101 courses and to offer Leave No Trace Awareness Workshops to their community.

We recommend that youth complete this course before serving as in the troop Outdoor Ethics Guide position.

#### Who should attend?

This course will be of interest to any youth or registered Scouter who is associated with either implementing or training for any BSA outdoor program at any level. It is also well-suited for anyone who would like to pass on the knowledge of how to treat the outdoors and protect its beauty for others to enjoy. Youth must be at least 14 years old. Youth must be willing and able to conduct themselves appropriately for an adult training experience that is tightly scheduled and highly interactive.



What is Powder Horn? Powder Horn is a resource course designed to introduce Scouting's adult leaders to exciting program possibilities using a variety of resources for their unit. It helps leaders to provide a robust outdoor program that meets the health and safety requirements as well as the rules and regulations of the BSA as they apply to outdoor programs. The goal for participants is to leave the Powder Horn course with a list of ideas to help their program, along with contacts and resources needed to implement them. It is important to understand that Powder Horn is not a personal development course or a team building experience. It is not a certification course. Its purpose is to educate the youth and adult Scouting leaders about specific high-adventure skills, to connect them to resources to deliver those skills, and to get them excited about delivering those skills in an exciting, challenging way to youth.

Who can attend Powder Horn? All registered adult leaders are welcome. All participants must be registered members of the Boy Scouts of America. Adults must have completed Leader Specific Training for their registered position. All youth applications will be placed on a wait list until all adult applications are processed. Youth participants (14 and up) will be admitted on an individual basis and requires the completion of the Powder Horn Youth Application Addendum which includes the nomination by the unit leader. Youth must have completed their unit's version of leadership training (Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops or Crews, etc.). National Youth Leadership Training is recommended.

#### What are the pre-requisites?

- Must be a registered adult or youth member of the Boy Scouts of America, within the Scouts BSA or Venturing Program.
- All adult participants must be fully trained for their program, to include a valid Youth Protection Training certificate which
  covers the course dates.
- All participants must complete the Hazardous Weather training, Safety Afloat and Safe Swim Defense, Drive Safely, and Climb on Safely online (through <u>Scouting.org</u>).prior to the course.
- Meet the physical requirements contained in the Annual Health and Medical Record physical in a back-country environment (Forms A, B, and C).
- · Youth must be 14 years of age (or in a Venturing crew if 13 years of age and completed eighth grade).
- Youth must have completed the unit's version of leadership training (Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops, Ships, or Crews, etc.). National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) is recommended for youth participants.

GET BCOLS TRAINED!

This course was developed by a group of Scouters in 1993; it has been continually updated to meet current techniques and technology. It is aimed at all adults working with older youth regardless of program (Boy Scouting, Venturing, or Exploring). This This training IS NOT recommended for Cub Scout leaders or people without camping experience. All participants are strongly encouraged to complete Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills, as well as the position-specific training for their program area (Venturing or, Boy Scout) prior to attending this course. All participants must be able to meet current physical requirements of the BSA Annual Health & Medical Record.

The target audience is adult leaders planning High Adventure treks at backcountry venues not supported by BSA infrastructure; however, units planning to attend High Adventure bases supported by BSA will find this course useful, inasmuch as unit shakedowns will, most likely, take place in venues not supported by BSA infrastructure. If you are participating in an NCAC-sponsored High Adventure Trek, you must also take the course offered by the NCAC High Adventure Committee.

Youth participants (16 and up) will be admitted on an individual basis and requires the nomination by the unit leader. Youth must have completed unit leadership training (Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops or Crews, etc.). National Youth Leadership Training is strongly recommended.

Back Country Outdoor Leader Skills is offered by the Council Training Committee as an optional follow-on to the basic course, Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills. Its goal is to provide adult leaders with an overview of such topics as:

- Trek Planning ◆ Leadership Skills ◆ Team Development ◆ Leave No Trace ◆ Water Treatment ◆
- Stove Maintenance Risk Management Equipment Maintenance Crew Equipment Needs & Selection •
- Personal Equipment Needs & Selection
   Terrain Awareness & Land Navigation
   Menu Planning & Clean-up • Hygiene & Health • On the Trail Tips • Wilderness First Aid Overview

Part 1 — Addresses ways to effectively work with older youth and covers the detailed preparation and planning that must be done before you go out, including risk management. Summarizes the personal and crew equipment used for lightweight camping. Plans are also made for the weekend overnight session. (Part 1 is the EXPLAIN & DEMONSTRATE part of EDGE.)

Part 2 — Participants will practice core leader skills for the outdoor program — Leave No Trace, navigation (map & compass plus GPS), terrain awareness, expedition menu planning and food preparation, stove and stove maintenance, wilderness first aid issues, expedition health and hygiene, team building. (Part 2 is the GUIDE part of EDGE.)

Part 3 — While not required, we strongly suggest participation in the Hikeoree which will allow BCOLS trained leaders to apply the BCOLS training with their youth at a real-world event. (Part 3 is the ENABLE part of EDGE.)

- What and why of Scouting. You will have a deeper understanding of what Scouting is and why we do it.
- Experience. You will learn and experience things that will stay with you in Scouting and the rest of your life.
- **Fun.** You will have fun and you will meet interesting people.
- Other groups. You will make your other groups, like work, church, even family, stronger.

Here's another summary of why to go. This was originally aimed particularly at Scouters in the Cub Scout program, but it applies equally to all of us.

CUB SCOUT LEADERS! How would you like to attend a training that takes you far beyond your Basic Leader Training? Would you like to build your skills in communication, conflict management and teaching methods? How about a leadership course that rivals many corporate level trainings?

Wood Badge is here for you. This is not a Troop leader training but is designed for Cub, Scout, and Venturing leaders. This course will help you better understand how all the Scouting programs tie together. It will provide you with many useful leadership tools to help enable our youth to have the best possible Scouting experience. There is no better time to attend a Wood Badge course and make a difference in your unit than when you are a Cub Scout Leader.

#### **Tickets**

Have you heard of "The Ticket" and wondered what it is? The ticket is a group of five goals you set for yourself to do after course, to improve your unit. You learn more about this on the course.

#### Purpose of Wood Badge

The purpose of Wood Badge is to develop skilled leaders who can strengthen Scouting units in achieving the mission of the Boy Scouts of America.

When we accomplish the mission of Scouting, we do it in the units. Therefore, the short form of the purpose is, the purpose of Wood Badge is to strengthen units.

Although the course is different today, what Baden-Powell said in 1919 still applies:

One of the purposes of Wood Badge training is to get Scouters to think about the practice of Scouting, to meet together, to exchange experiences, and to live together in the spirit of the Scout Oath.
