


I hope many of you are planning to join us for our upcoming spring George Mason District activities.







Scout service hours (up to 3 hours) will be available. Each participating Scout earns a unique patch and rocker.



Journey to Excellence is the Boy Scouts of America program to help Packs, Troops, Crews, Ships and Posts to plan, monitor and evaluate their performance and their ability to serve youth. There are specific criteria for the unit to plan and accomplish. These standards are reviewed each year and revised standards are published.

Here are the major changes in the JTE scorecards for 2022.

- 1. The standards are written as activities that the unit will do. This is to emphasize that JTE is primarily a planning tool.
- 2. The Cub Scout scorecard has many changed standards. This is because of changes in the Cub Scout program.
- 3. For standard #10, Gold now includes recruiting a new leader. We have found that the best units continually recruit parents and other adults who have never been involved in Scouting.

There is no requirement, no expectation and, in fact, we might discourage a unit from believing that they should achieve Gold in all JTE criteria. A great unit is balanced in the service that it provides to youth. There is no shame and no problem if a unit achieves Silver or Bronze. That unit is serving youth. We regard the various colors as meaning:

Bronze – Effective Silver – Excellent Gold – Exceptional



Safe Swim Defense (SSD) and Safety Afloat (SA)



What: BSA Safe Swim Defense (SSD) and Safety Afloat (SA) training is required for any BSA unit conduction swimming or boating activities.

Who: Adult leaders supervising a swimming/boating activity must have completed Safe Swim Defense/Safety Afloat within the previous two years.

Where: SSD and SA training is available online at https://my.scouting.org. The in-person training must be presented by a qualified instructor.

Cost: Free!

Pre-Camp Swim Classification Tests



What: This is an opportunity for your unit to have your annual BSA Swim Classification Check done under supervision of NCAC-approved aquatics personnel.

Who: Any NCAC unit (Pack, Troop, and Crew)
Where: Camp Snyder, Haymarket, VA

When: June 4 – One-hour blocks starting at 9am.
Last session is 4pm. Registration deadline is June 1st.

Cost: \$3 per participant.

Paddle Craft Safety Training

What: This the hands-on training that is recommended in Safety Afloat guidelines for anyone conducting Scout boating activities. Two versions of the course are offered: The Basic course covers flat water introductory boating skills and basic trip planning. The river course includes skills and knowledge development that are required for conducting trips on moving water. The Basic course is a prerequisite for the moving water course. Who: Adult leaders

Who: Youth (12+), Parent or Adult leaders




