Maternal Mortality Rate Up 121.5%


Underlying Causes of Maternal Deaths in Idaho, 2021

- Amniotic Fluid Embolism


In 2021, **56%** of Pregnancy Related Deaths Occurred Between **43** and **365** Days After Birth

- Accidental Deaths (due to suffocation and strangulation in bed)

March of Dimes Report Card Highlights Key Indicators to Describe the Current State of Maternal and Infant Health

Preterm Birth Rate in Idaho, 2022 was 8.9% Lower Than the Preterm Birth Rate in 2021 of 9.0% and Lower Than the U.S. Rate of 10.2%


Preterm Birth Rate Among American Indian/Alaska Native Birthing People is 1.5x Higher Than Among Other Race/Ethnicity

Preterm Birth Rate Black Birthing People is 3.2x Higher Than Among Other Race/Ethnicity



## 2023 Maternity Care Access in Idaho

Where you live matters: Maternity care access in Idaho | PeriStats | March of Dimes

29.5% of Counties are Defined as Maternity Care Deserts Compared to 32.6% in the U.S

19.7% of Women had No Birthing Hospital within 30 Minutes Compared to 9.7% in the U.S.

9.8% of Birthing People Received Inadequate Prenatal Care Less than the U.S. Rate of 14.8%

Session Law Chapter 67

Effective: July 1, 2024

The Statement of Purpose: The Board of Medicine can Collect and Review data and Information Concerning Maternal Mortality in the State of Idaho. The Board of Medicine Shall have the Power Throughout the State to Require Production of Needed Information and will Provide an Annual Summary Report to the Legislature by January 31st of Each Year

Session Law Chapter 186

Effective: March 25, 2024

The Statement of Purpose: This Legislation Adds Provisions Regarding Postpartum Medicaid Coverage for Women, by Extending Medicaid Eligibility for Twelve (12) Months for Postpartum Coverage to Individuals Who, While Pregnant are Eligible for and Receive Medicaid.







Reported Signed by Governor on March 25, 2024

Session Law Chapter 177

Effective: July 1, 2024

The Statement of Purpose: This Legislation Prohibits any Individual or Organization, that is a Provider of Abortion, from Furnishing any Materials or Instruction relating to Sex education Curricula
