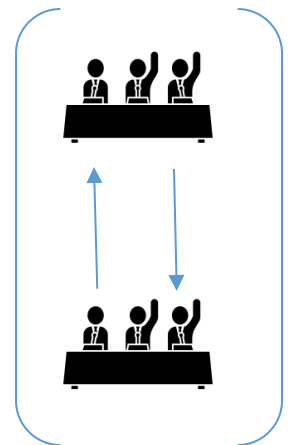
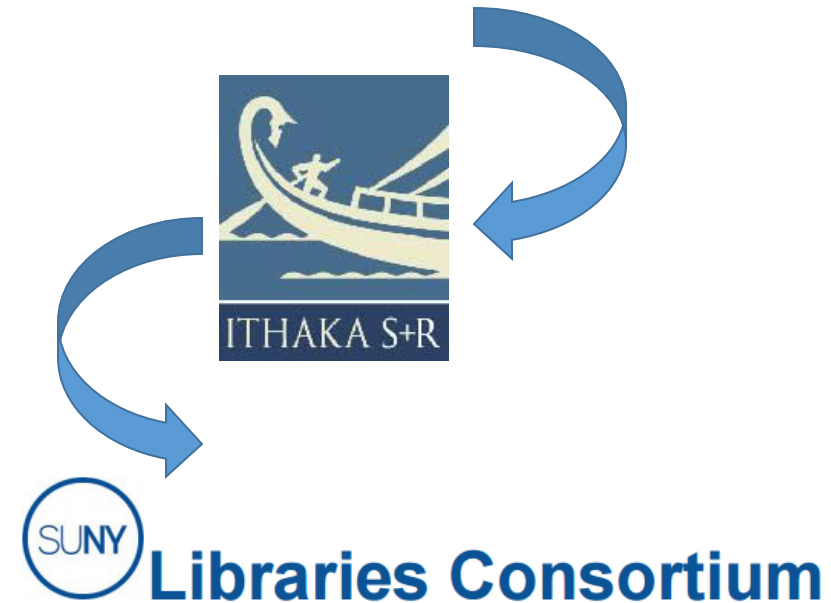

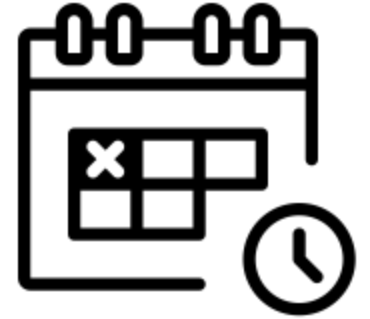


LSP project will result in SUNY Libraries becoming SUNY Libraries Consortium

- Transition from SCLD to SLC for effective decision making.
- SCLD was a body where all decisions were voted on as a whole.
- SLC is an organization where committees are making policies.
- LSP Task Force has final authority for migration activities.



What's Due Now or Due Soon?



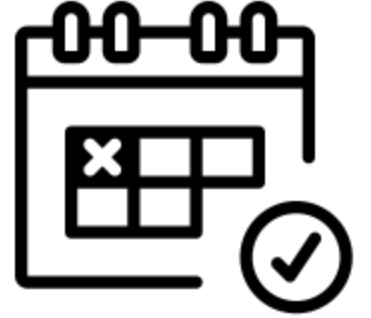
- Alma Implementation Form due today

 - Focus will be on workflows in Alma, not training

Policies: Network Zone Loans



- ASRS Network Zone Loan Policy
 - Main Collections for Faculty, Staff, and Graduates:
 - 16 Weeks, 3 Renewals
 - Main Collections for Undergraduates:
 - 16 weeks, No Renewals
 - Short Loans for Restricted Collections:
 - 30 days
 - Intended for media, specialized subcollections
 - Resource Sharing preferred over recall
 - No recalls unless item needed for reserves

Data Migration and Preparation Update

- For the most part, whatever is in Aleph, will migrate.
 - No ability to filter by date, status, etc.
- If you don't want it to migrate, it should be deleted.
- Issues will be flagged as "Technical Migration."
- 1 Vanguard Load, and 2 SUNY Data Loads
- Final Cutover: 1 month tech services freeze in June 2019
 - Fulfillment will continue with a data gap load.

Additional use and report strategy for Aleph coming soon

- ITEC shared server Aleph libraries additional use functionality and timeline will be coming soon.
- Will be developing policy on what reports will be available to gather data from Aleph through services.
 - Won't be creating complex "data dumps" from Aleph.
 - Will be using services that campuses can run for themselves.
 - Campuses responsible for running reports/services.
 - Process will be to have Working Groups or other body to review service/report requests and forward for feasibility review.

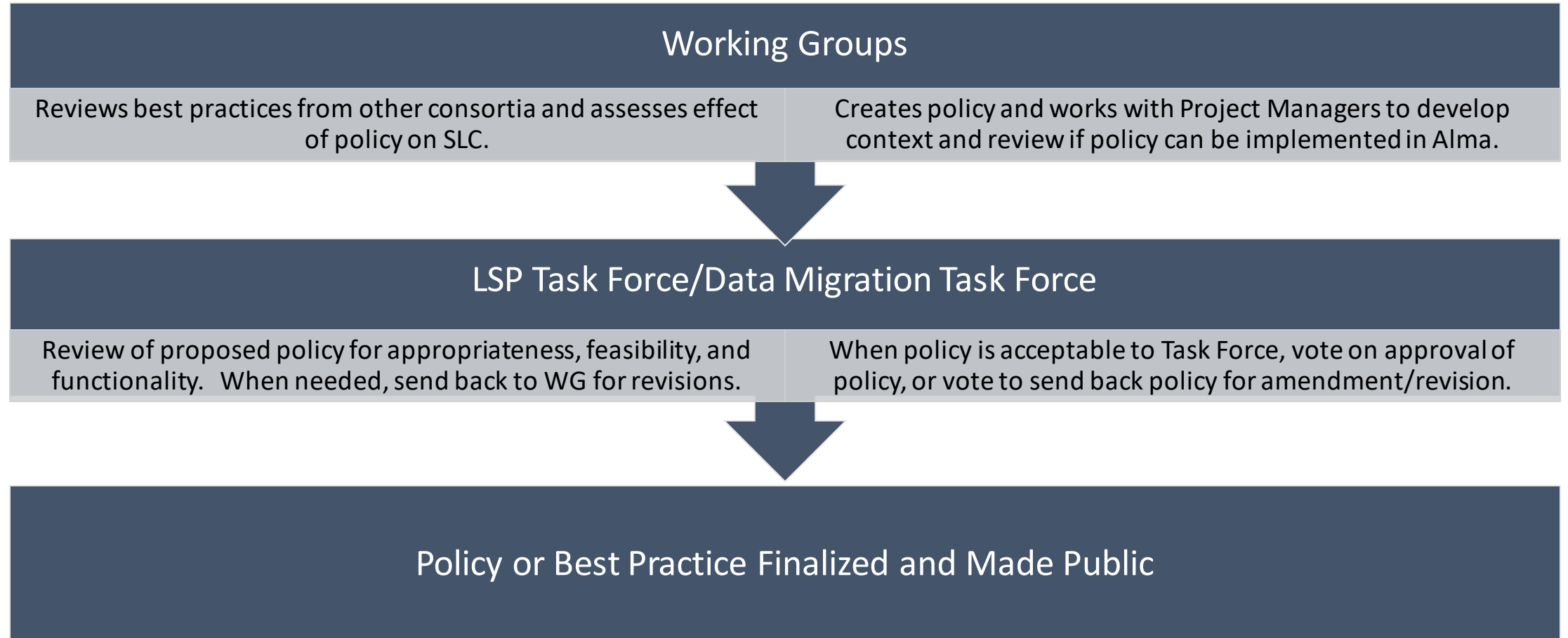
Additional Use and Proquest/ExLibris Products

 - Summon

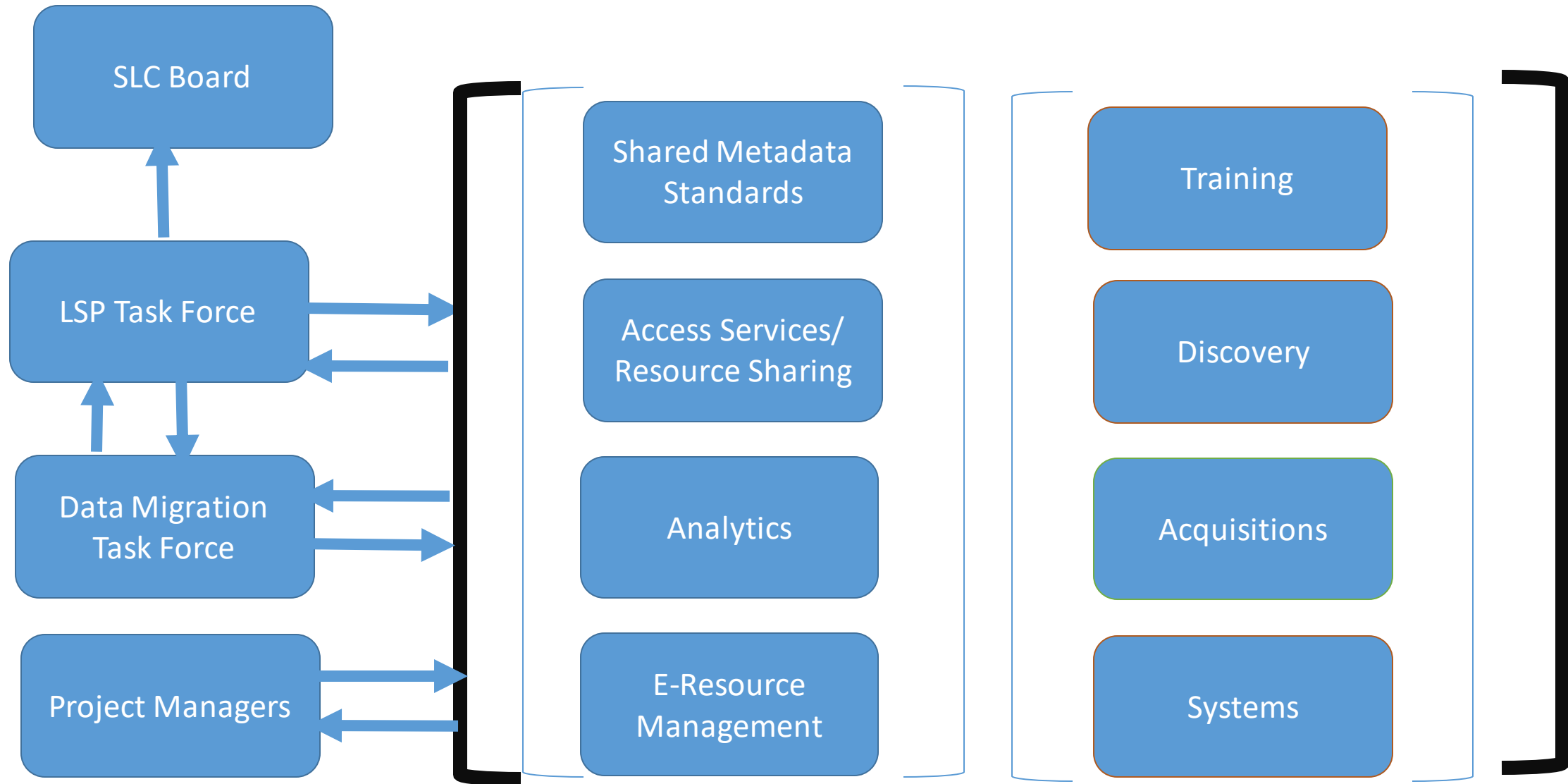

How Policies and Best Practices are Created

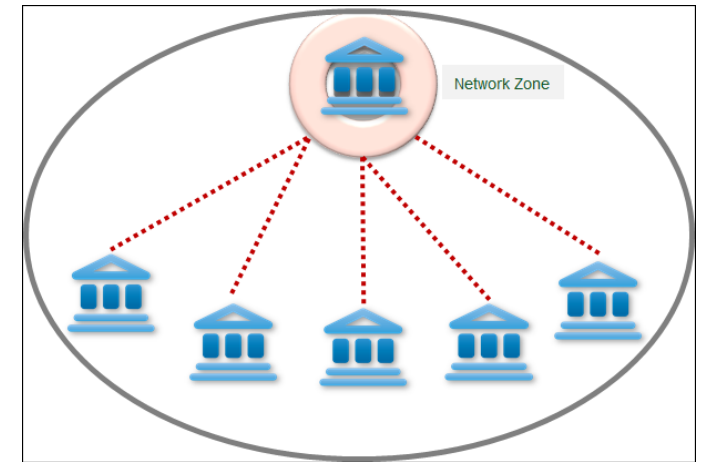


LSP Task Force and Working Groups



Many Policies will be needed for SUNY's Network Zone.

- Network Zone can centralize management of many components:
 - Configuration
 - E-resources
 - Vendors
 - Licenses
 - Bibliographic records
 - Discovery logic rules
- Data sharing can also be highly developed
 - Financial Information
 - Usage information
 - Collection development



So, What's a Best Practice?

- Recommendation, often for data cleanup.
- Based on Working Group and Task Force expertise, or the recommendation from Ex Libris.
- Formed as it will make the migration or functioning in Alma smoother.
- If work is needed to bring data in line with best practice, Project Management Team will operationalize as much as possible.
- If campuses wish to opt out of best practices, the campus assumes responsibility for data clean up or other work needed to resolve issues in Alma.

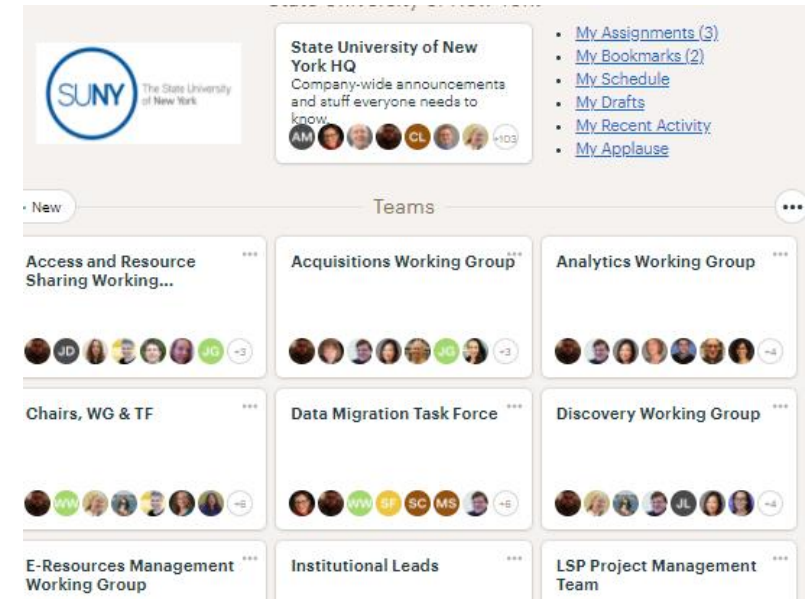

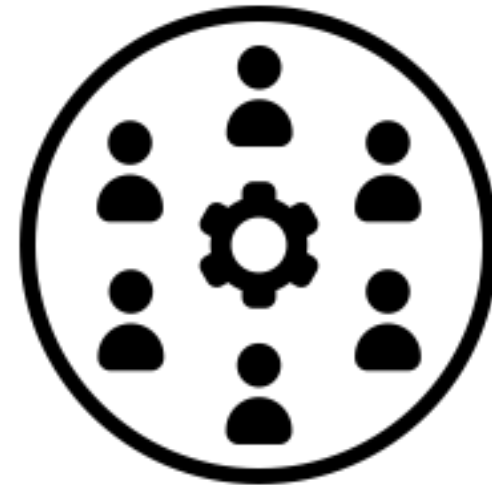
Communication is key, but it's hard.

High Level Overview of Working Group Activities

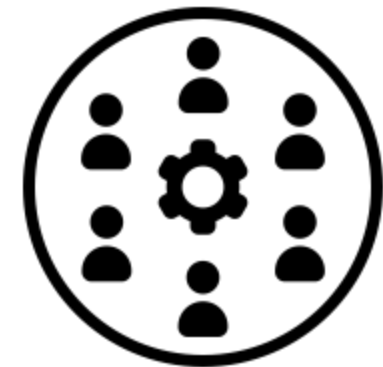
- Developing expertise in Alma.
- Researching consortial best practices.
- Researching consortial best practices with a shared LSP.
- Gathering input from SLC community about current practices.
- Gathering data about functional areas.
- Focus is on best practices and evidence based decision making that is needed in a shared environment.



Working Group Updates: Discovery

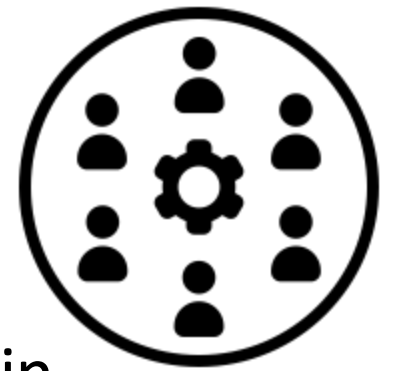


- Discovery:
 - Reviewing research on Primo and best practices of other consortia using Primo.
 - Preparing framework for review and upcoming recommendations for Discovery policies and best practices.



Working Group Updates: ERM

- Survey responses have been received from all campuses. Questions are being divided and assigned to WG members for analysis and formatting for SUNYLA presentation.
- Reviewing best practices for managing e-resources in the network zone.
- Compiling list of e-resources titles (e.g. different types of e-resources such as ebooks, A&I, streaming media, etc.) to test in the Vanguard phase.



Working Group Updates: ASRS

- Had webinars with BibSys and CalState which has been helpful in answering questions regarding policies and workflows and gave us much food for thought going forward.
- A fines and fees policy as well as proposal for purging patron data will be finalized and sent to the Taskforce soon.
- Have begun coordinating with institutional finance offices to determine feasibility, if any, for financial transactions between institutions.
- Basic recommendations for campuses to change fines/fees as necessary



Working Group Update: SMSP

- Sent 17 policy recommendations to LSP Task Force for review and consideration.
- Significant work on local field mapping in preparation for testing local extensions for Vanguard phase.
