- <u>Watkins</u>, <u>Clearwater</u> and <u>Mount Rainier Nature Centers</u> as well as campsites, canoe and kayak rentals at <u>Bladensburg Waterfront Park</u> and <u>Patuxent River Park</u>.
- <u>College Park Aviation Museum</u>, <u>Brentwood Arts Exchange</u> and <u>Montpelier Arts Center</u> are also reopening.
- Several indoor pools and the Herbert Wells Ice Rink.
- Playgrounds, parks, and trails are open. (All portable toilets and comfort stations at Cosca Park, Watkins Park, and Lake Artemesia are open.)
- <u>Golf courses</u> and the <u>Prince George's Trap & Skeet Center</u> are open, reservations preferred.
- <u>Outdoor tennis courts</u> and <u>tennis bubbles</u> are open, <u>by reservation only.</u>
