## A new source of funding

Glide Revitalization and UCAN have partnered up to distribute new funding from Oregon Housing and Community Services (OHCS). This state funding is held through UCAN's wildfire recovery program. Glide Revitalization's role is to identify outstanding wildfire recovery needs of individuals, assist in the application process for funding, and to secure payment for these services from UCAN.

This grant covers a variety of services ranging from household essentials to full on home rebuilding. This month was our first completed application, which resulted in a \$58,000 pay out to a fire impacted family.

Although this application process is lengthier than what we have done in the past, the benefit to individuals is much greater. We are looking forward to introducing this program to additional fire impacted families and getting a sense of stability back to those who have lost that.

## FUNDS PROVIDED THIS MONTH

# \$114,387

Glide Revitalization is in a unique position. We operate as a non-profit that can obtain grant funding for a wide variety of programs and community based assistance. We also house Douglas County's Long-Term Recovery Group (LTRG). This is a committee of individuals that are governed by a Board of Directors and are fiscally sponsored by a 501(c)(3) organization. All funding that is allocated to this local group of individuals is provided specifically to wildfire impacted community members.

We also partner with many other non-profit organizations to maximize efforts. Often, cases are presented to many community business partners to ensure the client receives the most amount of assistance available to them.
