Residential Broadband Survey Results

A total of 589 responses were collected in the residential survey. Not all responders answered every question. Some of the key data points that resulted in the survey include:

- 88% of the respondents desired better Internet/data service.
- 58% of the respondents desired better cellular telephone service.
- 83% of the respondents were not satisfied with all of their services.
- 90% of respondents reported that the Internet is very important to their household.
- 25% of respondents used DSL lines and 17% of the respondents used a cable modem for Internet access.
- 50% of respondents have the type of Internet they have because there are no other options available.
- 75% of respondents reported they have trouble viewing online videos/lectures/movies/TV shows.
- 72% of respondents reported they have trouble using the Internet when others are using it.
- 31% of respondents paid \$61-\$80 per month for their Internet service, and 32% paid \$41 to \$60 per month.
- 38% reported their Internet speed to be less than 10 Mbps download. 25% indicated they do not know their Internet speed.
- 36% of the respondents indicated that at least one individual in their household uses / needs the Internet to complete school assignments or job training several times a week.
- 12% of the respondents need nights and weekends access for the company business.
- 17% are self-employed and trying to work from home part time or full time.
- 19% work for another company and are trying to work from home part or full time.
- 36% of respondents are trying to use their home Internet connection for work at least part time not including weekends or week nights.

CURRENT SATISFACTION OF EXISTING SERVICES

Overall, the respondents felt a need for better cellular telephone service, Internet/data service, and Cable/TV service. 88% of the respondents desired better Internet/data service and 58% of the respondents desired better cellular telephone service. In addition, more than half of the respondents felt the need for better Cable/TV service. 24% of the respondents indicated they could not rely on their Internet service and 36% indicated the price they pay for the service they receive is unreasonable. 83% of the respondents are not satisfied with all of their services. This data indicates that residents generally are in need of better services that can offer reliability, speed, and a better price point.

HOUSEHOLD COMPOSITION

From the sample, 9% of the respondents live in a household of three individuals and 52% live in a household of two individuals. 31% of respondents have at most three K-12 students in their household. 57% have zero k-12 children in their household and 9% left the question blank.15% have one college student in their household. 72% have zero college students in their household and 8% let the question blank. 51% of the respondents live in a household with two Internet users and 9% of the respondents live in a household with 3 Internet users.

EXISTING INTERNET CONNECTION TYPE, SPEED, AND PRICE

Of the respondents who have an Internet connection, 25% used DSL Lines for Internet access and 17% used Cable Modems. 0% (2) of the respondents were still on a dial-up connection. 29% reported their Internet speed to be between 25 Mbps and 10 Mbps. 38% of respondents reported their Internet speed to be less than 10 Mbps. In terms of cost, 31% of the respondents paid between \$61 to \$80 per month for Internet access and 32% paid \$41 to \$61 per month.

USE OF THE INTERNET

The respondents of the survey used the Internet for a variety of reasons. Some of the main uses of the Internet include checking and sending email, accessing news and current events, social networking, shopping, and banking online. 28% of respondents connected 5-6 devices to their home Internet service and 23% of respondents connected 7-8 devices to their home Internet service.

An open response question was asked following this question about any other additional uses of the Internet. Many respondents use the Internet for business purposes as well. 36% of the respondents indicated that at least one individual in their household use the Internet to complete school assignments or job training at least several times a week.

When asked if the respondents work from home, 12% of the respondents need nights and weekends access for company business. 36% of the respondents work either part time or full time from home remotely as self-employed or for another company.

SATISFACTION WITH SPECIFIC SERVICES

17% are satisfied and 4% are very satisfied with the speed and reliability of their Internet service. 75% of the respondents answered that they have trouble viewing videos, lectures, movies, and/or TV shows and 72% of the respondents answered that they have trouble

using the Internet when others are using it. Lastly, 38% of the respondents were not at all satisfied with their Internet speed and reliability.

CURRENT COSTS AND PROVIDERS

25% of the respondents pay between \$100 to \$150 for local and long distance telephone, TV, and Internet per month. For Internet providers, 22% of residents use Arvig and 7% use CenturyLink. 53% of the residents have only cellphone service as their at home telephone service and 45% have both cellphone and landline telephone service as their at-home telephone service. As for TV services, 26% of residents use Direct TV and 31% use Dish Network as their satellite TV providers. 28% choose not to have any cable / satellite TV service. The residents of Meeker County seem to lack satisfactory options in terms of price and providers.

WILLINGNESS TO PAY


When asked if what the respondents would be willing to pay for a faster, higher quality Internet access, 27% said that they would pay between \$61 to \$80 per month and 29% said they would pay \$41 to \$60 per month for faster, quality Internet access.

SERVICE DESIRED

Respondents were asked if there were any additional telecommunication needs that were not covered in the survey. 58% of the respondents stated that they would like better cellphone service. In addition, almost all respondents (88%) desired a more reliable Internet connection that is not limited due to geographic location and offered at a fair price.


DISTRIBUTION OF SURVEY RESPONSES














14. High speed, affordable Internet influences where I choose to live?



There was a very large response to this question, and many residents provided detailed answers. Please see Appendix C for this data.

Business Market Study

A total of 36 responses were were collected. 2 responses were removed because they were duplicates. Not all responders answered every question. Some of the key data points that emerged from the survey include:

- 26% of respondents are not satisfied with all their services.
- 85% of respondents answered that they needed better Internet/data service.
- 97% of respondents stated that the Internet is essential to their business.
- 32% of respondents use DSL Internet service while 24% use satellite or cable modem.
- 57% of respondents have the type of Internet they have because there are no other options available.
- 45% of respondents generally paid between \$51 to \$100 per month for Internet access. 12% paid between \$101 to \$150 for Internet.
- 29% of respondents have 5-10 Mbps download speeds and 15% have 1-5 Mbps.
- Only 3% of respondents answered they were very satisfied with the current speed and reliability of their Internet service. 26% of respondents replied that they were not at all satisfied with the current speed of their Internet service.
- 16% of respondents indicated that they cannot rely on their Internet service provider. 16% of respondents indicated that their Internet service provider has slow or poor technical support.
- 91% of respondents indicated that they found Internet technology to be a very important factor in the success of their company over the next five years.
- 26% of respondents need to work from home on a consistent basis.
- 26% of respondents indicated limited Internet access at employee's residence impacts their business.
- 88% of respondents would not relocate their business due to existing Internet options.

CURRENT SATISFACTION OF EXISTING SERVICES

Overall, respondents felt a need for better telephone service, Internet/data service, and cellular service. 57% of the respondents desired better cellular telephone service and 85% of the respondents desired better Internet/data service. 16% of the respondents indicated they could not rely on their Internet service provider and 16% indicated their Internet service provider had slow or poor technical service. 26% of the respondents

were not satisfied with all of their services. This data indicates that businesses generally are in need of better services that can offer reliability, speed, and a better price point.

ESTABLISHMENT INFORMATION & EMPLOYEE COMPUTER USAGE

All 34 businesses that responded to the survey indicated that an Internet connection existed at the establishment and that there were an average of 12 Internet users per business.

EXISTING INTERNET CONNECTION TYPE, PRICE, AND SPEED

DSL provided Internet access to 32% of the respondents. Satellite Internet provided Internet access to 15% of the respondents. All of the respondents paid \$51 or more for Internet access with 9% paying \$500-\$1,000 each month. The largest proportion of respondents (45%) paid \$51 to \$100 for Internet access each month. 15% of the respondents had Internet speeds between 1-5 Mbps, while 29% of the respondents had Internet speeds between 5-10 Mbps. 29% did not know the speed of their Internet. In addition, 65% of the respondents were somewhat satisfied with the current speed of their Internet service, while only 3% were very satisfied with their current Internet speed.

USE OF THE INTERNET

Respondents were asked how they currently used the Internet to serve their needs at their respective establishments. The most common uses of the Internet were email (100%), online backup (65%), transfer of large files(62%) and ordering and managing inventory (74%). 76% of the respondents used the Internet to maintain a Web presence with a blog or other site.

AFFORDABLE PRICE FOR 1 GIGABIT INTERNET SERVICE SPEED

Survey respondents were asked to provide what they thought was a affordable price for 1 Gigabit Internet service speed. This was an open question. Respondents indicated that 1 Gigabit Internet service speed is worth as much as \$200 per month.

IMPORTANCE OF INTERNET TECHNOLOGY

91% of respondents found Internet technology to be a very important factor in the success of their company in the next five years. Furthermore, 97% of the respondents indicated that the Internet is essential to their business.

EXISTING SERVICE PROVIDERS

Phone: 59% of respondents had both landline and cellphone service. 18% had only landline service and 24% had only cellphone service.

Internet: Arvig provided Internet access to 24% of the respondents and NuTel provided for 15%. 32% left the question blank. Other providers included Windstream (9%), Verizon, (6%), CenturyLink (6%), Broadband Solutions (6%), and Exede/HughesNet (6%). Other providers totaled 18% of responses.

Television: The largest cable/satellite TV providers are Dish Network which provides service to 29% of those with television service. 41% chose not to have TV service (None), and 15% left the question blank.

JOB CREATION AND TELEWORK


The survey found that a portion of respondents generally work from home full time or part time. 35% of the respondents use a VPN and 26% work from home on a very consistent basis. 26% of respondents said that an employee's residential Internet service does impact their business, but 88% would not relocate their businesses.

SERVICE DESIRED

Respondents were given the opportunity to provide additional comments not covered in the survey. This were a open ended question. Respondents expressed the need for more reliable Internet and cell service.


DISTRIBUTION OF SURVEY RESPONSES



8. What type of Internet do you have?









I hear so many complaints from people on cell phone service & internet service

For business purposes in the city of Litchfield, our options are essentially NuTelecom and MediaComm. NuTel has recently rolled out their fiber options, which we have subscribed to for 100/100 dedicated service. This is somewhat fairly priced at \$550/month. However, we get 500/500 fiber in St Louis Park, MN for \$500 per month. MediaComm is a VERY overpriced, limited service option which we are required to use as our redundant service. We pay almost as much for a 105/5 MediaComm cable connection as we do for our 100/100 fiber from NuTelecom.

We need competition and more fiber connections. Our business and our neighboring business paid a lot of money to bring fiber to our locations out of desperate need. We have been told by Arvig that there are absolutely no plans to bring more fiber to this area because it's not in Arvig's best interest. Bring in another vendor and I would bet Arvig's best interests would change. Competition is good for everyone!

Need a VOIP option on question 18

I pay for 10 gig, but only receive 2-3 because of location. Before paying for premium, I only received 1/2 to 1 gig, which was not sufficient to run our business. Frustrated that I have to pay for it, but don't receive it.

I think it's sad we can't get high speed internet via underground and people of the Watkins address can. We live very close to state highway and there hasn't been anything done to improve in the forest city area. I also believe that Kingston has better options now.

We use the Internet for our TV viewing. We Subscribe to DirecTV Now and Amazon.

I would love other options for high-speed Internet service if affordable and reliable.

We would love higher speeds, no data limits and consistent service for a reasonable price.

"I am very excited this is being considered. Our options are at best limited. Nu-tel and Centurylink have both blown us off, and do not invest anytime to investigate whether there services would work here (no site survey). Broadband - MN has been helpful, but there model restricts data limits during a monthly period, is not cheap, and VPN services are hampered. Dish Network plays billing games, and I would do just about anything to give a local business some loyalty.

We would be very interested in a reliable high speed internet connection and know many others in our area that would be interested as well.

Xtratyme is a great cheap unlimited internet service option for people that live in the country in the area.

Xtratyme keeps saying they will upgrade their equipment but it is taking much longer than expected.

"Question #15 needs to be more specific. "What would you be willing to pay for a faster, higher quality Internet connection?" I checked "more than \$80/month" but what am I hypothetically going to get for that? You should have included an actual number for a download speed and also whether or not you are talking about limited data or unlimited data.

Also, you should know there are currently about 10 different internet options available depending on where you live in Meeker.

The choice of unlimited data plans is severely limited in our area.

"Broad Band solutions is reliable but very expensive, we pay 49.99 per month but it is limited usage. We have Verizon cell phones with a plan that is more expensive so we can have unlimited data to use hotspots around the house to make sure we do not go over our monthly allotment with Broad Band solutions because of the overage charges. Our unlimited data plan with Verizon is unlimited but after so much usage then they slow down the service: (If we had an affordable, reliable and fast enough service in the country we could save a lot of money and have more to spend locally.

Access to a high speed connection without data limits and time restrictions would be a great help to us. We need cable to each home. Wireless systems are too affected by weather, are to slow, and are often blocked by trees and crops. I have services available from 4 companies in my area, but only one actually works due to hills and vegetation issues.

Someone just pulled fiber along County Road 18. Hopefully more choices will be available in 2018. Thank you for commissioning this survey!

I continue with my current ISP as they have no data limits. I would prefer a wired service rather than a wireless for reliability. Also the price\speed I feel is expensive.

We pay for internet speeds that are never achieved! And have MANY days where internet is down. And are given excuses as to the problems are on our end (our modem etc) and they never are because neighbors experience the same problems. Disappointed in Arvig.

sometimes I work from home but very rarely

I work for a hospital out of my home and need high speed internet 24/7. There are times when I can't get service and no one seems to know when it will be back up which is NOT acceptable when working at a hospital.

My internet service works very well but is unreliable. There are several times when internet goes out and customer service is poor. (Mediacom)

I'm glad we have great internet options available in Meeker County! Cable, DSL, and lots of great wireless options. We can even pay to have fiber brought in if we need it. Maybe that's true of most counties, but Meeker County is well served with internet options.

In our household, both adults work full time from home. This requires very intensive internet usage at times, and reliability is paramount. When moving here we were limited on where we could live, and living much outside of city limits simply wasn't an option. Our current download is 15Mb/s and upload of 1 Mb/s, at times this is simply not good enough for our needs working from home. We simply need faster internet service to be able to maintain our jobs as they are now. To maintain competitive in the workforce, the expectation of fast internet is only growing. All the while our service isn't getting any better, and as best as we can tell, there are no immediate plans to bring fiber to large portions of the area.

If this happens I hope it will be a fiber network with no data caps. This is part of our infrastructure, like much of it, that needs to be updated to current times. Not living in a metropolitan area is not an excuse for not having good options anymore.

We think the service we receive is good but expensive.

We recently got rid of Dish TV because of the price. We now use and Amazon Firestick and the PlayStation Vue channel app. Sometimes we have reset our modem in order for the tv services to work.

Our current internet provider is pretty reliable and speed is currently good (25 Mbs). I am concerned with all the devices that we as a society are connecting that we will need affordable, high speed connections without having to worry about data caps.

Internet is good at times, but mostly very slow. I feel I am paying way too much to have such slow service.

We have no other providers available in our area. It would be nice to have other choices.

This option all depends on my service with Arvig's internet (8000 feet away from nearest node) being fast enough to complete my job in a timely manner. Just found out this week after checking with several other providers Arvig is the only option I have. Would love to be able to have another option to choose from in my area.

It would be great to have broadband or faster internet service in Forest City and Manannah. I hope cell phone service improves throughout the county, especially in the Forest CIty and Manannah area. I do some of my work there.

Arvig is a horrible provider of landline services and do not offer internet where I live.

Schools are requiring more and more online related assignments such as watching videos. Options out in the rural areas are not only unreliable they are data capped. This makes online school homework very difficult for students. Not to mention online college. On another note skilled workers in fields which require the ability to work from home will be more prone to leave the area for locations with better internet.

There is some wireless signals out in the area per ISPs but the problem is location of the towers. They are in the middle of fields and trees are blocking the line of sight. The other towers are located on private land in which the owner is not willing to be cooperative in assisting other neighbors by having a paid contractor come out and relocate the isp's equipment for better line of sight in the area. If there were repeaters along the road in the ditch, more residents would have access to high speed internet which is no longer a luxury but a necessity for homes. We would love to be able to have more reliable internet options. We're only able to use my phone as our hotspot Internet and that is limited every month (and the connection isn't always great depending on time of day).

I love where I live but hate the fact that at this time I do not have a viable option for unlimited internet service with no use limits or significant reduced speeds. Unless I want to pay an astronomical amount and have a 20' pole with a dish attached to my roof and a \$500 installation fee. Rural areas half the size of Litchfield have quality fiber optic internet suppliers. There is absolutely no reason we should not!

We would like to have internet for things like home security, netflix, wifi network, etc. No interest in Satellite internet and cellular is unreliable.

"Please help Meeker county develop a plan to help bring fiber networks to all households in Meeker County. Thank you!"

I currently am using MVTV and am content with the service, the speed is slow (5mg) but the amount is unlimited for \$70 per month. I was with excede prior to, for \$160 a month we would run out of data 25Cap in 2 weeks and then slowed down to dialup. I would love to see fiber come in I'd pay extra initially the first few years to get it paid for as long as we knew it was going to go down. And it needs to be reasonable in town they pay 20-40 per month for good speed and know data cap I would say country prices should be somewhat in line with that. Rural Internet Services are terrible

The one thing we are extremely dissatisfied with in our home and where we live is the access to good technology, specifically internet. We have friends and family who have commented that if they had the lack of internet services we do, they would definitely be looking to move elsewhere. We have extremely limited internet abilities and pay the same or more as our friends and family who have basically unlimited data and extremely fast speeds. We are unable to stream any types of media or even successfully complete a facetime call. We have to use 4 separate providers for internet, television, phone and cell phone just to have all of these services and that creates a very expensive bill each month. We would greatly appreciate a better option for internet service. This will become an increasing need for us as our jobs are requiring more and more access from home and as our children become grade school age in the next couple of years.

We only have 2 options for internet at my location that I know of, service via a cellular hotspot and satellite. We are currently using the cellular service at around \$50/month because the satellite service charges a \$300-500 fee to conduct a site inspection and then ~\$70/month for internet service. I currently can't justify that cost. We use this Meeker county address as a year round retreat, and we use the internet here regularly for work and pleasure. Our current provider (Xtratyme) is very good, and has excellent customer service, but since we began using their services, their prices have increased as their speeds decreased. They used to have 5 packages to chose from, but now have 16, ranging from about \$14 (which is really just enough to be a place holder in their billing cycle) to over \$114 per month. One advantage to their program is that we are able to increase and decrease speed every 24 hours so we can reset it to slower and cheaper speeds when we leave after a weekend, and that price is reasonable. But to increase the speed to a useable speed for surfing, streaming or to do my work, it is very costly, and if I forget to bump the speed back down on Sunday night, I am faced with a real hit when the bill comes in. It's not affordable, but we have not been able to find another rural option along Lake Jennie. We also rely on our internet for our landline service (Ooma), while we are here (for emergencies, etc), so if we neglect to increase the speed because we aren't working online or watching a movie, etc., we are not able to use the landline as there is not enough speed to use it. So the internet is always a problem for us--either functional or financial. I hope your organization can come up with some solutions!

To have the speed in order to work the job I am in I need downloads speeds at least in the upper 25-35 range. I use a Verizon hot spot in order to get those speeds plus a Web Booster plus an Extender to get those speeds. The cost is 110.00/month - way too high but it works. The plan I am on is capped at 28 GB. If I go over it is 15.00/GB. They have an unlimited plan for 100.00/month. But that plan caps the hot spot high speed use at 15 GB for the month and then you run on 3G network for the rest of the month. I have spent hours and hours researching in the last 10+ years, since we moved here, every possible internet service and there is absolutely no other choice that can give me what I need. So I am forced to use Verizon. We originally used Xtratyme. Customer service, prices and flexibility but not dependable because of our trees. Then they grew too big and the tower was too far away to get any reception.

We desperately need real high speed internet. Cell data works ok but is data limited. It is completely impractical for streaming or any other data intensive task.

Better internet and tv options would be wonderful!!

Please get me out of the dark ages.

"For number 1, I do not have reliable cell service in all the rooms in my home. Streaming video is sometimes interrupted for buffering. Satellite TV is usually interrupted when there are thunderstorms in the area. For number 7, There is no coax or optic fiber cable to the house. I could get a landline, but am not close enough to the switch to get DSL. I cannot get satellite internet because I do not have a clear southern exposure. For number 9, I can obtain faster download speeds from my current internet provider. That would probably relieve the buffering problems, but I'm not inclined to incur the additional cost for faster service.

For number 12, Although I am generally satisfied with the internet provider, the service is not as reliable as my previous providers at my previous residences, and I would welcome improvement."

Access to reliable, affordable, high-speed internet shouldn't be limited by where a resident lives. Currently, internet access is available in our rural area only via limited, more expensive options besides the cellular service we currently use. Cellular service provides access only to streaming options. It does not allow easy access to reliable

internet connections for on-line shopping, banking, or news. This also limits our ability to work from home and thus, move to the area on a permanent basis.

We live on the edge of the county between ATT and Verizon. Cell service is very weak. Century Link provides a very slow service to our house if we want it. All satellite service is weak when there is snow or rain in the sky. phone company wants almost 4000.00 dollars to hook up a phone line.... there should be a law

Please bring our area high speed fiber optic internet

Our Internet provider was chosen mainly because there are no data caps. We use the Internet for tv streaming. Our previous provider (Wild Blue) had very restrictive caps which did not allow for streaming except at a very high cost. There is no cable TV service in rural areas and satellite TV, which we had for years, became increasingly expensive. We need a reliable internet provider.

Can only get Hughesnet or other satellite service at our home, too expensive and doesn't work that well. Also data limits are ridiculously low.

With so many people in our home, we need to have a system that can handle that kind of traffic and still be able to watch a movie. So glad that someone is finally researching this!

Overall lack of providers in the area for competition. In larger cities, friends are able to get higher speeds and more services for same or less money. At times internet is down or slow.

We would love at least fiber optic internet

I pay through the nose for internet and I have really poor speeds. I am not thrilled with the services I have available. I really wish someone would intervene and fix this situation.

We pay for a faster speed than what we really get. It is extremely frustrating to not have options other than Arvig. We continue to experience slow internet, and disconnect frequently from the Internet (get dropped). We many times use our cell phone Internet because it works better than our home internet/ARvig service while at home. My husband has Sprint as a cell work cell phone and have limited coverage at home also. I have Verizon which seems to work best.

I'm paying \$90 a month for 14MB down and less than 1MB up. It is horrible. was 6 down and 512 up before we got better service from windstream. i wish I had cable internet from mediacom or some other carrier. Wireless won't work from where I'm at in relation to the tower by paynesville.

I have tried calling other carriers, but no one is available where we live. "

I'm a Media Buyer and work for a digital performance agency and specialize in ecommerce marketing. High speed access is crucial to my job. The only work I do is either connected to the internet or analysis of downloaded data in Microsoft Excel or Power BI. I upload/download large files from and to my work's server, Google, etc. and it takes

quite a long time, because my internet connection is extremely slow. I pay for "up to 17 Mbps" however I only receive an extremely small fraction of what I pay for. In my opinion, it seems like internet providers 'hide' behind the marketing speak ... "up to". In my experience, rarely, if ever, are they able to make good on their marketing claims. My wife is also unable to complete Occupational Therapy reports from home while trying to access her work server. With in the past several years, the FCC increased its designation of high speed internet to 25 Mbps. I find it difficult that internet providers are able to market their services under a high speed umbrella, when subscribers don't actually receive high speed internet according to the FCC's updated definition of high speed internet.

Eden Valley has no choice but Arvig for internet. They don't update the city of Eden Valley and we pay metro price for slow internet. Arvig is horrible.

I would prefer to purchase internet access without having to bundle to get an acceptable price

Our current internet service is the bare minimum at 5 Mbps and it is up and down sometimes. Would love to see faster more reliable service.

MVTV worked for streaming quite often but we did have some issues at the 5Mbps speed. We were with MVTV for 2 1/2 years and the only reason we switched is because we were offered the chance of FREE internet with LTD!! MVTV did have expensive start up costs but otherwise I felt they were fairly reasonable.

Having broadband availability in our area would be a great, needed, resource. Thank you for conducting the needs assessment.

I really could use a high speed internet connection. I work full-time from home and need reliable cell and internet to function. I have web meetings several times a week and while what I have now works, I would like some thing more affordable with even higher speeds and am willing to pay for it if the value is there.

Would really like the option to bundle phone, internet, and TV services. Looking for quality, speed, at an affordable price.

"We have cell service but it is terrible. Our Internet service is super and we hope nothing changes with this by someone else coming in here and buying up Xtratyme, merging it with some bigger outfit that offers poor service

but charges more. We could not be more happy with our current internet service. Broadband is running fiber in my neighborhood. I will be receiving better/faster service in the coming weeks.

"Very poor and most of the time no cell phone service between here and south of the Forest City area. A dead space.

"Other counties like Big Stone have provided DSL via cable to all their residents

Why cannot Meeker do that?"

Service is slow and over priced, very limited options to choose from.

It is disappointing that this hasn't been done years earlier. Especially since the school district is a heavy user and students need exceptional access to broadband services.

Our service is the best we could find at the time we signed up for it. It is pretty inexpensive, but not always dependable or fast enough. We do not have many options in our rural area.

We chose the location we live in for our quality of life, open land, open air, little light pollution, roads less traveled. Meeker county is beautiful and it drew us to this area. We were told that HIGH-SPEED was coming to the area soon (2015 move here). Very disappointed that all we have available is satellite internet service--sometimes running ONE hand-held device is difficult to get a good connection. I learned of an initiative that 100 miles of fiber would be trenched in and around the Dassel/Cokato area and true HIGH SPEED would be available by the end of 2017. Still nothing. I am on-call for a company that installs, maintains, and repairs 9-1-1 services and CPE for 80% of the counties in MN (including Meeker County), ND and WI; and, when there is a trouble or an outage while I am on call, I have to drive into my office in Hutchinson to get connected to the systems to troubleshoot and diagnose the issues rather than being able to do that from home, causing services to be down for much longer than necessary because of the very poor and over priced internet service available in my area. Sub-standard and embarrassing to say the least. My wife is 48 and in her 3rd year of university and often cannot complete her online homework and most of the time cannot use skype or other services to collaborate with her classmates on group projects. My two high-school aged kids cannot do homework or watch videos for class individually, let alone when we have three people in the house trying to do homework. We need better access. Thank you, DT

Country internet is very expensive. Xtratyme is very expensive to install, and they do have great people & customer service, but we rarely are getting the upload/download speeds as high as the package we are paying for. Xtratyme is the cheapest service per month, with the best internet we can get where we live, and it still isn't good. Our cell phones almost NEVER work at our house, which is why we keep the landline.

I have an employer supplied hotspot for work at home. If not, the available service is so poor I would not be able to keep my work from home status.

Currently our service has higher possible speeds available for more charge, but they are not guaranteed speeds for download/upload. Current speed tests on our service have never shown more than about 50% of the promised speed. In addition to that our service provider told us that to update our service we would need additional satellite mounting, diagnostics, and we would have to pay regardless of "if" they could update our speed to higher speeds. I want to use internet for much more like movies, watching video, Smart TV and listening to music and books but I can't afford the more expensive packages to support those. My internet is limited and I would run out very quickly by doing those things. It also doesn't keep up with video and music streaming. Has to stop and rebuffer frequently. I have plans to have my home retested for signal strength from another provider in the near future. It was tested several years ago by this provider and I'm hoping they have made improvements to reach my area now. THE AMOUNT OF DATA AVAILABLE IS A CHALLENGE. 10 GB FOR A MONTH FOR 3 PEOPLE FOR \$65

IS DISAPPOINTING. THE SPEED AND RELIABILITY IS NOT A PROBLEM IT IS THE AMOUNT OF DATA AVAILABLE, THAT IS OUR BIGGEST CONCERN.

We really wish in today's age we could get truly unlimited internet for Netflix or other services available or live streaming movies/TV shows without slowing us down after a week or two.

We have two internet providers because the internet is not reliable. We have the fast service. It is very frustrating when the internet just sits there when you are trying to do your job for work.

We would like to buy unlimited internet and we can't from our provider. We would like to get google home and netflix but we have very limited data that we can use.

"We would use our internet for more things, e.g. viewing videos, downloading videos and music, listening to internet radio if the increased use did not increase our costs. Since our monthly fee is determined by how much data we use, we limit our use to keep our costs down. We are in a geographical area where we currently really only have one choice for provider, unless we are willing to trench lines in our farm yard to get to a line of sight. We rely on the internet for our farm business for market information, ordering parts and supplies, and comparing prices.

Thank you for this survey. We feel like high speed internet access for rural areas is an important issue." We have never had good internet service in our area. You talk about a "snails pace." We must live in a lower area so we cannot get a direct hit from a tower. Satellite service is the only option we have and that isn't saying much either. For personal internet we use the satellite internet but it can't handle VPN at all plus if we have bad weather, I have no options of internet (I've answered the questions above pertaining to our personal home usage). As I work from home full-time I have to pay for a cellular internet option that can handle vpn. It has a ridiculously expensive cost and I tend to hit the limit and go over very easily. My company's policy is to pay for the internet but only if it is a wired option and there are absolutely no other options available.

"Our internet provider is horrible. Their service level is terrible. The statistics they use for measuring speed don't account for latency which turns their high speed connection into a moderately slow one. We has Wisper Wirless for year and functionally Hughesnet is only marginally faster. We have a voip package with them and I didn't realize how terrible it was going to be. There descriptions of their service quality amount to false advertising. The ability of them to lock a user into a long term contract while giving what amounts to false information is criminal.

What is worse is that when we moved we used Century Link's moving service to change carriers, the only only them mentioned was Hughesnet. They should have given us better information."

We had to switch to satellite service provider because broadband did not work at our residence.

I am a township clerk and often have access to online training opportunities and I can't do them at home because of my data limit. I am very happy with the company I get the internet from (service, tech support are great) but the fact I can't get an unlimited data package is very frustrating. 1 mile away from me they have unlimited internet through Arvig, but Arvig will not cross the Crow River at this point. Very frustrating.

"High speed internet without a set quota of GB used per month would be nice.

Not having to pay for installation in nice."

Other than some videos on Facebook, we do not watch videos. Can never watch Netflix or anything big (movies) on line. Even a podcast from WCCO gobbles up data. Only two of us who don't use it that much & still we run out of data on occasion. Wish we could go with a bigger data plan, but so expensive!

Looking for something that costs less pr month than \$50:00 pr month

We have metered internet service, so when we use all the data the speed drastically slows. Only options where we live are satellite or line of sight

We would love to have a fast, reliable, reasonably priced internet and tv service provider in our neighborhood. Some go without and others are very slow!

We use the internet to sell items to supplement our retirement and disability income. We also have a grandchild with us 3 days per week after school who uses the internet for school work.

Faster and Unlimited internet

I would love an option to bundle cable and internet. We do not have that available. WOULD LOVE TO SEE THAT OUT HERE!!!

We really need better and more reasonably priced options for birth TV and internet.

I have very limited data hours so I can never download a movie or get netflix or use amazon prime movies I can't let the grandchildren watch PBS on their iPads. We have to constantly be aware of ur usage hours in order to keep our speed up

I need unlimited data....never have enough data.

I have tried different internet services (dial-up, and satellite). Some are so limited to how much you use. If Grandchildren come over it get used up in a couple days. Xytratyme at least doesn't have small limits.

Kids just graduated from high school and they could not do school work at home. This was a significant bummer Please make reliable internet a reality here! We moved to rural Dassel from Delano and are shocked at how poor the internet and cellular service is here. My parents live in rural South Dakota and they have much better services there. I SELL ON E-BAY AND IT IS HARD TO DO AFTER THE FIEST 10- G ARE GONE AND THAT TAKE ABOUT 2-3 DAYS AND 27 SLOW DAYS

I LIVE AT LAKE ERIE WE HAVE 22 HOME AND MOST OF US CAN NOT GET GOOD CELL, DISH OR INTERNET WE ARE JUST LOW HAVE HAD ALL THE PEOPLE WE CAN FIND TO COME OUT THEY ALL SAY WE ARE JUST TO LOW WE DID HELP THANKS WARREN

Would be awesome to combine phone, Internet and TV.

"We recently moved to this location and had anticipated that the internet speed would be at minimum the same as the home we had just moved from. Shame on me for not checking prior to the home purchase as it would have factored into our buying decision.

We currently do not have internet service in our home. I inquired on the speed of internet available for this location and was quite honestly shocked to hear that the maximum attainable speed is 1 to 1.5M. Paying for this speed seems nearly pointless.

I hope to begin working at least PT from home in the next couple years. If the internet speed available does not increase, the plan to work from home will not be viable as I would need higher speeds for both phone and computer use.
