Looking at Rhode Island

RI Population: 1 Million

Hepatitis Cases: 1190 cases/100K; approx. 10K cases

Goals for Primary Care

Screen	Check	Evaluate and treat	Obtain
Screen Patients: Every person once • IVDA & MSM	Check for Hepatitis A & B Seriology & Vaccinate accordingly	If Hepatitis B surface Ag positive, evaluate and treat (nucleosides/tides)	Obtain sufficient baseline labs to evaluate for disease stage • CBC, Diff, Platelets, Prothrombin time • HCV Ab with reflex for PCR quantitative • Genotype (for the authorization) • Fib-4 testing, fibrosure

Goals for Primary Care (Continued)

Send	Discuss	TREAT!!	Discuss	Consider
If advanced cirrhotic, send to GI for therapy and follow up	Discuss alcohol use; consider fatty liver disease (MASLD, MASH, MetALD)	TREAT!! (or refer)	Check SVR at 12 weeks (4)	Consider Imaging such as: ultrasound, elastography, CT, MRI, MRE

After Confirming SVR

Follow Hep B, if on therapy

Revisit alcohol and MASLD issues

If non-cirrhotic, no follow-up

If cirrhotic, co-follow with GI (ultrasounds, AFP, EGD for varices, etc.)

Regimens

Sofosbuvir (NS5B) – Velpatisvir (NS5A) 1 pill daily for 12 wks

Glecaprevir (Protease Inhibitor) – Pibrentasvir (NS5A) 3 pills daily for 8 wks

Counseling Patients

No sharing razors or toothbrushes

Barrier contraception until SVR

Post treatment success is "not" protective for reinfection!

Odds & Ends

Pediatrics:

- Pediatric patients can be treated with FDA approval for over age 3
- Treatment is weight based, and either regimen can be used

Re-screening:

- Patients with ongoing risky behavior should be re-screened
- Many offices re-screen two to three times per year
- Don't forget Hep A & B vaccinations and other STI screening

Some Contraindications to Treatment

Active uncontrolled Hep B...get control here first Amiodarone use (arrhythmia)

Decompensated cirrhosis – particularly with Protease Inhibitors

> Work with the Transplant Team

Pregnancy is not yet FDA approved for therapy
