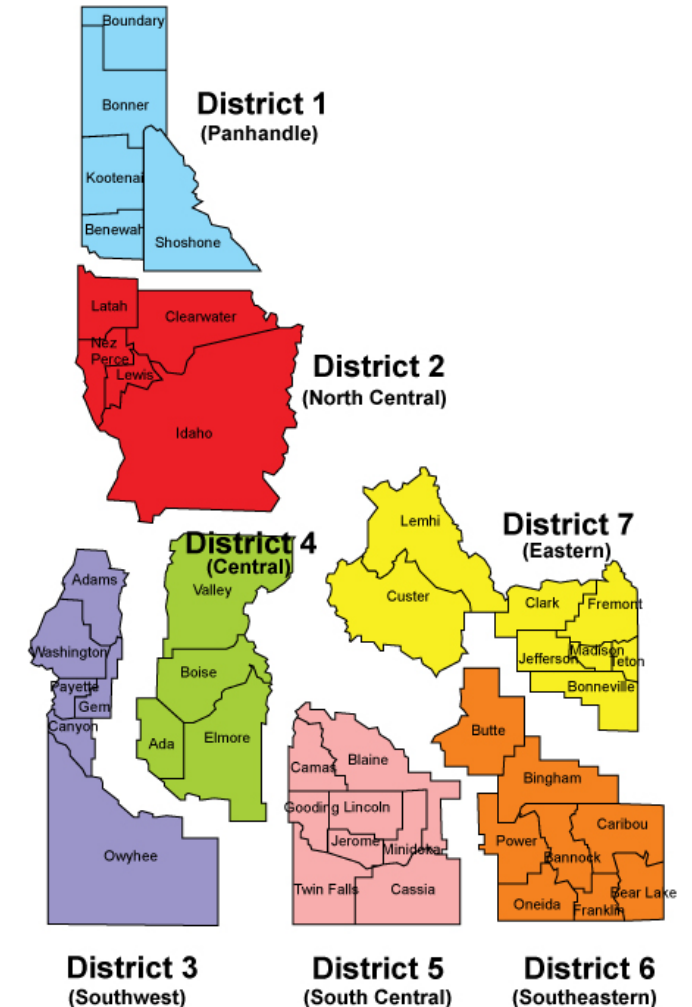

- ID PQC Champions from each area will help lead off the sessions and assist in outreach leading up to the events.



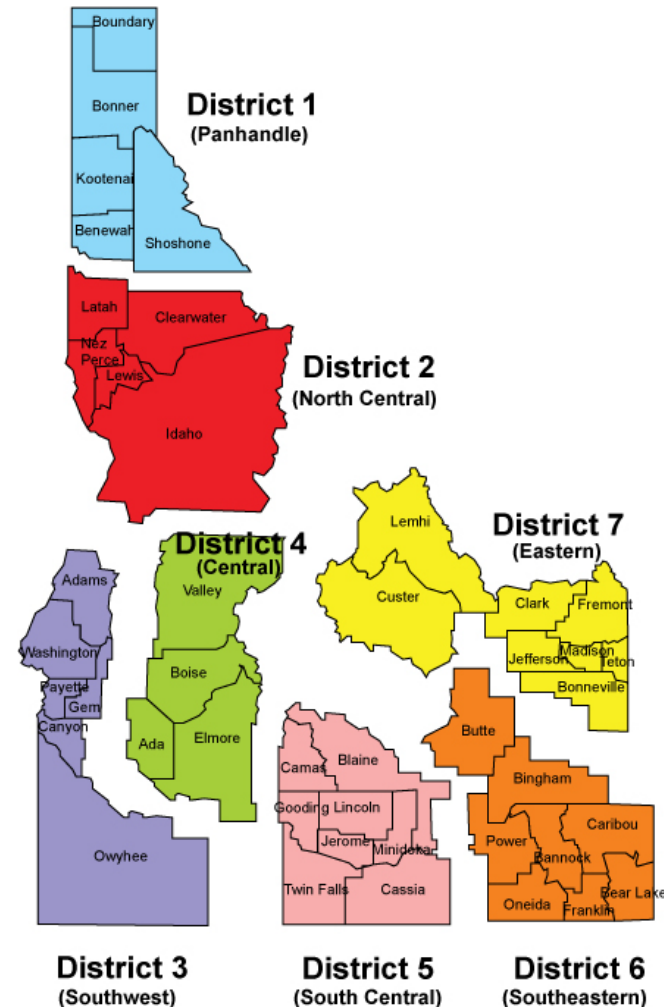
Virtual Regional Stakeholder Engagement Sessions

Virtual Regional Stakeholder Engagement Sessions

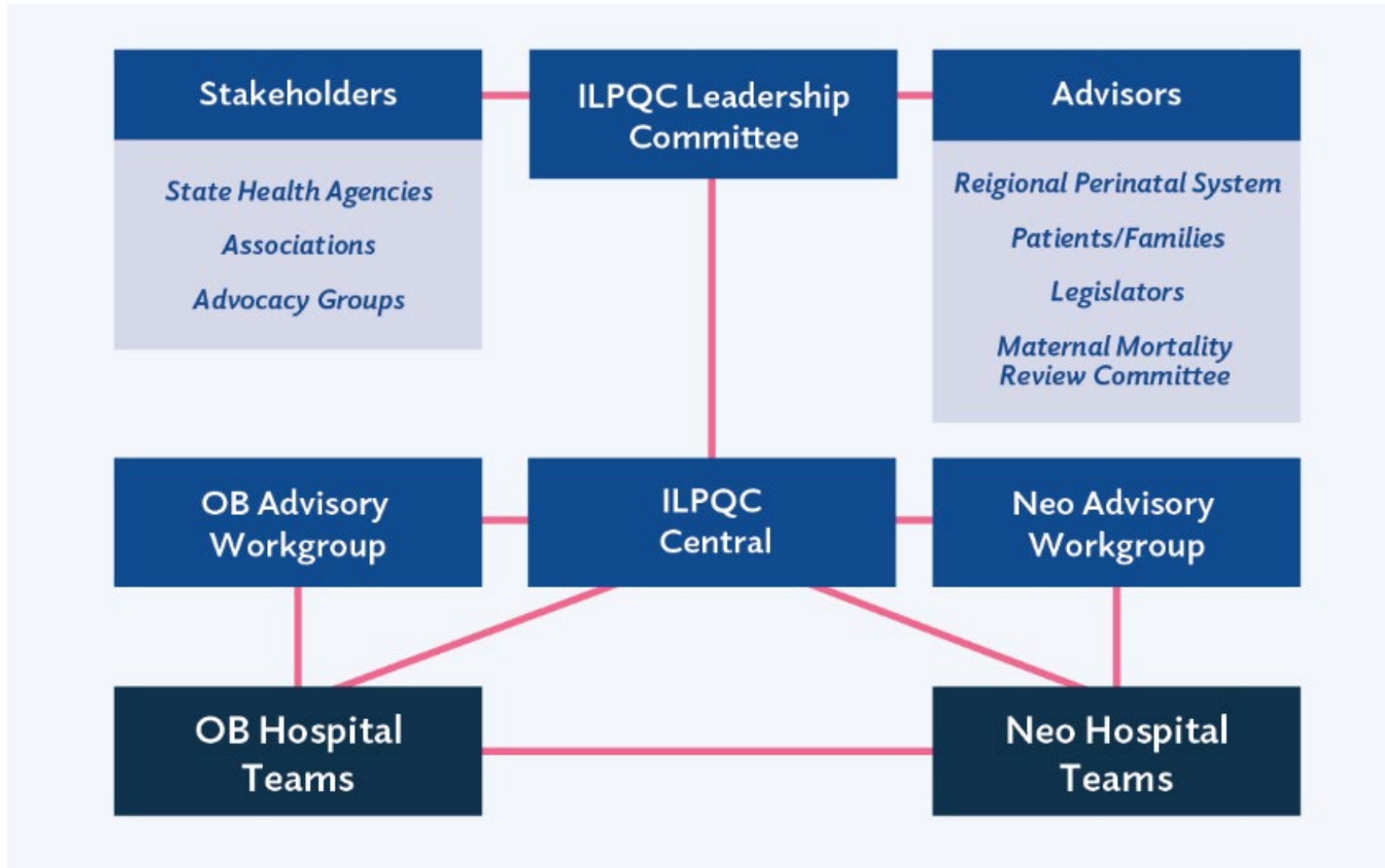
- While each session will have a focus on different regions, everyone is invited to attend any session.

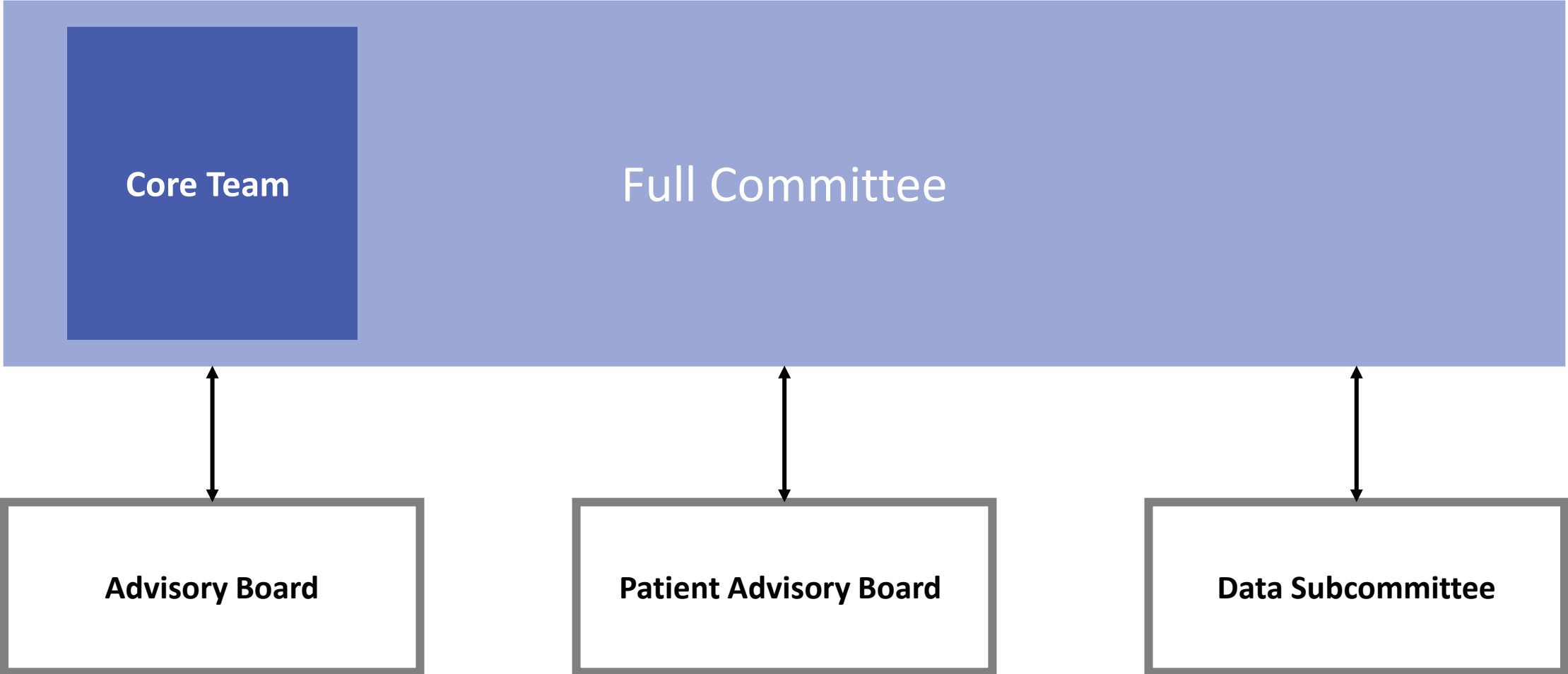
ID PQC Structure & Governance

 - How much volunteer time can members dedicate?

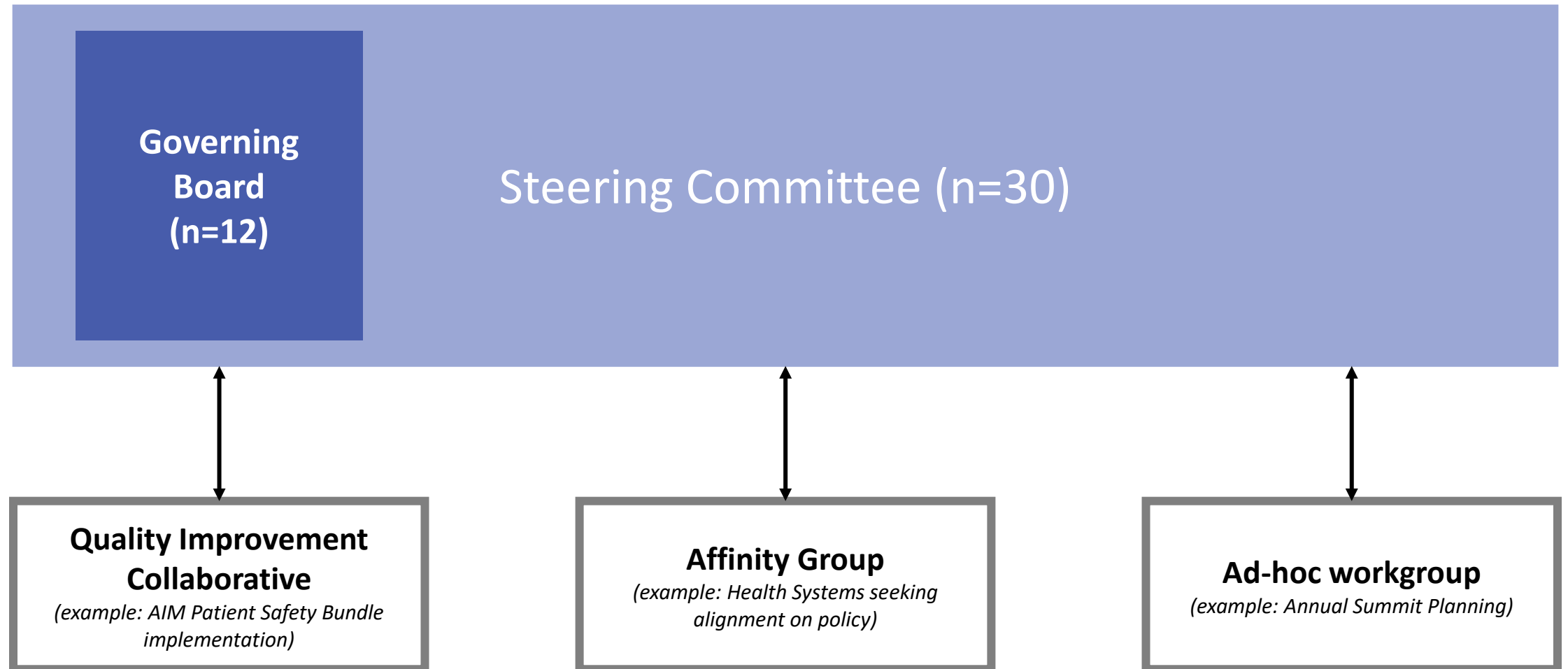
Illinois PQC
