- The Office of Special Education
 - Part C of IDEA



Who does the Infant Toddler Program serve?

ITP serves children birth to 36 months who have developmental delays or disabilities.

- All services are provided at no cost to families
- Home or community based



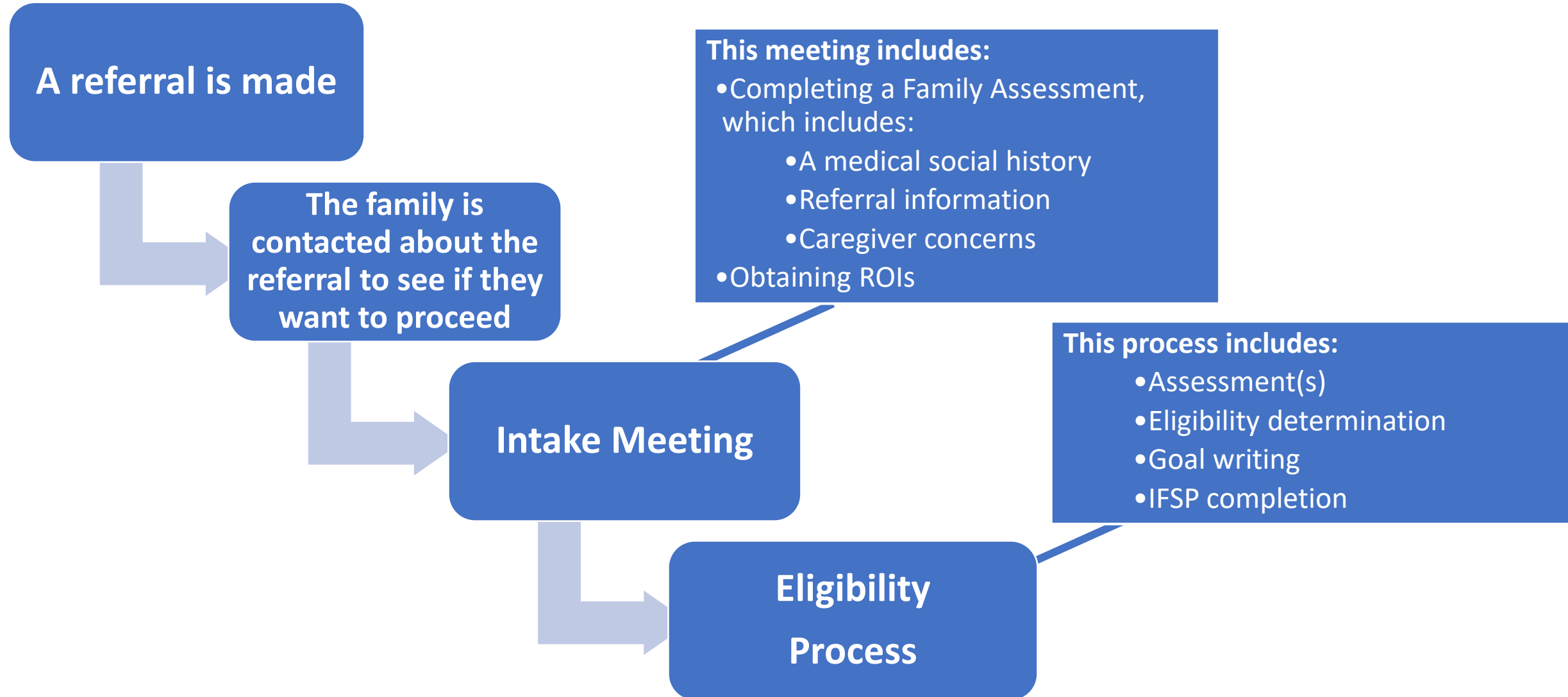

Referral Process

- This varies some from Hub to Hub
- Three ways to qualify for ITP services:
 - ❖ Developmental Delay,
 - ❖ Established Medical Condition,
 - ❖ Informed Clinical Opinion
- If a child qualifies, an IFSP must be in place within 45 days of the referral
- The family is involved in all decision-making conversations



Evidence Based Practices In Early Intervention

- The Infant Toddler Program Providers serve families in their natural environment
- The Infant Toddler Program is an education program (OSEP), not a medical program.
- Family participation in Infant Toddler Therapeutic Services is vital in having the best child outcomes



- **Team approach**
 - **SC, OT, PT, SLP, DS, IESDB**
 - **Routine Staffings**
 - **Primary Interventionist**
 - **Joint Visits**
- **Services in Natural Environments**
- **Focus is on building parent capacity**
- **Coaching**





- **What is coaching?**
Evidence Based adult learning strategy
- **What is a Primary Coach?**
- **Why does Infant Toddler Program use coaching?**
 - Evidence-based
 - Proven to be more successful for children under the age of 3
 - Build parent capacity





- **El sessions take place within a daily routine/activity**
- **The ITP provider may**
 - Watch the caregiver and child interact in an activity and then coach the caregiver in ways that the activity could be changed
 - Model a strategy
 - Encourage caregiver to practice the strategy as well and adjust as needed depending on the child's response



EXAMPLES



- Any provider, whether therapist or Service Coordinator can support families with resources
- The goal is to build parent capacity





- The Local School District gets notification of a potentially eligible child for Part B services
- If the family is interested in seeking Part B services, the Service Coordinator sends information from ITP to the local School District
 - IFSP
 - Evaluations
 - Reviews
- Service Coordinator will help facilitate a meeting with the school district.
- Regardless of the family's interest in Part B services, the Service Coordinator will have a transition meeting with the family
