




Make sure new families in your pack have this info as soon as they join – This topic applies to all Units

Get daily updates! Download the new Scouting magazine app today.



The data is in! New Scout families want to feel welcome and a sense of belonging in their new unit. And when they do, these Scouts will stay in Scouting programs for a long time.

What does this mean for Cub Scout leaders? Of course, being welcoming and kind to newcomers is at Scouting's core. But there is one tool you can start using right now to get families the info they need to feel welcomed right off the bat.

Check out the new "Welcome to Cub Scouts one-pager" and fill in the blanks for your unit. Then, make handing, mailing, emailing, or texting this info sheet to new parents' part of your welcoming process.

What do new parents, especially Cub Scout parents, need to know right away?

Don't overthink it. The most important information to impart to a new family is how to make it to their first Cub Scout meeting. A family needs the time, date, and place of the meeting as part of the "onboarding" journey.

Onboarding means getting new Scouts and parents looped in with what's going on in your unit and demonstrating the welcoming atmosphere of Cub Scouts. If someone doesn't come from a Scouting background, they may not know the difference between a "den" and a "pack." They likely have no idea how often Scouts meet. And they certainly don't know when and where your unit meets.

That's why it's critical to give new families this info as soon as possible, as simply as possible. Then, parents and kids have a foundational understanding of how Cub Scouts is structured and you can ensure they make it to that first, crucial meeting.

Give new Cub Scout families the information they need quickly and easily



If your Cub Scout unit's onboarding process needs a refresh, we've got your back. Check out the <u>Welcome to Cub Scouts one-pager</u>. It's an editable PDF. Add your unit's info using your computer, or print the one-pager and fill it out by hand.

Consider the best way to distribute this onepager to new families. Perhaps your delivery method changes depending on how a family signs up for Scouts. You could turn it into a poster for joining events or copy-and-paste the one-pager's text into an email you send to every new family that registers online. You could distribute it as a flyer or text it to parents after you receive their children's applications.



STEM Program

STEM—Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics

STEM is an initiative the Boy Scouts of America has taken on to encourage the natural curiosity of youth members and their sense of wonder about these fields. From archery to welding, Scouts can't help but enjoy the wide range of STEM-related activities. To support this initiative, the BSA developed the STEM Nova Awards program so that youth members have fun and receive recognition for their efforts.

Nova Awards

What are the STEM Nova Awards?

Scouts BSA developed the STEM Nova Awards program to excite and expand a sense of wonder in our Scouts. By working with an adult counselor or mentor, the various modules allow them to explore the basic principles of STEM and discover how fun and fascinating STEM can be. The Supernova awards are offered for those who enjoy a super challenge. Discover how the STEM Nova Awards program helps youth be "Prepared. For Life."

Virginia Bird and Wildlife Trail (VBWT)

Check out this online guide for observing birds and wildlife from over 600 viewing sites along 65 trail loops within the Old Dominion.

With 400 species of birds, 150 species of mammals, 150 species of amphibians and reptiles, 250 species of fish, plus hundreds of butterfly, dragonfly, and other invertebrate species, you'll soon see why Virginia is a premier destination for birding and wildlife viewing.

Use the interactive maps and menus at Find Wildlife: Viewing to search for viewing sites near you or by city/county, search for sites with specific birds and wildlife of interest, or get driving directions to a site from your current location. 

2022 National Order of the Arrow Conference (NOAC)



We are excited to invite you to attend the 2022 National Order of the Arrow Conference (NOAC) on **July 25-30**, **2022** at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville! NOACs are the OA's largest event, with upwards of 8,000 attendees from lodges nationwide expected to gather for the best national conference yet!

After more than a year of living through this pandemic, we can't wait to get back to NOAC and watch the nightly stadium shows, watch lodges compete for glory in the sports and ceremony competitions, and meet Arrowmen from around the nation, all while spending a week living in a college dorm—and yes, it will have air conditioning!

Interested in joining us in Knoxville? Attendees can register for next year's NOAC as one of four categories:

- 1. **Delegates** Participants who register directly with a lodge contingent. Lodge leadership will coordinate payment of conference fees.
- 2. *Individuals* Participants who register outside of their lodge contingent. Council Scout executives must still approve these individuals' attendance. These participants will register directly through the National OA Event Registration System (NOAERS) and will be housed in premium (hotel) housing. This option is only available for adult participants at least 21 years old.
- 3. **Staff** Volunteers who execute the conference and coordinate their own travel. Staff opportunities are available for both youth and adults. Staff can either choose to stay in University of Tennessee, Knoxville dorms or premium (hotel) housing and will register directly through the National OA Event Registration System (NOAERS).
- 4. *Virtual Delegates* Participants who do not travel to Knoxville but still want to watch a livestream of NOAC programs and other exclusive content. These individuals will register directly through NOAERS.
