




GREEKS VERSUS ROMANS SPRING CAMPOREE

Alignment Update

George Mason District adjustment



Circles represent where roads (straight lines) were chosen over HS boundary

Rationale:

- Picks up Falls Church and Justice HSs
- Transfers area north of 267 back to Langley HS (Powhatan Dist)
- Transfers Oakton HS proper back to area with students (Powhatan Dist)

Pros:

- alignment with HSs
- picks up areas uncovered by reallocation of Old Dominion

Cons:

District Name Change

- The Organizational Alignment Committee's district alignment recommendations will propose these naming guidelines:
 - Districts composed of more or less than one county should be named after a prominent geographical feature.
 - Districts whose boundaries have been significantly redrawn should be renamed [10 districts listed].
 - NCAC will approve final name submission.

Our Guidelines:

- We encourage you to get suggestions from your Scouts, parents, Committee members and uniformed leaders.
- The District Committee will review all submissions and develop a short list of names.
- A short list will be provided, via survey, for a vote of all registered adults. One week will be given for this vote.
- To assist in locating a prominent geographical feature, we have added the new District boundary map.
- A survey will be released, within a day or two, to allow you to submit your recommendation(s).

Merit Badges

- The online Merit Badge Counselor <u>registration</u>.
- New Merit Badge Counselors must complete online merit badge counselor training, in addition to YPT. Be sure the counselor uses his/her legal name no nicknames.
- Merit Badge Counselors, or the unit Dean/Leader, also need to scan and send Margee the Merit Badge application form listing the badges the counselor is applying to teach and providing a justification of his/her qualifications.
- Youth Protection Training is the essential first step. Don't hit "send" on the application without it!

Did you know:

- The National Council does not limit the number of merit badges a youth may earn from one counselor, though a <u>unit leader is permitted to do so</u>, as long as the same limit applies to all Scouts in the unit. Ideally, Scouts should work with a variety of adults. (GTA 7.0.0.3)
- Partial Merit Badges have no expiration except the Scout's 18th birthday. (GTA 7.0.3.3)
- Due to the BSA policies related to Youth Protection and two-deep leadership, a merit badge counselor
 must have another adult present during all merit badge counseling sessions. However, the parent or legal
 guardian of the Scout may serve as the second adult. This parent or legal guardian does not have to be a
 registered leader.
- If the requirements for a merit badge differ between the merit badge pamphlet and the current edition of Scouts BSA Requirements, the requirements in the Scouts BSA Requirements book supersede all others.
