Program Overview

This program is designed for Cub Scouts going into the 1st through 3rd grades in the fall of 2019. Note that Scouts going into first grade (Tiger Den) **must** attend with their Adult Partner.



Camp-Wide Program

Opening Campfire

We'll kick off the best week of the summer with a fun-filled campfire at the Akela Ring. Meet the staff while they do wacky skits and learn our silly camp songs.

Cardboard Boat Regatta

Back this summer is a camp favorite: the cardboard boat race! Bring your best boat ideas and some supplies to craft a speedy ship. After racing in Waldock Pond, the winners will be awarded at the end of camp!

Evening & Open Program

Each program area has something special to offer during evening program. All the favorites are open like fishing, volleyball and gaga ball — plus, don't miss the special staff vs. camper competition.

Prehistoric Park Games

We'll end camp in style with a Cretaceous Carnival! Try your hand at fun games like Dino Toss and Pterodactyl Egg Race with your parents and Pack!

Adult Programs

Parents get hands-on at Cub Scout Resident Camp. There's always a way for you to get involved in our program areas with your Scout. And during open program, you can go back to your favorites together!

Closing Campfire

This is your chance to show what you've got. Each Den will have the chance to perform a skit or song to the rest of camp. Scouts will also receive awards they have earned during the week.



Daily Program Triads

Throughout camp, your Den will get to visit each of the program areas and experience the fun activities they've planned for you! We know camp can be big for little legs, so our program triads are located close together!

Shooting & Sports Triad

BB Guns - Safety and skill are the name of the game. You'll learn how to correctly operate a BB gun, and take aim at our fun targets. Our sharp-shooters are recognized at the end of camp, and with some determination you can earn your Shooting Sports Pin!

Archery - "Notch an arrow, aim, and release!" Getting that bullseye is every camper's dream at the Archery Range. You'll learn how our pre-historic ancestors used bows and arrows to survive, and have the chance to earn your Shooting Sports Pin. Come back during open program for special shoots!

Sports - Teamwork and personal fitness are cornerstones of a great Cub Scout! We'll stretch our legs playing some of your favorite field games, and perhaps even tackle the climbing wall! Who will scramble to the top the fastest?

Scout Crafter Triad

Scout Skills - It wouldn't be summer camp without practicing your outdoor skills like knot tying, knife handling, and fire building. At Scout Skills, we master the basics that every Scout should know!

STEM - Grab your goggles and put your brain to the test. At STEM, we try fun experiments and science projects. It's the home for rockets, explosions, and goo — it'll be a blast!

Cub Crafts - Firelands has long been known for the awesome wood projects that Cubs create at camp and take home — and this year is no exception. In addition to hammering, nailing, and glueing, our Cub Crafts staff love to help you bring your project ideas to life!

Outdoor Fun Triad

Swimming - Whether you're an advanced swimmer or just learning to get in the water, our Aquatics area has something for you! Prove your swimmer skills and earn the chance to play on our famous Iceberg!

Boating - If boating is more your style, we have several different kinds of boats to take out onto the pond, including our favorite round corral boats. Go with a parent or a buddy and you're off to the races, or enjoy a leisurely afternoon on the water!

Nature - Our camp is a natural habitat for tons of little critters, fascinating plants, and HUGE fish for catching! Were there ever pre-historic creatures here? You'll have to keep an eye out for clues they might have left behind.





Tribe of A'Chawi

The Tribe of A'Chawi is an exclusive group of campers that participate from year-to-year in Cub Scout Resident Camp or Webelos Exploration Camp. These honor campers complete scouting spirit and woodsman skills throughout the week to be checked off by their adult leader. Candidates must also participate in the Test of the Tribe of A'Chawi.

Tribesman

The Tribesman is the first order of the Tribe of A'Chawi. This rank can be achieved when a Scout attend their first session at Cub Scout Resident Camp or Webelos Exploration Camp.

Brave

The Brave is the second order of the Tribe. This rank can be achieved when a scout attends their second session at camp. They are required to put forth more effort and skill in achieving this second order.

Spirit Healer

The Spirit Healer is the third order of the Tribe of A'Chawi. This rank can be achieved when a Scout attends their third session of Cub Scout Resident Camp or Webelos Exploration Camp. They must be a Brave in the Tribe. They continue to live by the Scout Oath and Law and prove their outdoor prowess.

Chief

The Chief is the final order of the Tribe of A'Chawi. Only those who have attended their fourth session of camp are able to reach the highest rank of the Tribe. The Chief order is bestowed upon those who are in the Spirit Healer order. Webelos who join the Chief order have proved their tenacity, their leadership, and their teamwork. They are surly ready to attend Beaumont in a Scouts BSA Troop next summer.

The Tribe of A'Chawi is afflicted with Order of the Arrow, Erielhonan Lodge.

The pocket flap is worn on a Cub Scout or Webelos uniform shirt to indicate membership in the Tribe.

Trading Post eGift Cards

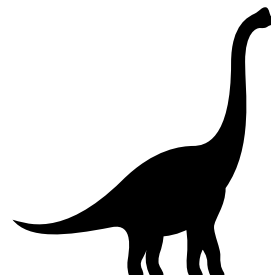
