There is a National Network of Perinatal Quality Collaboratives to support state-based collaboratives. Some collaboratives are active, and some are in development. CDC is currently providing support for 36 state-based PQC's. Funding supports the capability to improve the quality of perinatal care for mothers and babies in their states.

AIM BUNDLES

PQC's implement Alliance for Innovation on Maternal Health (AIM) tools that meet the needs of their communities

AIM bundles include:

- Severe Hypertension in Pregnancy
- Obstetric Hemorrhage
- Postpartum Discharge Transition
- Caring for Pregnant and Postpartum People with Substance Use Disorder

50 states are enrolled in AIM (Idaho enrolled in 2023)

1,996 AIM participating facilities-those facilities that are submitting reports during the previous cycle (The aim bundles are available on-line for all facilities to use)

IDPOC has identified Severe Hypertension in Pregnancy as it's first AIM Bundle (implementation is typically 18-24 months)
