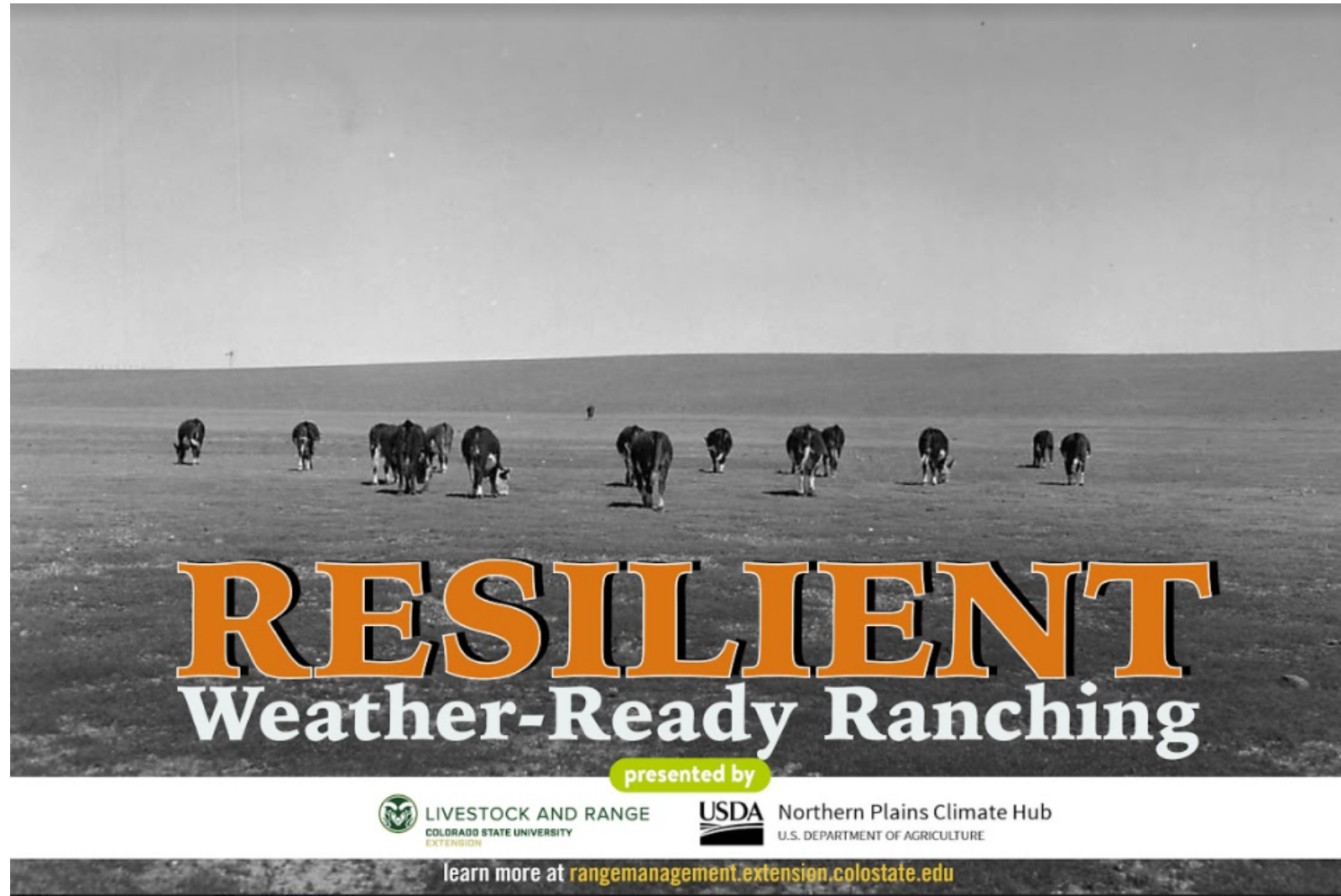

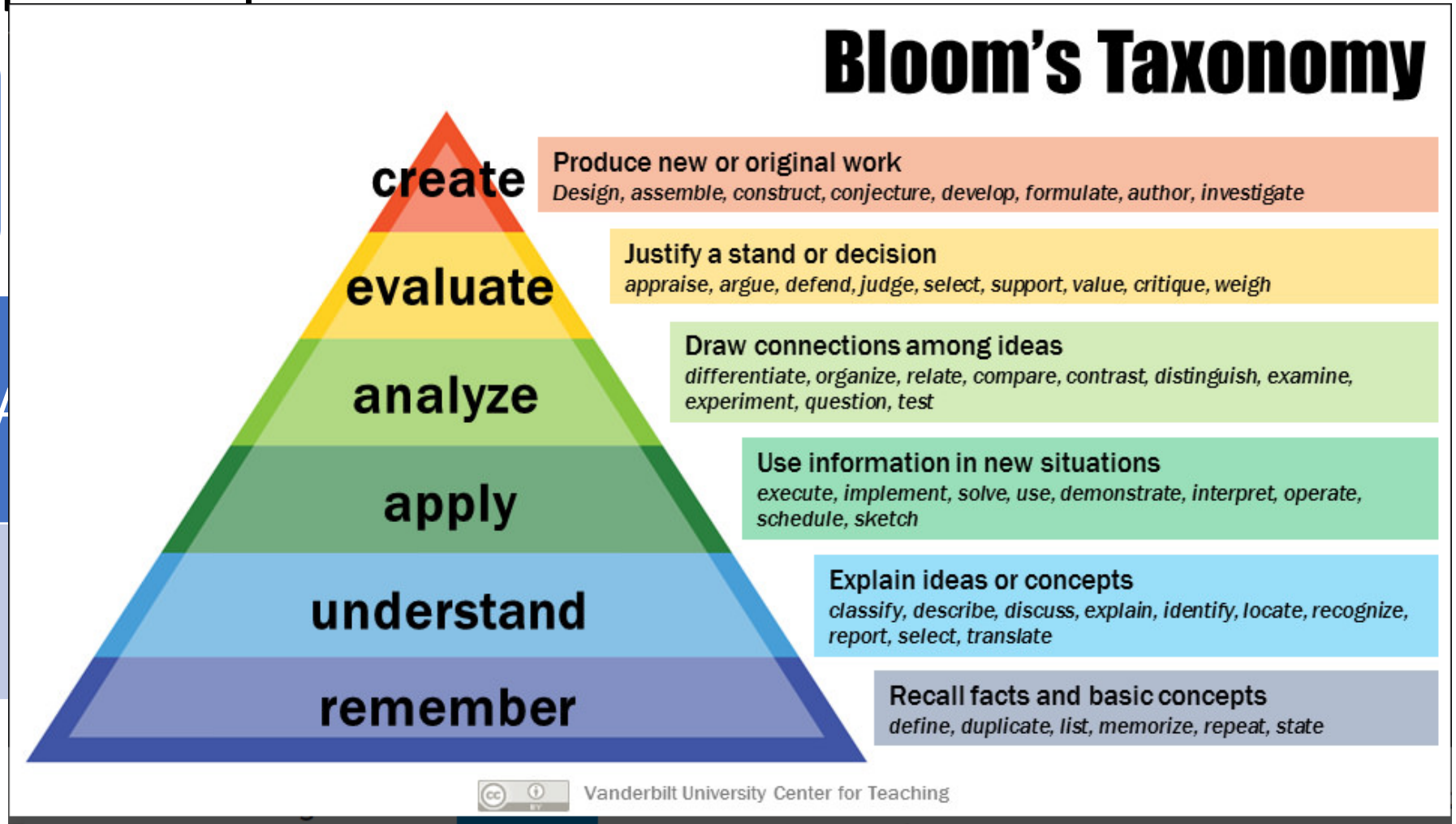
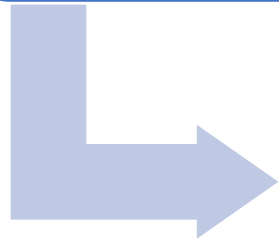
Why Drought?

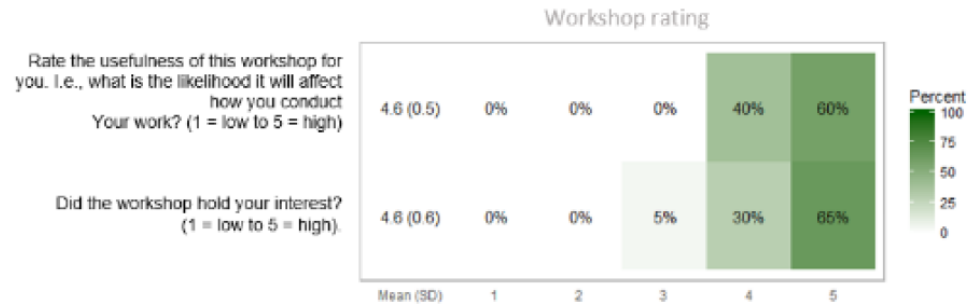
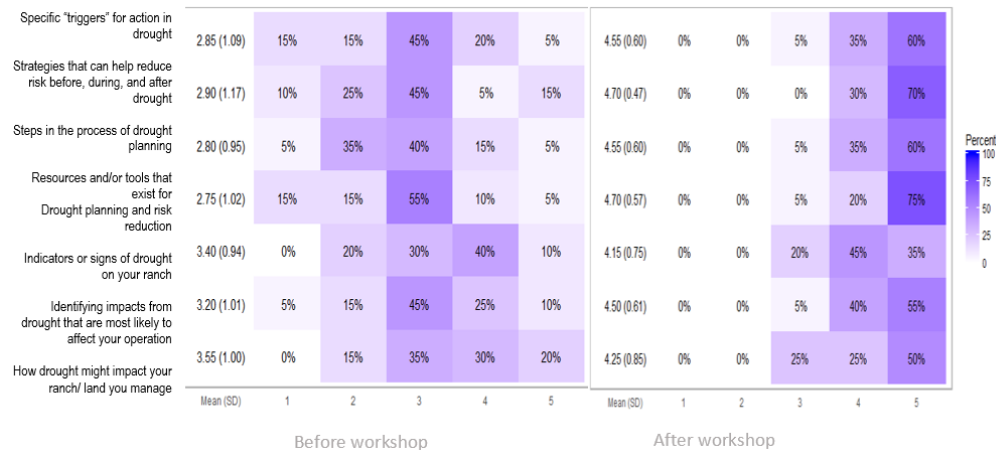


Fig. 2 Participant (n=34) workshop ratings.
