Region 5 - Flower Show
Thursday April 24, 2025
“Celebrate Spring”



Rules:

- Exhibitors must attend the Region 5 Spring Regional.
- Entries will be accepted between 8:00 am to 9:30 am on Thursday April 24, 2025.
- Exhibits must be ticketed and entered by 9:30 am on the day of the show. If not, they will be for viewing only. Closed judging will begin at 9:45 am with comments on the exhibits from the judge later in the afternoon.
- Awards of first, second and third place will be given in all classes. Awards will be given for the “Best of Show” in both the artistic and horticulture divisions.
- An accredited OAGC judge will judge the show using the OAGC standard system of judging. All decisions of the judge will be final.
- All exhibits are displayed at the exhibitor’s risk.

Artistic Design Rules:

1. Artistic designs must be the work of the exhibitor.
2. Exhibitors may enter multiple classes, but only one entry per class.
3. Entry tags will be provided. All plant materials used in the artistic design must be listed on a 3” x 5” index card. Also, a brief interpretation of the design may be put on the index card. Both entry tag and index card must be placed with the design.
4. Designs must include fresh or dried plant material secured from any source.
5. No artificial or painted fresh plant material is permitted in the show. One may use painted dried material. Painted dried material is not to be used in traditional designs.
6. The flower show committee will furnish a continuous white backdrop with white tablecloths. An exhibitor may bring their own background provided it is no larger than 30” W x 30” D x 45” H. Exhibitors may not pin, staple or tape anything to the backdrop.
7. Accessories and or/ bases may be used to enhance design but is not required.

Horticulture Rules:

1. Horticulture entries must be grown by the exhibitor.
2. Horticulture exhibits must be staged in a clear glass container provided by the exhibitor which is a suitable size for the exhibit. No pint or quart jars will be accepted.
3. Correct variety and name of all horticulture exhibits will be given preference over one of equal quality without a name.
4. Exhibitors may make two entries in any horticulture class provided each entry is a different variety.
5. Wedges may be used in a horticultural exhibit provided it doesn’t distract from the entry.
6. Potted plants must be in exhibitor’s possession for at least two months.
7. The flower show committee reserves the right to combine or subdivide a class depending on the number of entries.

Artistic Design

Class 1 - "Sprouts of Spring" - A miniature design. Design not to exceed 5" in any direction.

Class 2 - "Everything's Coming up Green" - A design that is predominately green.

Class 3 - "Gardening in the Spring" - A creative design incorporating garden tools.

Class 4 - "A Spring Walk in the Woods" - Incorporating wood in the design.

Class 5 - "Welcome Spring" - A design using multiple colors.

Class 6 - "A Spring Thunderstorm" - Own interpretation

Horticulture

Class 7 - Daffodil - White, single bloom, one stem, no foliage

Class 8 - Daffodil - Yellow, single bloom, one stem, no foliage

Class 9 - Daffodil - Single bloom, bi-colored, one stem, no foliage

Class 10 - Daffodil - Double, single bloom, any color, no foliage

Class 11 - Tulip - Single one bloom, any color, one stem, two leaves

Class 12 - Tulip - Double one bloom, any color one stem, two leaves

Class 13 - Tulip - Any other type, one bloom, any color, one stem, two leaves

Class 14 - Grape Hyacinth (Muscari) - A group of three, same color, no foliage

Class 15 - Any other spring flowering bulb, corm, rhizome or tuber not listed - One bloom, any color, one stem

Class 16 - Any flowering branch - Not to exceed 18" in length

Class 17 - Houseplant - Container not to exceed 14" in inside diameter
