# INTRODUCTION

### What is a Comprehensive Plan?

A comprehensive plan is a document intended to guide and shape future growth of a community. The South Carolina Planning Enabling Act of 1994 establishes requirements for local governments to develop and maintain comprehensive plans.

As of 2024, the State requires that all comprehensive plans include ten elements: Population, Economic Development, Natural Resources, Cultural Resources, Community Facilities, Housing, Land Use, Transportation, Priority Investment, and Resiliency.

### Why Plan?

Comprehensive plans provide an opportunity for communities to examine changes in and around their jurisdictions that may impact their vision for the future.

Plans outline challenges facing the community, identify solutions, and provide guidance to appointed and elected officials on planning-related decisions. They also establish longrange general goals and policies that will help direct physical, social, and economic development in a coordinated manner.

### How Will the Plan be Developed?

Major tasks included in developing the Comprehensive Plan include conducting background research, receiving feedback from the community, and drafting a framework to guide land use and development decisions throughout the Town of Ridgeland. The process is outlined below:

- **Q** Background Research (July October)
- Initial Public Input (August November)
- Plan Vision and Goals (November 2024 January 2025)
- Prepare Draft Plan
- Public Input on Draft Plan
- **Develop Final Plan**
- Adoption Process







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### **Historic Population Growth**

### **Projected Growth in County**









Median Age in Town




