UPDATE 14 May 2020 Pending Release from Stay at Home and Gathering Size orders by Maryland State and Local Authorities Scouts are directed to proceed to Zombie Training. All prior preparation and activity requirements remain in force.

UPDATE – 20 January 2020– LOCAL ALERT – The Controlled Health Research Investigation Service (CHRIS) has reports of affected humans and animals in the Prince Georges County area, with reports of more travelling across the Maryland countryside.

According to CHRIS the Zom Bescerius bacteria, or the “Zombie Plague” as it is being called in the news, is transmitted through bites and in some cases through physical contact, especially on broken skin.

RECOMMENDATION: Scouts, Venturers and Explorers are advised to train and prepare for the Zombie Apocalypse expected to emerge at Cheltenham American Legion Youth Camp. Training will help to prepare our Scouts not only for this developing situation but other challenges in life.

The Zombies Are Loose!

Due to Covid Restrictions this Camporee is now a 1 day VIRTUAL event ,

Participation guidelines:

1. All Units will participate virtually. by patrol. A patrol is defined as 8 Scouts and 2 Adult Leaders.
2. All events will be by Patrol. All Patrol members will be from the same Unit. Patrols must maintain social distance within their group.
3. Participants must wear masks and follow all local and state covid guidelines. Groups should screen themselves for potential covid infections. Those running a fever, feeling ill or with recent Covid exposure should not participate and immediately return home.
4. Patrols should meet at a site convenient to them with a large open area for activities Scoutmasters will receive access to our Camporee Basecamp within the Patuxent district Basecamp. Printable instructions and scorecards for all events will be posted on Basecamp one week before the Camporee Patrols will also be able to join a zoom meeting for the Opening and closing ceremonies and at designated times for virtual station explanations
5. Patrols will be scored by their Scoutmasters and must upload their score sheets and pictures to the Camporee Staff via Basecamp by 4:00 PM on October 10, 2020
6. Patrol must supply their own equipment for this camporee. A supply list is included in this packet.
7. Patrols should bring a packed lunch and filled water bottles.
- 9. All Patrols will be able to participate in our Zombie movie marathon from the comfort of their own homes via a Zoom Meeting at 8PM on October 10, 2020**

The Zombie Apocalypse is a test of your survival and creative thinking skills.

It is also a competitive event!

Patrols will compete to be named the Most Successful Survivors.

In determining the MSS we will observe the following rules:

1. All Patrols are part of the competition.
2. Patrols must provide their own equipment per the attached list
3. The total number of points in the competition is 800.
4. Troops/Crews will compete at each of 8 stations by patrol. Each station is worth a maximum of 100 points..
5. Scoutmasters are responsible for their Patrol's scorecard and must turn it in by 4:00 PM via email or using Basecamp. Scorecards received after 4PM will not be in the running for Most Successful Survivors.
6. Scoring Sheets for patrol level stations will not be provided to patrols before the camporee.
7. One patrol will be awarded the Camporee Scout Spirit Award. This award will be determined by Camporee Staff based on photos and Zoom participation by the patrols..

Patrol Events (100 points each):

1. **Zombie Eyes**—A test of your map and compass skills. Each patrol should have at least 2 compasses. Baseplate styles are preferred
2. **Zombie Dentention**—Practice your knots and lashing skills in order to suspend a Zombie in mid air.
3. **Move the Zombie Head**— Your Patrol must successfully move the Zombie Head and place it in the containment box before passing along the trail. Don't touch the head or you will become infected.
4. **Knot a Zombie**—Practice your basic knots to complete this station.
5. **Be Prepared or Be a Zombie's Lunch**—Are you prepared to survive a Zombie attack? Do you have the essentials?
6. **Barbed Wire Escape**—Escape through our barbed wire to safety without touching the Zombie poison or getting captured by Zombies.
7. **Crossing the Zombie River**—Work as team to cross a river infested with Zombies
8. **Zombie Rescue**—One of your patrol members has been bitten by a Zombie. You must treat them and carry them to safety through our obstacle course
9. **Make a Zombie Movie** See attached. Not scored but earns Bonus Points!

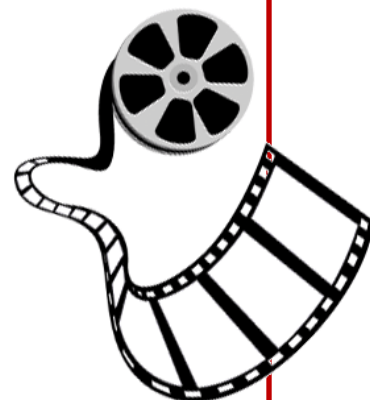
Zombie Movie Marathon

Here are the guidelines:

1. All Movies must be BSA acceptable and follow the guidelines for campfire skits. If you have questions on acceptability ask your Scoutmaster!
2. Movies should be no longer than 5 minutes
3. All movies MUST be pre screened by the camporee staff. Movies must be submitted by October 3, 2020
4. All movies must be on Digital media. Submissions may be loaded to the Camporee Basecamp. **Please contact Patuxent Activities@yahoo.com if you need an alternative entry method.** DO NOT EMAIL an entry.
5. Units may enter more than one Movie if they have multiple patrols attending the camporee
6. Complete our entry form and submit to basecamp along with the file for your movie tagged with your troop number and patrol name.
7. ZOSKARS will be awarded! Best Picture, Best Zombie. And so on.

Model Pre-Event Medical Screening Checklist

Use this checklist to assist in identifying potentially communicable diseases before event participation.

The intent of this checklist is to review with each youth and adult participant their current health status, both before departure and upon arrival at the event. Anyone entering a camp or event — including visitors, vendors, etc. — should be screened using this checklist.

Councils should customize with input from their council health supervisor and local health department.

- ☐ Yes ☐ No Have you been in contact with anyone who has COVID-19 or is otherwise sick?
- ☐ Yes ☐ No Have you or anyone you have been in close contact with traveled on a cruise ship, internationally, or to an area with a known communicable disease outbreak in the last 14 days?

If the answer is “yes” to either of these questions, the participant must stay home.

- ☐ Yes ☐ No Are you in a higher-risk category as defined by the CDC guidelines?
- If the answer is “yes” to this question, we recommend that you stay home. Should you choose to participate, you must have approval from your healthcare provider and then proceed to the symptom decision tree below.

If the above answers are “no,” proceed to this symptom decision tree.

- ☐ Shortness of breath
- ☐ New or worsening dry cough
- ☐ Fever of 100.4° or greater
- ☐ Flu-like symptoms
- ☐ Vomiting
- ☐ Diarrhea

NONE

- ☐ Cough
- ☐ Unexplained extreme fatigue or muscle aches
- ☐ Rash
- ☐ Sore throat
- ☐ Open sore

YES to any ONE symptom

YES to any TWO or more symptoms

THE PARTICIPANT MUST STAY HOME
These symptoms are associated with communicable diseases and the participant **MUST** stay home until medically cleared by their health care provider.
