### 2024 By-the-Numbers

The vast majority of investments supporting Tillamook County Wellness are from the in-kind contributions of its many partner organizations and community volunteers.

- 40 organizations
- 97 individuals
- 518 volunteer hours
- \$188,621 Total investment
  - TCCHC Backbone funding and support of \$40,721
  - AHM in-kind coordination support & contributions of \$40,790
  - OHSU in-kind technical assistance valued at \$9,913
  - Grants \$35,000 - *Kiwanis, OHSU Knight Cancer Institute*
  - In-kind volunteer hours valued at \$17,350

- 1 New committee formed




### **Financial Stability**
