



# Searching for a Mentor


1. Visit **MOMENTS.mo.gov** and select the “**Mentee Application/Login**” button.



2. Choose the ‘**Search for a Mentor.**’



3. Here you can filter your search by name, working hours, agency, division, career skills, and/or soft skills. You can also click ‘**search**’ without applying any filters to view all available mentors. When you are finished selecting your filters, click ‘**search.**’



# Searching for a Mentor

4. Click **'Select as mentor'** next to your chosen mentor(s). This action will automatically notify the mentor of your request. You will receive an email notification after the mentor has accepted or declined the request.

**Suggested Matches**

After clicking "Select as Mentor," the mentor will receive a notice of your request and the mentor's name will no longer appear on your suggested mentor list.

Limit of Two Mentors—If you have two active mentors, you cannot select another mentor from the suggested mentor list.
