

Send us your *registration form* as soon as possible Enrollment for each merit badge class is limited. Scouts and their parents will be notified by return email with the merit badge they have been assigned, and with the contact information for the merit badge counselor. Counselors will let scouts know about prerequisites and how to prepare for their merit badge class.

<u>Merit Badges:</u> Aviation, Automotive Maintenance, Citizenship in the Community, Citizenship in the Nation, Citizenship in the World, Chemistry, Collections, Communication, Electricity, Electronics, Engineering, Family Life, Fingerprinting, Genealogy, Leatherwork, Nuclear Science, Personal Management, Photography, Public Speaking, Scholarship, Space Exploration, Truck Transportation

Scouts can also ask for another merit badge of *their choice*, and we will try to offer it.

Bring a Boy Scout merit badge *blue card* signed by unit leader to give to their counselor.

<u>Fees:</u> The cost of the Merit Badge Fair is \$10.00 per scout (\$5.00 for additional scouts in the same family). This fee pays for, facility fee, merit badge supplies, a special patch, and refreshments.

Note: Please do not bring your own food or drinks to the Fair; refreshments will be provided.

PURPOSE OF UNIVERSITY OF SCOUTING

University of Scouting is a supplemental training opportunity offering over 200 courses for adult Scout leaders in all program areas (Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing, Sea Scouting, and District Operations). There is a Scouting Museum and a Midway with more than 50 displays. Whether you are new to Scouting or a veteran the University of Scouting has something for everyone.

The College of Cub Scouting provides courses ranging from pack administration to planning for an outdoor program.

The College of Scouts, BSA provides an exciting variety of troop, patrol and outdoor planning supplemental courses to help manage the challenges of a great troop experience.

The College of Adventure Scouting offers courses for those wanting to learn more about Scouting's "senior" level programs and the challenges of an active high adventure experience.

The College of Elective Programs offers many "general studies courses" that cut across all the program areas. Just about everything from diversity and special needs to using technology can be found in the Elective Programs. STEM Scouts will be covered as a subprogram (ELC500 classes) within the Electives College

The College of District Operations provides training to district committee members and scouters with an interest how the district works. While no degree is conferred, those who take the required three courses are awarded the BSA District Scouter Training Certificate and "Trained" patch.

Also offered as Standalone Courses are Introduction to Leadership Skills in the Crew and Ship, for Youth and for Adults (separate courses). Note these are all day classes and do not meet any degree requirements in any College.



- Due to the limited number of patches available, make sure to submit your <u>"Activity Report"</u> as soon as *all* program requirements have been completed.

Who can participate in the program?

All Boy and Girl Scouts are eligible to participate.

What are the patch requirements?

- Each Scout/Troop or unit must coordinate a Week activity within your local community or school.
- Activities and events must be coordinated during the program dates (July 1 November 30) of the current year.
- Each Scout must attend a drug prevention education session.
- Each Scout must take the DEA Drug Free Pledge.
- The Scout leader must complete and submit the online <u>"Activity Report"</u> upon completion of *all* program requirements.

Processing Training Awards, Unit Leader Key Awards, and other awards

Trained leaders have the knowledge and self-confidence to provide young people with a quality program. There are two important parts of BSA's Leadership Training Recognition plan: to honor demonstrated performance and tenure of trained leaders in all areas of the Scouting program involving units and to encourage others to become trained.

Trained leaders may apply for the knot appropriate to their program level by filling out the Progress Record for that award. The application should be put in the awards box at Roundtable or given to your Unit Commissioner to be reviewed by the district training committee for approval. You do not need to get a district signature before dropping off the form. The forms will be signed after a review is completed. All forms ask if training has been completed. We do review the training records. You can review your training records at www.my.scouting.org

and submit it to our Training Records, Roy DeLauder at eaglescout.roy@cox.net Usually one reason why training records are not showing up is because the individual has not linked their BSA Member Number to their my.scouting.org account. It is important that this is done so that we can show that our leaders are actually trained. Another error is not obtaining all the signatures required at the unit level. If the form asks for both the unit leader and the committee chairs signatures, then we need both signatures.
