

# Utah adults receiving public assistance (PA)




# Who are the IGP Adults?

- 65% are women
- 84% of the women are 34 years old or younger
- 75% are single (never married, divorced, separated, widowed)
- 86% have children

# Top 4 Job Sectors for IGP Women

- Administrative & Support & Waste Management (21%)
- Retail Trade (20%)
- Accommodation & Food Service (17%)
- Health Care and Social Assistance (11%)

# Top 4 Job Sectors for IGP Men


- Administrative & Support & Waste Management (27%)
- Retail Trade (13%)
- Accommodation & Food Service (11%)
- Construction (10%)

# What do we know about these job sectors?

- Low wages
- Non-traditional work hours
- Little or no benefits
- Part-time
- High turnover
