The <u>Paul R. Christen National High Adventure Base</u> at <u>Summit Bechtel Reserve</u> in Mount Hope, West Virginia is home of the National Jamboree and some of the best High Adventure activities Scouting has to offer.

Open to registered Scouts who are at least 13 years old by September 1 the year of attendance, Venturers and their registered leaders, the Paul R. Christen High Adventure Base within Summit offers 4 different seven-day programs between June and August each summer.

- An <u>introductory program</u> of 9 high adventure areas listed below
- Rafting on the New River
- <u>Pack N' Paddle</u> backpacking, rafting and local history
- Shooting rifles, shotguns, pistols and several archery activities
- Trail riding on ATVs

High adventure activities that challenge the hardiest Scouts and Venturers

The high adventure activities available at Summit include:

- World class zip lines, including ¾-mile Big Zip
- Canopy tours
- Climbing
- Skate parks
- BMX tracks and mountain bike trails
- Shooting ranges
- Whitewater rafting

Registration Information

Summit accepts both unit-based and provisional crews, as well as provisional individual registrations. Minimum and maximum crew size varies, depending on the program chosen. Additional options within crew registration allow great flexibility for individual program selection and electives.

Summit provides tents, cots and all program equipment for your trek. Breakfast and dinner are served in the Summit dining hall. Shelf-stable lunches are issued to participants for their daily programs.

Base program costs range from \$1,100 to \$1,700 per person, depending on the program. Travel is not included. A \$250 deposit is required per person at the time of registration.
