

National Census data provides Race/Ethnicity data about the entire state of Kansas


HMIS Data

Provides data about who has been through our homelessness system and their experience










CoC Distribution of Race





CoC Distribution of Ethnicity













Days homeless for all households connected to CoC

Days homeless for Veterans




Exits to Permanent Destinations







Exit destinations by race and ethnicity



Exit destinations by race and ethnicity for youth





Exit destinations by race and ethnicity for Veterans

What does all this mean?

Black and multi-racial households experience homelessness at higher rates than other groups.

Black households make up 14% of homeless households in the Balance of State CoC, while they make up 7.5% of Kansans. This is true for all households, youth, and veterans.

Across all CoC households, race and ethnicity does not seem to affect days spend homeless.

This is untrue in the subpopulations of youth and Veterans. Black, Native, and Indigenous youth remain homeless for longer than average. Native, Indigenous, and multi-racial Veterans remain homeless for longer than average.



What does all this mean?

Native, Indigenous, and multi-racial households exit to permanent destinations less often than other races.

This is true for youth households, however multi-racial Veterans exit to permanent destinations at similar rates to other races. However, Hispanic and Latino Veterans exit to permanent destinations less often than other households.

Black, Native, Indigenous, and multiracial households return to homelessness at higher rates than white households.
