



NCAC sent the below information to all NCAC Key 3 for all Units. It is important you read this NCAC announcement.



June 30, 2023

Your National Capital Area Council (NCAC) fulfills BSA's mission, "To prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Law."

NCAC works tirelessly to deliver a safe and high-quality Scouting program to our families in a cost-effective manner. Today it annually costs \$240.00 per youth to deliver this quality Scouting program.

In prior years, NCAC has subsidized 100% of this cost through corporate donations, major gifts, foundations, fundraising events, board donations, and our Family Friends of Scouting campaign. However, in recent years, the combination of a steady decline in participation in our Family Friends of Scouting and the volunteer and professional costs required to maintain this campaign has made it impractical to continue this model.

After an intensive 18-month strategic planning process, NCAC's volunteer Executive Board determined that our Scouts would be better served by a local Council Participation Fee that would provide consistent revenue and be more equitable to those who support our Scouts. Nationwide, we have seen many other local councils successfully transition to a similar fee, while achieving membership growth.

Beginning January 1, 2024, an annual Council Participation Fee of \$80.00 will be assessed to all youth participating in Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing, and Sea Scouts programs.

- For Scouts currently registered, the Council Participation Fee will be collected as part of your unit's next annual re-registration, often referred to as "rechartering."
- Families with three (3) or more Scouts will be capped at paying three (3) Participation Fees.
- Scouts participating in more than one program will pay one (1) Participation Fee.
- No youth will be turned away for an inability to pay the Participation Fee. NCAC has always
 provided financial assistance when needed and will continue to do so.






Chair's Chat

At least three (3) weeks' Prior to Unit's Join Scouting Night / Event:

At least two (2) weeks' Prior to Unit's Join Scouting Night / Event:

- Submitted Peer-to-Peer Cards Requests
- Requested Council Recruitment Banners (While resources are available)
- Requested Council Projectors (While resources are available)
- Requested Council Pop-Up Tents (While resources are available)

At least one (1) weeks' Prior to Unit's Join Scouting Night / Event



Please work with your District's leadership to arrange pick-up / drop-off for all the supplies requested from our Council's office. While the timeframes listed above are the minimum length of times needed to fulfill the requests, we strongly advise units to submit their requests as early as possible to ensure all requests made are completed within a timely manner.





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National BSA Annual Fees – Goes to BSA National

(NCAC Council Participation Fees announced on June 30)

Effective August 1, 2023, the BSA will implement the following national membership fees which were approved by the National Executive Committee:

- \$80 for Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing and Sea Scouting participants (\$5 increase)
- \$60 for all adult volunteers (\$15 increase to provide general liability insurance and enhanced background checks)
- \$25 one-time joining fee for new program participants in Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing, and Sea Scouting (Not prorated and no change in fee)
- \$30 for Scoutreach (Not prorated)
- \$25 for Merit Badge Counselors (New Fee applies only for Merit Badge Counselors not already registered as leaders)
- \$50 for Exploring participants Youth & Adult (\$5 increase)
- \$100 for a unit charter/affiliation fee (no change in fee)
- \$15 for Scout Life magazine

New Annual Membership Fee Process Announced – BSA Will No Longer Prorate Fees for New Members beginning August 1, 2023

- Beginning August 1, 2023, all new youth and adult members who join Scouting will be enrolled in a
 12-month membership cycle and BSA will cease prorating fees. Both youth and adults will pay the
 full annual membership fee and will renew their membership on the anniversary date of joining
 Scouting. All proration of membership fees will be eliminated. Each registered member of the BSA
 will receive an email notification with a registration renewal link beginning 60 days before the
 anniversary date they joined Scouting. Unit leaders will receive a copy of the email and should stay
 engaged in the membership renewal process just like rechartering.
- It is important to note, existing members will renew their membership during their normal registration/recharter cycle through March 2024. Moving forward all members will renew on their anniversary date.
- Existing members' Anniversary date will be their unit recharter month.
- New members' Anniversary date will be the month they joined.
- This new process will help streamline the rechartering and membership renewal process for units and councils. Additional information on this membership renewal process will be forthcoming in the very near future.

These are funds that go directly to NSA National – NONE of these fees go to NCAC.



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Cub Pack Updates from National

Coming soon: Cub Scout packs can camp up to two consecutive nights

Effective Sept. 1, 2023, Cub Scout packs who are conducting their own overnight camping activities may now camp up to two consecutive nights.

This is a change from the earlier policy on pack unit-coordinated camping, which was previously limited to single overnight experiences.

The updated policy also applies to Webelos and Arrow of Light dens, who can now conduct campouts for up to two consecutive nights.



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Unit Key-3 Training

Adult Leaders with direct contact with the Scotus (i.e. Cubmasters, Scoutmasters, etc.) are highly encouraged to become fully "trained". To be "Trained" requires mostly on-line training which is available at your convenience. There is one in=person course that is required for Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters – Introduction to Outdoor Leadership Skills (IOLS). Requirements are discussed below.

To be fully Trained for <u>Committee Chairman</u>, <u>Chartering Organization Representative</u>, and <u>New Member Coordinator</u> requires current Youth Protection Training (YPT) and completion of specific online courses found at My.Scouting.org. (YPT expires after 2 years. The other on-line training for these jobs does not expire.)

To be fully Trained for **Cubmaster**:

- Requires current Youth Protection Training (YPT).
- Completion of Cubmaster specific training course available on-line at My.Scouting.org. (This course is also available in-person at various places and on various dates around the Council.) This course does not expire.
- Completion of the Hazardous Weather Course. This course is only available on-line at My.Scouting.org. It expires after 2 years.

To be fully Trained for **Scoutmaster**:

- Requires current Youth Protection Training (YPT).
- Completion of Scoutmaster specific training course available on-line at My.Scouting.org. (This course is also available in-person at various places and on various dates around the Council.) This course does not expire.
- Completion of the Hazardous Weather Course. This course is only available on-line at My.Scouting.org. It expires after 2 years.
- Completion of Introduction to Outdoor Leadership Skills (IOLS). This course is an in-person class only. It requires an overnight camping experience. It is available at various places and on dates around the Council. It May be available at some summer camps. It does not expire.



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Unit Key-3 Training (cont.)

To be fully Trained for **Venturing Crew Advisor**:

•	Requires	current	Youth	Protectio	n Trair	ning ((YPT)).
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Don't wait until the last minute to schedule your training, get started on it today! On-line courses are at your convenience.

It wouldn't hurt to get your Assistant Scoutmasters and Assistant Cubmasters trained, as they will be required to be trained in 2024.







Back Country Outdoor Leader Skills (BCOLS)

Back Country Outdoor Leader Skills (BCOLS) is an optional course offered to adult leaders who have completed the required training in their Scouting program. This course assists Scouters working with youth in the backcountry by providing the skills necessary to conduct a safe and risk-managed high adventure program in venues outside those supported by BSA infrastructure. It has been continuously designed to address new and emerging issues, techniques, and gear.

BCOLS has three key goals:

Provide adult leaders with an understanding of safety and risk management issues in the back country environment. Expose adult leaders to interpersonal, small group dynamics, and leadership models consistent with National syllabi and curricula.

Familiarize adult leaders with the planning processes, skills, and equipment necessary to a successful back country adventure

BCOLS consists of two parts:

One day-long classroom session

Working Together — covers needs and characteristics of the age group; discusses group dynamics and the interpersonal skills needed to build and maintain a high-performance team.

Trek Planning and Preparation — covers the detailed preparation and planning that is necessary to a successful Trek and includes risk management, Leave No Trace principles, and discussion and displays of the personal and crew equipment used for Trekking, as well as other Trek tools.

Two-day weekend outdoor session provides a mix of skill presentations and hands-on practice. Activities include Leave No Trace camping skills, problem solving through initiative games, the use of bear bags/canisters, equipment maintenance, stove maintenance, water treatment, menu planning and trail cooking (and clean-up), terrain awareness, health and safety and personal hygiene issues, hands-on land navigation, and trail meditations.

Requirements for attending BCOLS:

Be registered members of the Boy Scouts of America and age 18 or older. Have completed the basic position-specific training courses for their Scouting role.

Be capable of functioning safely in an outdoor environment. All participants are required to complete the Annual Health and Medical Record. Parts A, B, and C are required which includes a physical.

Both Session Must be Attended to get credit for the Course.





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2023 Journey to Excellence – NEW INFO from BSA

Journey to Excellence is the Boy Scouts of America program to help Packs, Troops, Crews, Ships and Posts to plan, monitor and evaluate their performance and their ability to serve youth. There are specific criteria for the unit to plan and accomplish. These standards are reviewed each year and revised standards are published.

The 2023 Journey to Excellence Standards are now available.

Here are the major changes in the JTE scorecards for 2022.

- 1. The standards are written as activities that the unit will do. This is to emphasize that JTE is primarily a planning tool.
- 2. The Cub Scout scorecard has many changed standards. This is because of changes in the Cub Scout program.
- 3. For standard #10, Gold now includes recruiting a new leader. We have found that the best units continually recruit parents and other adults who have never been involved in Scouting.

There is no requirement, no expectation and, in fact, we might discourage a unit from believing that they should achieve Gold in all JTE criteria. A great unit is balanced in the service that it provides to youth. There is no shame and no problem if a unit achieves Silver or Bronze. That unit is serving youth. We regard the various colors as meaning:

Bronze – Effective Silver – Excellent Gold – Exceptional

The Cub Scout, Scouts BSA, Venturing, and Sea Scout programs all include outdoor stewardship, care for the environment, and Leave No Trace.

This Leave No Trace Trainer course is designed to enrich your understanding of Leave No Trace principles and practices, expand your repertoire of low-impact skills, and increase your effectiveness in teaching these important skills to others.

Course Description

- This course is for BSA members 14 and older who teach outdoor skills to others.
- Participants learn Leave No Trace awareness, principles, skills and ethics through a combination of presentation, discussion, and hands-on activities. They learn and practice techniques for teaching these concepts.
- Each participant will prepare and present a short (10-15 minute) lesson. Topic assignments will be given to participants before the course.
- At least 10 days before the required Saturday outdoor session--which will be held in Germantown, MD-students will be assigned approximately 6 hours of online self-study learning, which must be completed prior to the outdoor session. Students who do not complete the self-study portion will not be allowed to attend the outdoor session. Students must attend the entire Saturday in-person session.
- Preregistration is required and class size is limited, so register soon.
- The class will be held at Camp Snyder in Haymarket, VA. A suggested equipment list, driving directions, etc will be provided to participants before the course.

Scouting has embraced the Leave No Trace program as the core of our outdoor ethics. Every Troop, Crew and Pack should have at least one Leave No Trace Trainer. Within Scouting, this course is recommended for:

Troop Outdoor Ethics Guides and their adult mentors



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- Other Troop and Crew leaders youth & adults
- Cub Scout Pack adult leaders
- High Adventure crew leaders
- Summer camp and High Adventure Base staff, Camp Commissioners
- District training teams and other outdoor skills instructors
- "High end" course instructors (Wood Badge, National Youth Leadership Training, etc.)

Those completing the course will be Leave No Trace Trainers, recognized by Leave No Trace and the BSA. They will be prepared to:

- Understand, demonstrate, and teach minimum impact techniques to friends, family, scouting groups, and other community groups.
- Teach general Leave No Trace awareness workshops or other activities.
- Teach the BSA Leave No Trace 101 Awareness class, help others earn the Outdoor Ethics Awards, teach and check outdoor ethics advancement requirements, and lead related activities at scouting events.
- Lead discussions on outdoor ethics and help others explore their own personal outdoor ethic.
- Serve as an outdoor ethics resource in their community and scouting district.

All participants must be current registered members of the BSA. All adult participants must be current in their BSA Youth Protection Training.

This is an adult-level course. Youth participants must have the maturity to discuss and teach sensitive topics, such as feminine hygiene and proper disposal of various forms of human waste, to other youth and adults.


