Glide Revitalization is in a unique position. We operate as a non-profit that can obtain grant funding for a wide variety of programs and community based assistance. We also house Douglas County's Long-Term Recovery Group (LTRG). This is a committee of individuals that are governed by a Board of Directors and are fiscally sponsored by a 501(c)(3) organization. All funding that is allocated to this local group of individuals is provided specifically to wildfire impacted community members.

We also partner with many other non-profit organizations to maximize efforts. Often, cases are presented to many community business partners to ensure the client receives the most amount of assistance available to them.

Glide Helping Hands Firewood Program is in its 18th year and is intended to be an emergency wood bank for Helping Hands recipients. Approximately 20-30 cords of firewood is given out each year. Majority is gathered by volunteers who cut, split and haul to the wood yard, followed by FFA students who stack the wood into wood sheds. After logging operations on Archie Creek fire, there is an abundance of firewood log decks that are available at no cost. Glide Revitalization has partnered with Helping Hands to continue this effort by funding equipment for the volunteers to utilize as well as transporting roughly 50 cords of wood from Archie Fire properties to the wood bank.
