


Addressing Individuals


- ★ Titles: Mrs./Ms., Mr., Sir, Ma'am
- ★ Professions: actor/actress, chairman, steward/stewardess
- ★ Casual titles and/or Terms of Endearment: dude, girl/gurl/gorl, bro, lady, sis
- ★ Accidentally or Intentionally assuming someone's pronouns

Addressing Groups

- ★ Ladies and Gentlemen, or variations on the phrase
- ★ Guys
- ★ For the Good of All Mankind
- \star Brothers and Sisters
- ★ Professions: mailmen, salesmen, Congressmen

Gendering Everyday Items/Characteristics

- ★ Clothing: being categorized by gender rather than size/fit (sections - boy's/girl's, men's/women's)
- ★ Characteristics/tasks
 being attached to
 masculinity/femininity:
 Gossip (femme), Sports
 (masc), Power (masc),
 Being Emotional (femme)




Overt and Covert Oppression


Microaggression

A statement, action, or incident that delivers indirect, subtle, or unintentional discrimination against members of a marginalized group.

* Microaggressions have a macro affect. Regardless of the name, discrimination is still discrimination.

What important context! Where do I start the work?


Good news, you already started it! Spoiler alert, it's a never-ending cycle of learning and unlearning.

- Self-Reflect on our current habits:
 - Recognizing folks outside of the binary
 - Normalize asking/stating pronouns
 - Familiarizing ourselves with more terms to explain/describe gender
- Become comfortable with change:
 - What is true for us may not be the same in the future
 - What is true for ourselves may not be true for others

Uninclusive wording

English: dude, girl/gurl/gorl, guys, ladies, mom, dad, sister, brother, niece, nephew

Spanish: "-o, -os, -a, -as," Latino/a, amigo/a, "a todos," el/la, hermano/a, esposo/a, madre, padre, "Estoy cansado/a"

*Avoid gendering objects altogether

Let's try these instead!

English: Mx., friend, sibling, nibling, person, everyone, friends, icons, scholars, my community, people, folks, y'all, loved ones, parent

Spanish: "-e/es, -x, -i/is, -@, -u/us," Latinx, amigue, les/lues, espose, abuel@, niñx, hermane, les padres, "Estoy cansadx"

English Pronouns*

They/them/their

Ey/em/eir

Xe/xem/xers

Zhe or Ze/hir/hirs

Fae/Faer Faers


