It is a fun, energetic and inspiring course guaranteed to infuse your unit with fun and meaning – all designed to fulfill the mission of the BSA, and ensure our youth is getting everything they are promised from the program.

Reflecting the best of nearly a century of Scouting experience, Wood Badge draws upon the most current leadership models used by corporate America, academic circles and successful organizations throughout the country. Participants can expect to develop skills in many areas, including leadership theory, team building, problem-solving, communication, project planning and more. These skills can be taken back to packs, troops, crews and ships to help leaders guide youth in dynamic Scouting programs. Scouters will find these skills invaluable in their business and personal lives as well.

Wood Badge consists of two parts: The first five full days is the initial group training, usually held over two weekends – the first weekend Friday through Sunday, and the second Saturday and Sunday (**Both weekends must be attended**).

The second part requires participants to apply the skills they learned by completing a 5-part plan (called a "ticket") over the following 18 months, leading towards the individual participant's vision of a better Scouting future.

Requirements for attending Wood Badge:

- 1. Be registered members of the Boy Scouts of America and age 18 or older.
- 2. Have completed the basic position-specific training courses for their Scouting role.

3. Be capable of functioning safely in an outdoor environment. All participants are required to complete the Annual Health and Medical Record. Parts A, B, and C are required which includes a physical. Part C is required for everyone, including people who are not present for more than 72 hours.

You are invited to register for Emergency Care and Safety Institute (<u>ECSI</u>) First Aid, Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR – Adult, Child, and Infant) and Automated External Defibrillator (AED) training on Saturday November 9, 2024. NYLT is for Scouts who are likely to take on leadership positions in their Troop, Crew, Ship or home unit.

NYLT is an intense course for mature Scouts who want to become better leaders. Scouts must be respectful of each other and their actions must be consistent with the Scout Oath and Law.

2024-2025 OFFERINGS BACK COUNTRY OUTDOOR LEADER SKILLS

DON'T BE THIS GUY



This course was developed by a group of Scouters in 1993; it has been continually updated to meet current techniques and technology. This course is designed to support the older youth programs of the BSA. It is aimed at all adults working with older youth regardless of program (Boy Scouting, Venturing, or Exploring). Cub Scout Leaders or people without camping experience SHOULD NOT training this training. All participants MUST complete Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills, as well as the position-specific training for their program area prior to attending this course. All participants must be able to meet current physical requirements of the BSA Annual Health & Medical Record.

The target audience is adult leaders planning High Adventure treks at backcountry venues not supported by BSA infrastructure; however, units planning to attend High Adventure bases supported by BSA will find this course useful, because unit shakedowns will, most likely, take place in venues not supported by BSA infrastructure. If you are participating in an NCAC-sponsored High Adventure Trek, you must also take the course offered by the NCAC High Adventure Committee.

Youth participants (16 and up) will be admitted on an individual basis and requires the nomination by the unit leader. Youth must have completed unit leadership training (Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops or Crews, etc.) as well as National Youth Leadership Training.

Back Country Outdoor Leader Skills is offered by the Council Training Committee as an optional follow-on to the basic course, Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills. Its goal is to provide adult leaders with an overview of such topics as:

 Trek Planning Leadership Skills Team Development Leave No Trace Water Treatment
Stove Maintenance Risk Management Equipment Maintenance Crew Equipment Needs & Selection
Personal Equipment Needs & Selection • Terrain Awareness & Land Navigation • Menu Planning & Clean-up •
 Hygiene & Health ● On the Trail Tips ● Wilderness First Aid Overview

Part 1 — Addresses ways to effectively work with older youth and covers the detailed preparation and planning that must be done before you go out, including risk management. Summarizes the personal and crew equipment used for lightweight camping. Plans are also made for the weekend overnight session. (Part 1 is the EXPLAIN & DEMONSTRATE part of EDGE.)

Part 2 — Participants will practice core leader skills for the outdoor program — Leave No Trace, navigation (map & compass plus GPS), terrain awareness, expedition menu planning and food preparation, stove and stove maintenance, wilderness first aid issues, expedition health and hygiene, team building. (Part 2 is the GUIDE part of EDGE.)

<u>Part 3</u> — While not required, we strongly suggest participation in the Hikeoree which will allow BCOLS trained leaders to apply the BCOLS training with their youth at a real-world event. (Part 3 is the ENABLE part of EDGE.)

Current Merit Badge Counselors and Guidelines:

The current roster of merit badge counselors is provided periodically to the Scoutmaster of each troop. If a scout needs information about a specific merit badge, the scout can contact their troop leadership or the Wolf Trap Merit Badge Dean (note emails should include two adults - no one-on-one contact for electronic media).

To become a Merit Badge Counselor:

You can apply online <u>here</u> (note, please ensure you have a current YPT before filling out application). When you are done with the application, send the MB Dean your list of MBs using the <u>Merit Badge Counselor Information Sheet</u>.

Additional Self-Pay Membership Renewal Notes

How unit coordinators can prepare

- Valid Emails Key 3 (or delegate) should check the unit roster (<u>https://my.scouting.org</u>, login, Menu, select unit, Roster, export roster) to ensure all registered adults and leaders have valid email addresses.
- 2. Whitelisting Recommend parents/registered adults whitelisting "@scouting.org" or check their Junk/SPAM folders periodically for renewal messages
- 3. **My.Scouting.Org Accounts** Ensuring all parents have a my.scouting.org account. If not, they can create one at <u>https://my.scouting.org</u>, Create Account. It should ask for the BSA ID of their youth. If not, let Rus/Liz know and we can establish the parent/guardian relationship.

4. Review Reports

- a. **Monthly reports** Reports will be emailed to Unit Key 3 (CM/SM, CC, COR) for those whose registration is expiring within the next sixty (60) days.
- b. Generate Reports (as needed) The Unit Key 3 can generate report from Organizational Manager (<u>https://my.scouting.org</u>, login, Menu, Organizational Manager, Reports – you can adjust the date ranges as needed.)
 - i. Member Opt-Out Report those that have selected not to receive renewal emails
 - ii. Members Due to Renew those members due to renew within two months or who are lapsed
 - iii. Members who have renewed all youth and adult who have renewed this year.
- 5. **Youth Applications** Decide if the unit wants to automatically renew Youth Applications. This will reduce your approval workload.
- 6. **Review Training slides** Training slides Sent to Key 3 in messages this week <u>https://3.basecamp.com/3958009/p/oMhAuAPUnrjbV9G87e3cUM6Q/vault/7708793900</u>




