# 1-A Brief History of the OIV

The OIV was created in 1924 by height member states as a response to the international viticulture crisis.

The OIV is a technical and scientific intergovernmental organisation which operates under a renewed agreement, signed in 2001.

#### ARRANGEMENT

#### PORTANT CRÉATION, À PARIS, D'UN OFFICE INTERNATIONAL

#### DU VIN.

Les Gouvernements de FAETRICHE, du CHILI, de l'ESPAGNE, de la FRANCE, de la GRÈCE, de la HONGRIE, de LITTALIE, du LUXEM-BOURG, du MENIQUE et du PORTUGALI, ayant juge utile d'organiser un Office international du Vin, ont résolu de conclure un Arrangement à cet effet et sont convenus de ce qui suit :

#### ARTICLE PREMIER.


Il est institué un Office international du Vin ayant son siège à Paris et qui est chargé de :

a. Réunir étudier et publier les renseignements de nature à démontrer les effets bienfaisants du vin ;

b. Tracer un programme indicatif des expériences scientifiques nouvelles qu'il conviendrait d'entreprendre pour mettre en évidence les qualités hygiéniques du vin et son influence en tant qu'agent de lutte contre l'alcoolisme;

c. Indiquer aux Gouvernements adhérents les mesures propres à assurer la protection des intérêts viticoles et l'amélioration des conditions du marché international du vin, après avoir recueilli toutes les informations nécessaires, telles que : veux, avis exprimés par les académies, corps savants, congrès internationaux ou autres congrès de la production et du commerce du vin;

d. Signaler aux Gouvernements les conventions internationales auxquelles il y aurait intérêt à adhèrer, telles que celles tendant : 1° à assurer un mode uniforme de présentation des résultats d'analyse des vins; 2° à poursuivre une étude comparative des méthodes d'analyse employées par les divers États, en vue d'établir des tables de concordance;

# The global reference for vine and wine

The aim of the OIV to be the authoritative international reference body within its field of competence.

The OIV's mandate is scientific and technical. Its works draw upon the physical and biological sciences as well as social sciences, law and economics.

Across all of its works, the OIV seeks to establish common points of reference, agreed by all member states, to support the development of the vine and wine sector.






## 3-The mission of the OIV

**Information:** to inform its members of measures whereby the concerns of producers, consumers and other players in the vine and wine products sector may be taken into consideration

**Cooperation:** to assist other international organisations, both intergovernmental and nongovernmental, especially those which carry out standardisation activities

Harmonisation: to contribute to international harmonisation of existing practices and standards and, as necessary, to the preparation of new international standards in order to improve the conditions for producing and marketing vine and wine products, and to help ensure that the interests of consumers are taken into account






## 4-Members states of the OIV

The OIV is currently comprised of 50 member states across five Continents who have recognised, through membership in the OIV, the importance of collaboration and harmonisation in the vitivinicultural sector.

- 75% world's vineyard area
- 88% of global production
- 71% of the consumption of wine in the world

International collaboration provided through the OIV is increasingly important as more than two out of five bottles consumed in the world are imported.





## 5-Observers to the OIV










## 1-Standards for the Vitivinicultural Sector

- The principal function of the OIV is the creation of internationally harmonised and accepted standards for the production of vitivincultural products. These standards cover the entire production process and product lifespan, from the plantation of vines to the labelling of final containers.
- This work provides consistent international production standards for products of viticultural origin to ensure their international acceptance.
- Standards are adopted by consensus by OIV member states.
- These documents are not binding legal documents but rather, an agreed upon set of international norms to which member states adhere to. The resolutions serve as a reference point for individual governing bodies to build the legal framework within their unique states.

## 1-Standards for the Vitivinicultural Sector

### STANDARDS FOR VITICULTURAL AND OENOLOGICAL PRACTICES

Standards, definitions, and guidelines regarding viticultural practices with focuses on the identification and protection of vines.

Standards of oenological (winemaking) practices for the production of products of viticultural origin.

### WINEMAKING PRODUCT INFORMATION

Specifications of the main products used in the making and the aging of wines.

### METHODS OF ANALYSIS

Accepted analytical methods for grapes, musts, wines, vinegars, and distilled products.

### INNOVATION THROUGH RESEARCH IN VITIVINICULTURE

The OIV strives to work with its international network of experts to contribute to innovation and advances in the vitivinicultural sector. Within this framework, the OIV has placed emphasis on certain subjects which are considered to be at the forefront of the sector for the foreseeable future.

### SUSTAINABILITY OF VITICULTURAL PRODUCTION

The OIV undertakes research on all aspects of sustainability – environmental, economic, social and cultural.

## 2-Research and Publication

## 2-Research and Publication

Within the framework of developing its Strategic Plan, the OIV grants research scholarships in priority programme fields on a yearly basis.

Grants offered within the framework of this programme are either 3-year or shortterm research grants (six to fifteen months at most) and are provided for specific post graduate training programmes.

### Statistics

The OIV is responsible for the collection and dissemination of a variety of statistical data on all main products derived from the vines, including wine, table grapes and dried grapes. The organization provides free and unrestricted access to its database and data visualization tools. Through these products, the OIV works to ensure that high-quality and internationally comparable data are produced and made accessible to all countries, thus contributing to building a comprehensive knowledge base on the vine and wine sector.

## OIV Master of Science in Wine Management

Contrary to generally single discipline multiple sector managerial specializations, the international OIV diploma is unique, examining the sector's many facets throughout the curriculum. This program is therefore open exclusively to future managers and decision makers in the wine sector. 

# 2-The OIV Decision Making Process

Consensus and Step by Step Procedure

- Consensus is the normal method whereby the General Assembly adopts draft resolutions of a general, scientific, technical, economic or legal nature.
- The process for collaboration and consensus required for a resolution to be accepted can be described using a system or progression of steps.
- Opportunities for member states to provide input on OIV resolutions under discussion are underlined with an explanation of the timeline for participation.


