Clallam County EcoCounters	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Working to understand and develop a repair/replacement plan for Clallam/WashDOT counters. • The last reported data from the counter at Dungeness River Nature center is 1 March. That counter may have ceased to function until the system battery is replaced and the unit recalibrated by EcoVisio. • Jefferson County EcoCounter is installed and appears to be working correctly. Total users 3838, average 320/day, highest recorded 657 (Tuesday, 26Mar). Will be working with Merrily to get the report pattern formalized
