#### SCOUTING FOR FOOD

This is an annual event where scouting units from across the NCAC, including the Patriot district, collect food for those in need. The food the Patriot District collects goes directly to the Capital Area Food Bank for distribution to various other food banks and pantries. Historically we have faithfully filled three huge trucks with the food we collect. Our drop off point is the Safeway at the Burke Centre Parkway. We will be there from 9 AM to 2 PM on Sat Nov 9<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Important Dates:**

October 15<sup>th</sup>: At roundtable, we will have the SFF bags for unit representatives to pick up for distribution in their areas. *It is imperative that a representative from every unit attend this Roundtable*. At Roundtable you will receive your bags and be assigned an area to cover. Please ask your scout parents if they have seen SFF bags in their neighborhoods in previous years. Every empty door is a missed opportunity. Please let us know on Oct 12<sup>th</sup> of any neighborhoods that have been inadvertently missed in recent years.

**November 7th:** Units distribute the bags to their designated neighborhoods, beginning no earlier than 9 AM.. With a knock and a call out of "Scouting For Food", a scout leaves the bag on the door with the hopes of finding a bag of food next week. If you run out of bags, you may also tie a note to the door as a reminder of the date for SFF pick up. You may also call Miklos Kiss to see if there are any extra bags left over.

**November 14<sup>th</sup>:** Scouts begin picking up the food at 9 AM and deliver the bags to the Safeway located at Burke Center Parkway Shopping Center. We do not take glass jars- please leave them behind if possible. We will ask each unit to stop by the **SFF table** to identify the unit dropping off and give a bag count. Each bag we estimate as approximately 5 lbs. OA Scouts will diligently be waiting to assist, often with the help of a crew from GMU, and some very reliable dedicated adults.

**Volunteers Needed:** On November 14<sup>th</sup>, we need volunteers to collect and sort the food, direct traffic, and many other duties that are much appreciated. Our volunteers sign in at the SFF table where they can have service hours validated. If you are an OA member and plan to attend the event, please try to bring an orange or yellow safety vest to wear over your official BSA OA uniform. If it is cold, please dress accordingly. We will provide hydration and nutrition. Please contact Miklos Kiss or Rob Cain if you or your unit can help at the collection point on November 14<sup>th</sup>. Thank You.

#### From the Commissioner

Welcome back to School Days.

As you know, Scouting happens at the unit level. In fact, the friendship, fun, and learning actually happen in the den, patrol, team, and crew. As Baden-Powell, Scouting's founder said, "The patrol system is not one method in which Scouting for boys can be carried on. It is the only method." The unit such as the pack or troop provides the cohesion of leadership, planning, resources, and recognition that allow the den or patrol to focus on fun and learning.

Patriot District and the Council exist to support the unit. In fact the Commissioners Corps, which preceded the professionals, have the specific mission to support units. The Commissioners try to maintain regular contact with unit leaders. We're trying to build relationships and to understand what units need. Commissioners identify units' needs and report them to the District Committee as part of our Units Service Plan. The Committee then can develop or devote resources to meeting those needs. For example, units may need help with recruiting, retention or with training. If that is the case with your unit, talk to your Commissioner. We may be able to help and allow you to stay focused on delivering a fun learning experience that will grow our youth.

Charter Renewal season is upon us. Now is the time to complete a membership inventory. Compare your roster to the people listed in my.Scouting Member Manager. If someone is not in my.Scouting, submit their application now. Ask adults to retake YPT if it will expire before 31 March. Renewal packages will be sent to your Committee Chair this month. Please let your Commissioner know when you receive the package and tell your Commissioner who will process the package. The window for Internet Rechartering will open on 1 October. The deadline for completed packages to be given to your Commissioner by 8 November.

Charter Renewal processors, Committee Chairs, and Unit Leaders should attend Recharter training at 7:00 prior to the 10 September Roundtable to get the latest updates on changes to the process.

#### **Patriot District Fall Camporee**

October 16 – 18, 2015 Verdun – Adventure Bound

As of July 30, 2015

The themes for the Patriot District Fall Camporee are Marksmanship and Outdoor Adventure. Scouts, venturers and webelos will have numerous choices to challenge themselves and have fun. The marksmanship events will include; air rifle shooting, an air rifle decathlon, archery, ax throwing, knife throwing and sling shot shooting. Additionally, we will conduct black powder shooting and shotgun/skeet shooting. The outdoor adventure events are fishing, rock wall climbing and dodge ball. The camporee will conduct an extended program on Sunday until 2 PM for units that arrive late Saturday night or Sunday morning. Also, units that want to remain can enjoy extra activities on Sunday.

Verdun has an outstanding high ropes challenge course. The events are exciting, unique and spread throughout the trees and fields. The high challenge course includes a traverse *slide–for-life* that carries a scout over 1000 feet through the forest and over a valley. Most events in the high ropes course take place 30 feet in the air using specially constructed apparatus. Venture crews and older scouts in the eighth grade or higher are encouraged to sign up for the High Ropes course. There will be an additional charge for ventures and scouts taking the challenge course.

The fall camporee will feature two other unique programs. The first is the Journalism merit badge. Scouts will not only learn about traditional journalism but will complete several media/IT requirements. All scouts taking the Journalism merit badge will be accredited to the camporee Press Corps and issued a red hat identifying them as members of the press. The eminent business owner, Rich Harrington, is the merit badge counselor. The second program is a STEM mathematical exercise. Scouts will discover "Root", "Square Root" and "Pi" just as the ancient Egyptians and Greeks did. Donald Katze, a US Merchant Marine Academy graduate, mechanical engineer and noted mathematician will guide our scouts through the discovery process. Scouts need a basic understanding of algebra and geometry to follow this course. A scout that has completed Fairfax County's School Mathematics 7<sup>th</sup> grade course with a "B" or better or is taking high school algebra can take this program. For several thousand years students have just memorized these concepts, but during this camporee, scouts have the opportunity to re-discover critical mathematics.

Out of Patriot District units are invited to the camporee if they want to take the high ropes challenge course or participate in the Journalism merit badge or Saturday STEM mathematical program.

The camporee will have the traditional events that bring us together as a district; Opening and Closing ceremonies, Senior Patrol Leader/Scoutmaster Cracker Barrel, outdoor church services, a Saturday night campfire, and the Order of the Arrow Brotherhood Walk.

The camporee will be held from Friday night, October 16 till Sunday October 18, 2015 at Verdun – Adventure Bound, 17044 Adventure Bound Trail, Rixeyville, Virginia 22737, telephone (540) 937-4920. The cost is twenty-five dollars (\$25) per scout, venturer, weblelo, or adult. There is an additional charge of thirty-five (\$35) for scouts or venture taking the high challenge course. The charge for scouts that are just taking the Saturday STEM mathematical program and are not camping is ten dollars (\$10). There is no charge for adults that are just helping out on Saturday or Sunday and are not camping for the weekend.

It is important that units notify Joe Casey by e-mail or phone by **September 18, 2013** that they plan to attend the camporee. His e-mail is jmccasey@verizon.net and his phone number is (703) 455-9050. Joe Casey will answer every e-mail. Units need to notify Joe of the approximate number of participants. **Troops/Units must notify Joe of the number of Challenge course participants so that facilitators can be hired.** Final camporee registration and payment will take place Friday evening on-site as units arrive.

Troops are requested to volunteer to provide the Camporee Senior Patrol Leader and the Flag Detail for the Opening and Closing ceremonies. The Camporee Senior Patrol Leader is responsible for conducting the Camporee Opening and Closing ceremonies and acting as Master of Ceremonies for the Saturday night

campfire. This is a great opportunity for a senior scout to display his leadership abilities. Also, the camporee is looking for at least two scout buglers or trumpet players. As always, the camporee staff is in need of adult volunteers to support the different events. Patriot District will not conduct an **Introduction to Outdoors Leader Skills (IOLS)** training course at the camporee. 

#### **Scout Leader Training**

SMPST and IOLS Scoutmaster Position-Specific Training and Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills November 13-15, 2015 Camp Big Mac, Markham, VA



The Patriot District's Scout Leader Training will include two courses: Scoutmaster Position-Specific Training (SMPST) and Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS). The training starts Saturday Morning and ends Sunday afternoon, 14-15 Nov 2015. Participants need to register for the course by sending the registration fee and the information requested below. The fee is \$55.00 per participant for SMPST only, and \$45.00 for IOLS only). The fee covers camping at Big Mac, course supplies and meals for participants. IOLS attendees will camp as a troop in patrols. Attendees taking only SMPST will not camp.

The two training courses are required to qualify as "fully trained" Boy Scout leaders. Completing these courses satisfies a **prerequisite** for attending the top training for Scout leaders, **Wood Badge.** This is a great training opportunity for Venturing Advisors, 2nd Year Webelos Leaders, Troop Committee members and others who desire to improve their ability to help run <u>Boy Scout Troops</u> and <u>learn basic outdoor skills</u>.

Participants will learn about the Scout Program, and will practice hands-on skills like first aid, camp set-up, cooking, woods tools, knots and lashing, campfire programs, map & compass skills, hiking & packing, leaf identification, leave-no-trace. Most importantly, participants will learn how the boy led troop and the patrol method work in the outdoor program - necessary outdoor leadership skills in a Boy Scout troop. The goal is that participants will know about the basic Boy Scout outdoor skills needed to fulfill rank requirements through First Class.

#### **New Boy Scout Requirements**

A new set of Boy Scout requirements will become effective on January 1st, 2016.

- Boys joining on or after Jan. 1, 2016 MUST use the new requirements.
- Boys who have joined prior to Jan. 1, 2016:
- Who are working on the Scout badge MAY continue to work on the existing requirements, but MUST convert to the new requirements upon completion of the Scout badge.
- Who are working on Tenderfoot through First Class MAY continue to work on the existing requirements, but MUST convert to the new requirements upon attaining First Class.
- Who have completed First Class MAY complete the rank they are currently working on in the existing requirements, but then MUST convert to the new requirements for subsequent ranks.



#### **Leave No Trace Trainer Course – BSA Outdoor Ethics**

What is the purpose of this class? The Cub Scout, Boy Scout, Varsity Scout, Venturing, and Sea Scout programs all include outdoor stewardship, care for the environment, and Leave No Trace as part of their programs. This course is offered to train adults and youth aged 14+ to serve their units and districts as Leave No Trace Trainers and as Outdoor Ethics Trainers. Every Cub Scout, Boy Scout, Varsity Scout, Venturing, and Sea Scout unit should have *at least* one Leave No Trace/Outdoor Ethics Trainer. A Boy Scout must complete this course before he can serve in the Troop Leave No Trace Trainer position.

**Who should attend?** Venturers, Sea Scouts, Varsity Scouts, and Boy Scouts aged 14+; adult Cub Scout, Boy Scout, Varsity, Venturing, and Sea Scout leaders; and District and Council leaders and trainers.

What will I learn? This course is designed to enhance your understanding of Leave No Trace practices and outdoor ethics, and to increase your level of expertise and confidence in teaching Leave No Trace skills. This class is both active and highly interactive. You will be introduced to concepts and methods that will advance your knowledge of Leave No Trace issues in both developed and high adventure environments, expand your repertoire of low-impact skills, and increase your effectiveness in teaching these important skills to others.

On completion of this course, participants will be registered as Leave No Trace Trainers with the Leave No Trace Center for Outdoor Ethics and with the BSA. Students will receive Leave No Trace teaching materials, a certificate of course completion, a Leave No Trace Trainer lapel pin, and a BSA Leave No Trace Trainer card.

This course is instructed by nationally designated Leave No Trace Master Educators and Trainers. Attendance for the entire duration of the training is required.

The significant changes from the 2013 version are described on pages 7 to 9. Among these are incorporation of the recent changes to the Cub Scout and Venturing Programs. Several changes to the Merit Badge Program are described in Section 7, including encouragement for small-scale approaches to merit badge counseling, management of the merit badge counselor process, and a cultural shift to partial completions being acceptable for merit badge instructional events. Section 8 on Boards of Review provides from video-conferencing when necessary and guidance on Venturing Boards of Review – to include Board membership and the need for NCAC verification of the Summit Award application form prior to the Board. Section 9 on the Eagle Scout Rank emphasizes the need to use the Eagle Scout Rank Application form, clarifies fundraising – to include provision for "crowdfunding," and added guidelines on disputed circumstances.




