

Program Overview

State licensure signifies a level of professional competency and is an important way to achieve greater career and business success. The ASLA Fund is continuing the Women of Color Licensure Advancement Program to support women of color in their pursuit of landscape architecture licensure and increase racial and gender diversity within the profession.

In its third year, the program will provide 10 women of color with a two-year, personalized experience that includes up to \$3,500 to cover the cost of sections of the Landscape Architectural Registration Exam (LARE), along with exam preparation courses, resources, and mentorship from a licensed landscape architect.


A big thank you to the Arboretum Society for the yummy snacks and space in the Ranch House and to the OLD Stone House Nursery for the raffle prize.

DESERT OASIS Innovative Ways to Create More Public Spaces in Las Vegas



n our latest joint event with the Placemaking Committee (AIA Las Vegas), we chose to focus on the forgotten spaces left behind from our Valley's sprawl. Each of our presenters provided their processes at four different scales, respectively, and how they implement the approach. From high level analysis and planning to boots on the ground community involvement, our presenters explained the challenges they faced and rewards they gained. They also presented the strategies they took to develop initiatives to fund and program these "new" places in the communities they have revitalized.

All of our presenters spoke about context and the community's influence on and near their projects' site. Whether their project site was an infill project or a brand new build, each case study proposed new amendments to the existing codes or regulations. These initiatives, between community leaders and city officials, created avenues for funding to support the projects.

Temporary art installation projects that were flexible in design allowed for community partners and families to get involved. It allowed them a place to showcase their community pride. In some of the photos of the projects, this colorful art, extended beyond the project site and spilled into the streets. It even became a strategy to slow traffic down!

Perhaps, we can learn and implement these strategies in our Valley very soon. We have the know-how and connections to make these types of projects transform our communities. Let us promote new initiatives to revitalize our neighborhoods because we should not let them be forgotten. Let us shift the focus back to them and give them back an identity.
