Spring 2015 Camporee

New Market Battlefield New Market, Virginia April 17 – 19, 2015



As of March 1, 2015

The following troops and crews from Patriot District have registered for the New Market Battlefield Spring 2015 Camporee; Troops 50, 114, 1131, 1346, 1347, 1412, 1524, 1525, 1533, 1535, 1818, 1865, 1966, and crews 114 and 698. Units registered online at http://www.ncacbsa.org/event/newmarket. If there are any additions or subtractions to this list contact Joe Casey at jmccasey@verizon.net. He will answer every e-mail and his phone number is (703) 455-9050. Units need to pay for the camporee online. Instructions will be provided this week. The cost of the camporee is twenty dollars (\$20) per participant that are camping. There is no charge for people that are just visiting for a day. Staff members and OA members that are paying with the headquarters need to pay Joe Casey or Bill Dexter by March 24, 2015 since the headquarters must pay as a unit. Headquarter staff members make checks out to NCAC for twenty dollars.

Troops also need to decide if they want to participate as Union or Confederate units. Troops can split their scouts with part of the unit participating on both sides. Units desiring to order from the Virginia Museum of the Civil War Store at New Market Battlefield must place their order immediately. The museum on the battlefield sells many items that can enhance scouts understanding of the battle and the Civil War. The staff is prepared to support troops/units for the camporee. We recommend Troops pre-order items for use at the camporee. The museum store can ship them to your home address or have them available for pick up upon your arrival. The store has several hundred items for sale to include four that pertain directly to the camporee. They are Confederate and Union Kepi military hats and two books. The store stocks two books directly supporting the battle and the Bushong farm. Valley Thunder, the Battle of New Market and the Opening of the Shenandoah Valley Campaign, May 1864, written by Charles R. Knight, is considered the best account of the battle - its ISBN is 978-1-932714-80-7. Mother Bushong's Sponge Cake and other 19th Century Recipes from the Bushong Family and Farm authored by Stacey R. Nadeau contains several recipes cooked on the farm that can also be prepared by scouts over a gas camp stove or in a Dutch oven. Its ISBN is 978-0-615-96166-8. Both books will support a strong understanding of the battle and the farm it was fought on. The POC at the store is Tammy M. Oden. Her address is Virginia Museum of the Civil War, 8895 George Collins Drive, PO Box 1864, New Market Virginia 22844. Prices for the kepis are cotton – one size fits all, \$5.95 and for wool with different sizes, \$10.50. The price for the book, *Thunder Valley*, is \$29.95. A limited number of copies signed by the author are available at no extra charge. The price for the cook book is \$14.95 and copies signed by the author are available.

The camporee will be held on the New Market Battlefield in New Market, Virginia on April 17 – 19, 2015. Join 2,000 scouts and scouters as we re-enact the Civil War battle of New Market, Virginia. Scouts will be the participants in the re-enactment of the battle, participating as either Union or Confederate soldiers. The camporee director is William T. 
