The MOC FIRST Steps Together site recently held a graduation event for 14 participants who completed a 14-week Sober Parenting Journey curriculum. The group was co-facilitated by Family Recovery Support Specialist Alvina Duffy and clinician Maria Rader. Additional FIRST Steps Together staff supported the group with child care, transportation logistics and creating special certificates and letters of appreciation for all of the group members. **Graduates shared that some of their most meaningful recovery work to date had been done as a part of this supportive group setting.** MOC plans to hold an 8-week drop in group this fall to extend the opportunity for participants to get together and maintain the beneficial recovery and parenting community that was created. Local businesses provided food for the sessions and for the final celebration. AUGUST IS NATIONAL BREASTFEEDING MONTH!

BREASTFEEDING ON MAT

According to the SAMHSA's <u>Methadone Treatment for</u> <u>Pregnant Women</u>, "For women who are not **HIV-positive and who are on methadone, breastfeeding is the best option.** Women who are Hepatitis C-positive usually are able to breastfeed but should check with a doctor first. The benefits of breastfeeding often outweigh the effect of the tiny amount of methadone that enters the breast milk. Though breastfeeding generally is recommended, you should still discuss it with your doctor."
