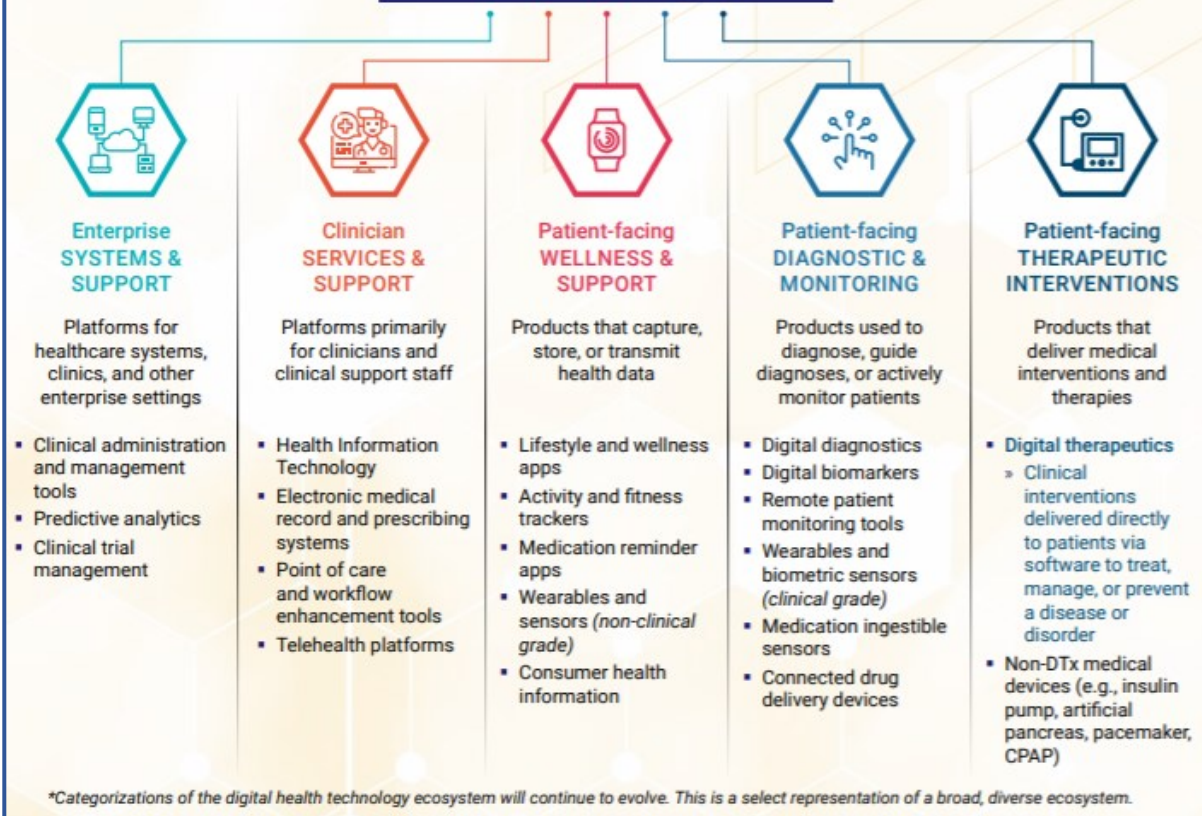

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V1C

Virtual first care (V1C) is medical care for individuals or a community accessed through digital interactions where possible, guided by a clinician, and integrated into a person's everyday life.

The ability to **initiate care from anywhere at any time** through telecommunication and digital technologies

Intentional selection of the care setting matched to a person's **clinical needs** and **preferences**, with some aspects safely and effectively delivered virtually, and others necessitating in-person care

Complete solutions that support a person to take all of the **necessary next steps** in their health journey

Adherence to all applicable laws that apply to healthcare providers, including best practices on **standards of care**, individual **safety, security, privacy** and **data rights**



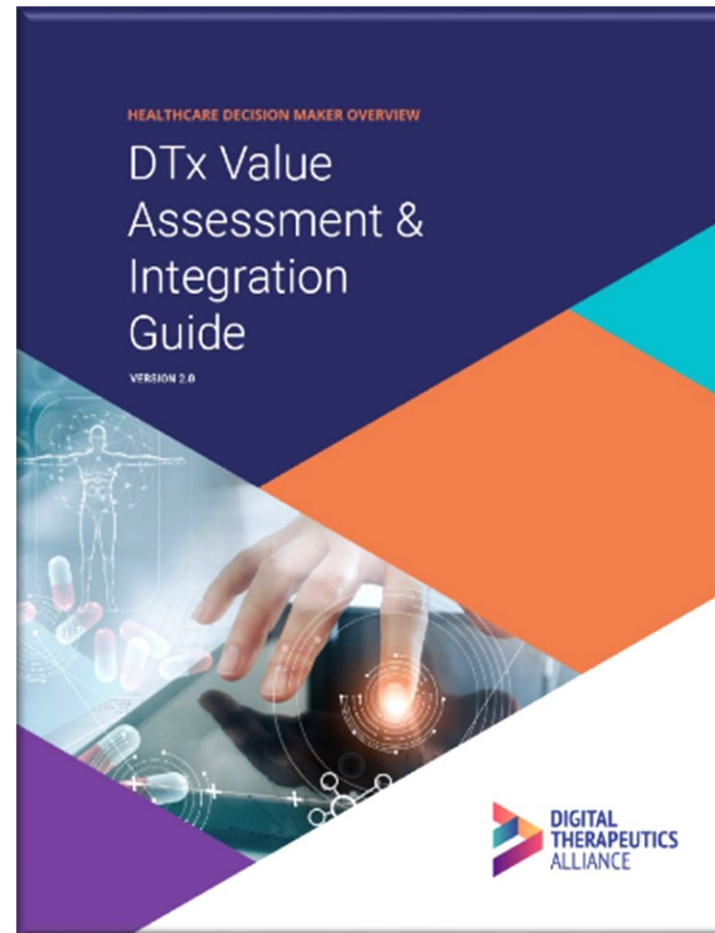

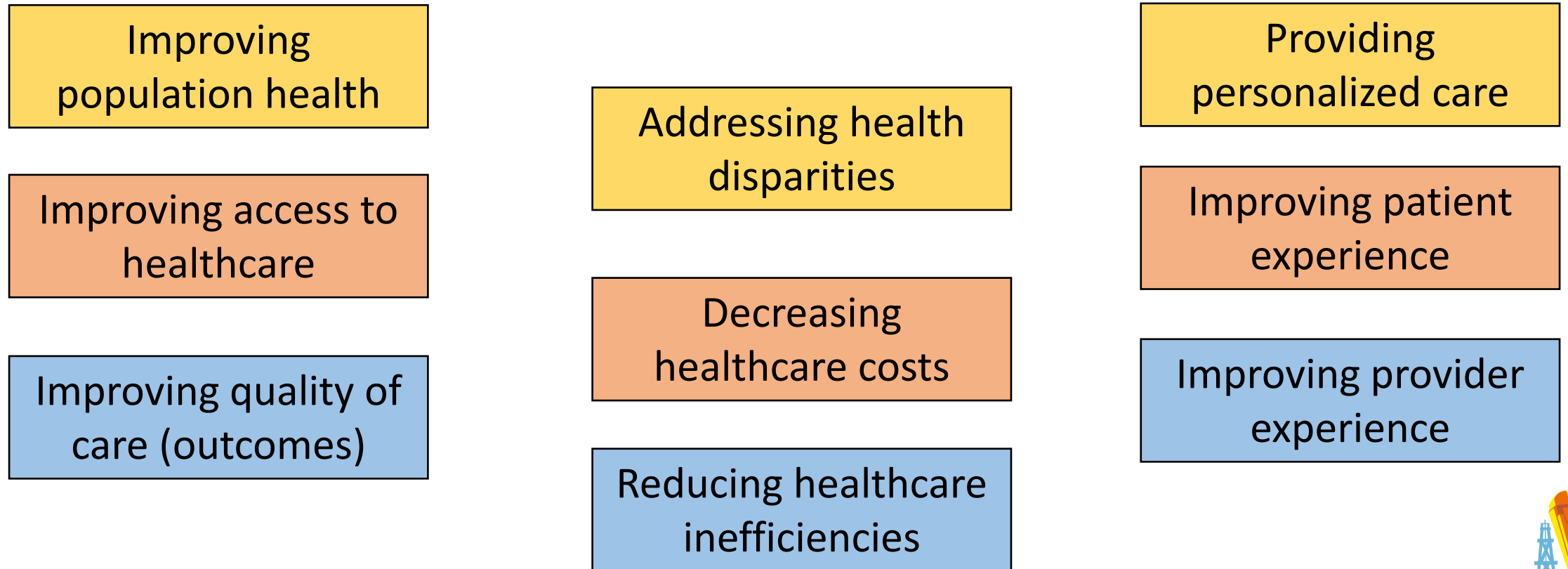

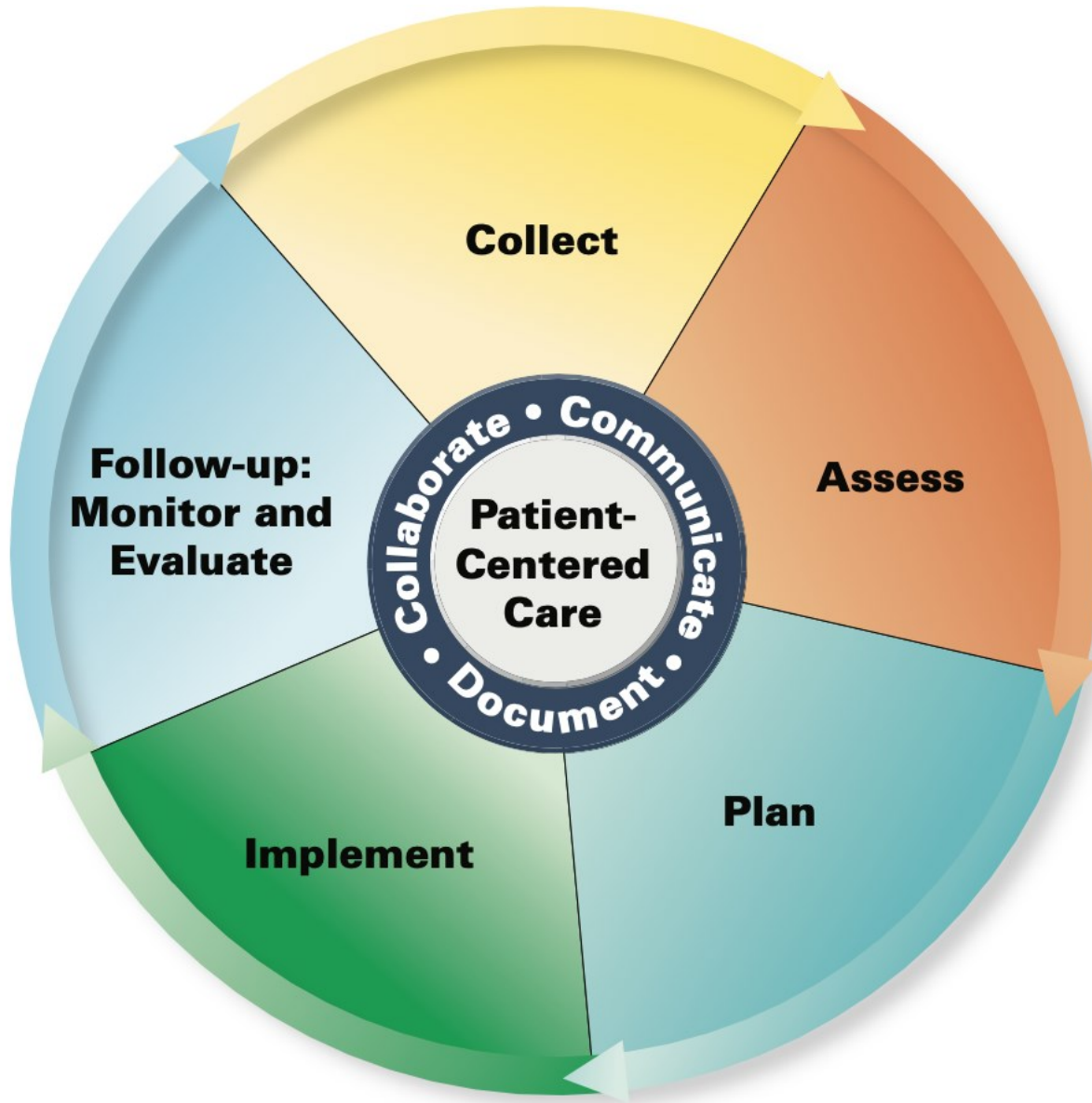

Where and When Should Digital Health Occur in Doctor of Pharmacy Curricula?

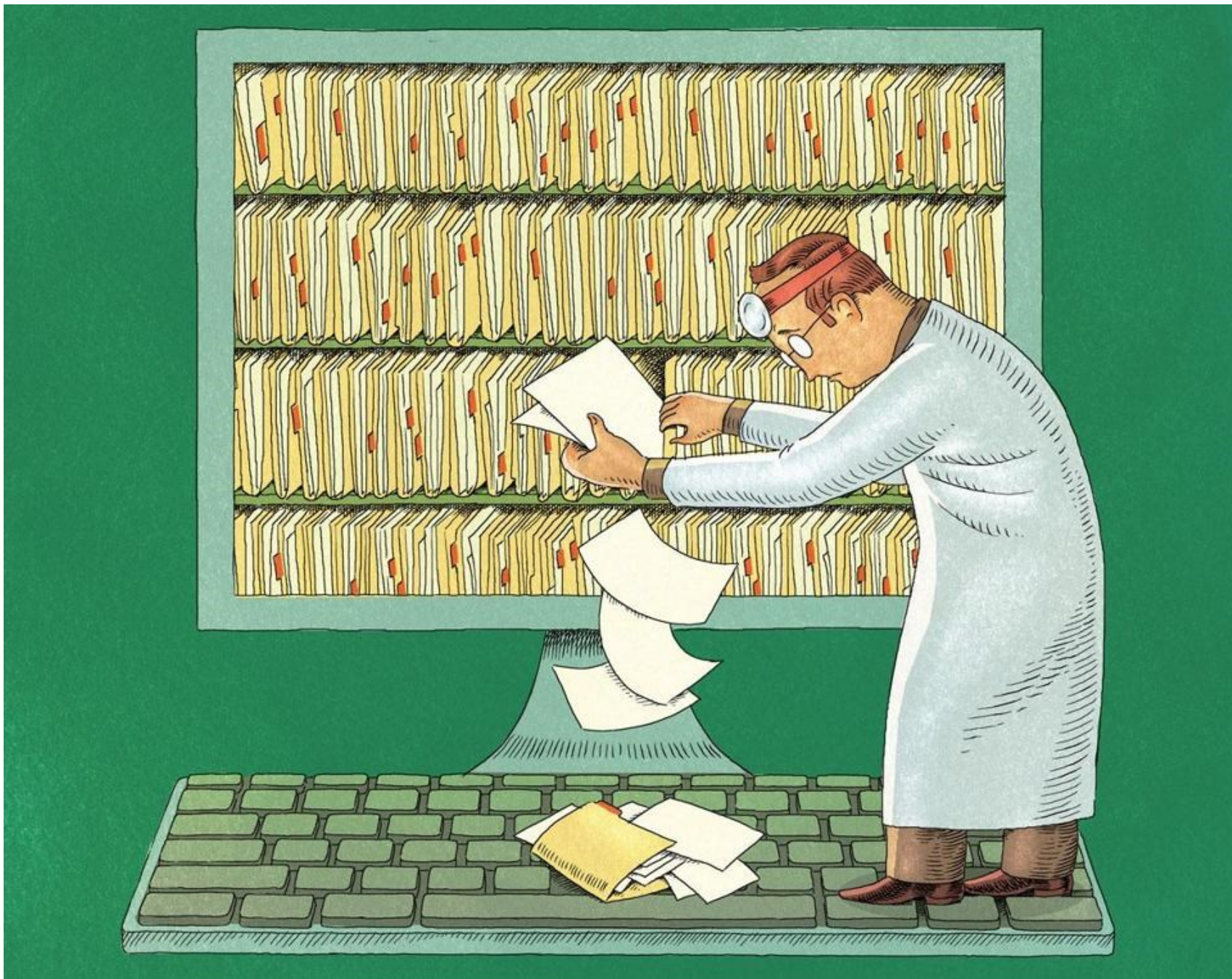


Pharmacists' Patient Care Process



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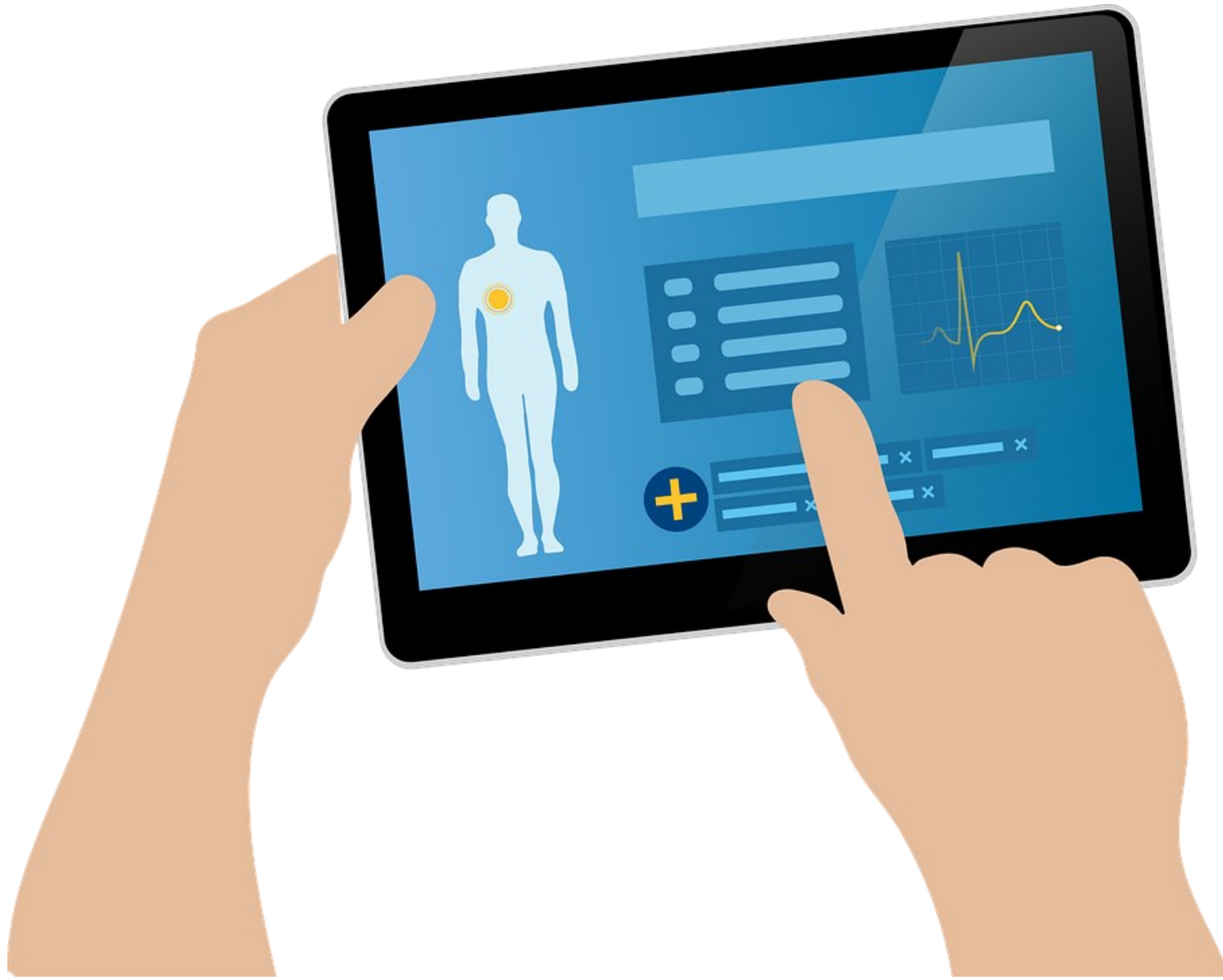




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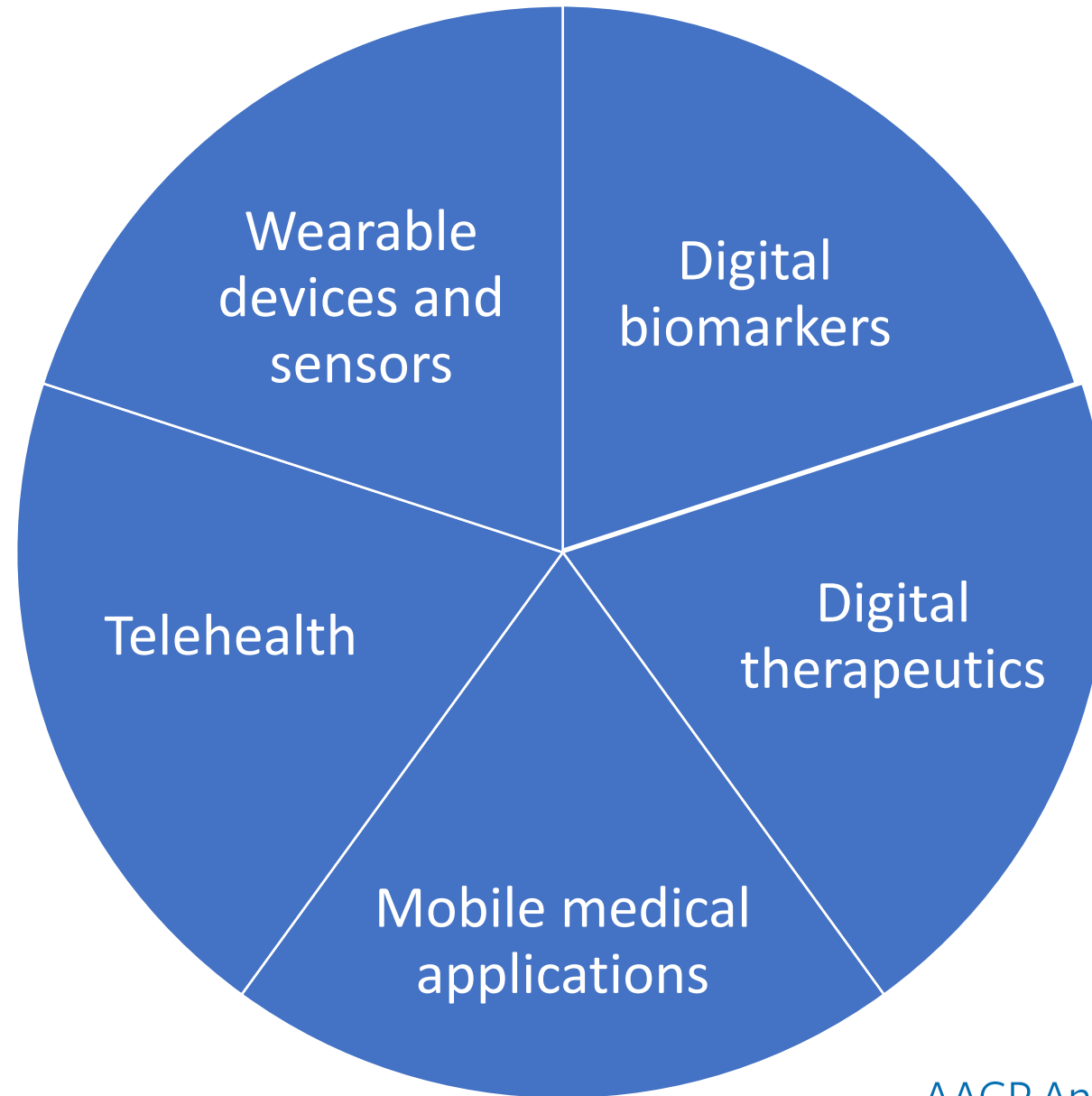
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Core Digital Health Areas for All Student Pharmacists



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Education For All Plus Accommodating Students with Additional Interest

- All students - core digital health areas built into the curriculum
- Students with additional interest
 - Elective track
 - Above plus electives and preference for digital health experiential experiences
 - Possible focus in a particular area of digital health (e.g. informatics, programming, business)
 - Adjunctive degree (concurrently or prior/after)
- Further post-graduate training (e.g. residency, fellowship)

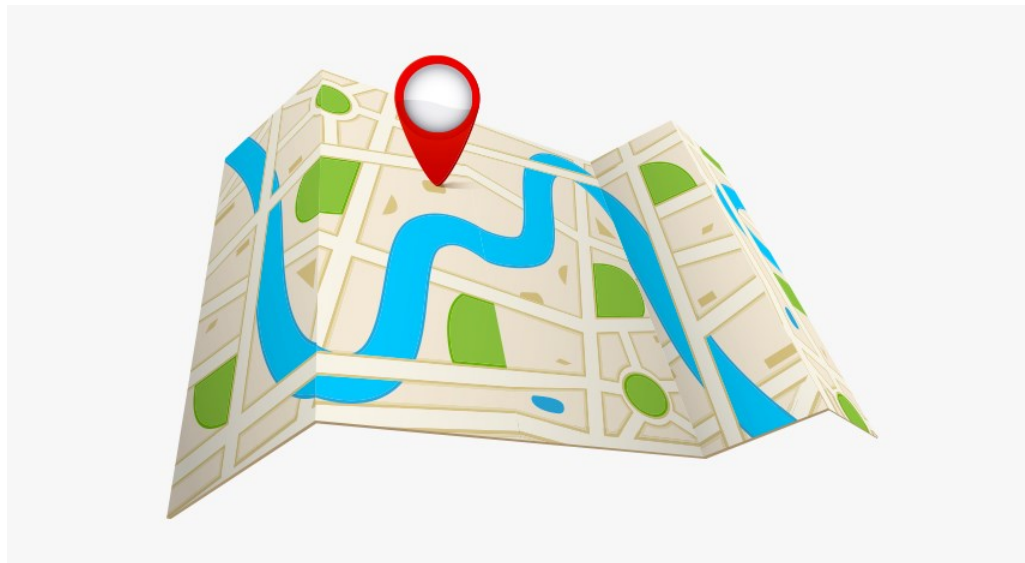

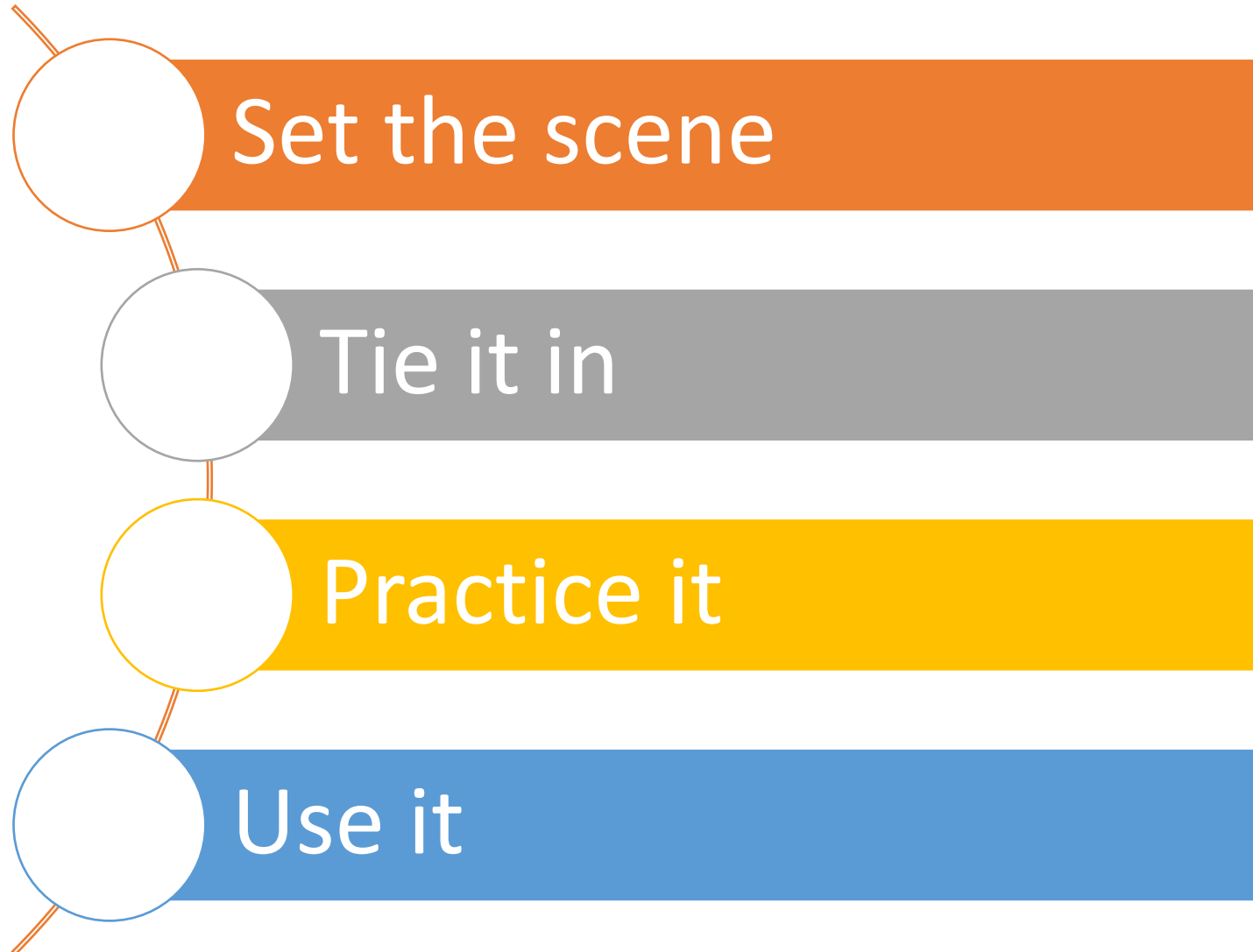

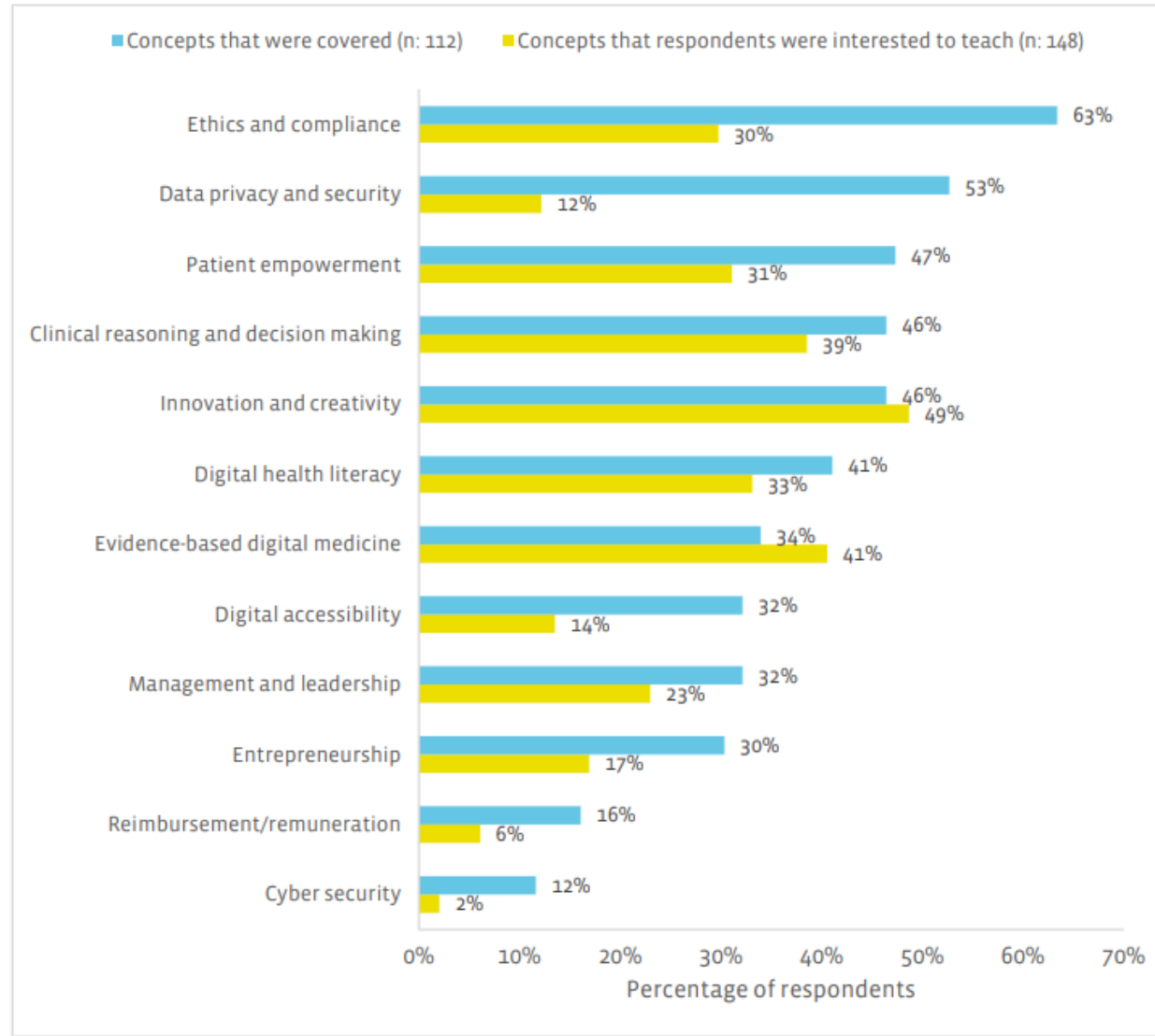


Figure 12. Overview of concepts related to digital health covered in pharmacy school

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Tie it in: Therapeutics

- Reinforce specific DH tools in their respective disease states
 - Continuous glucose monitoring in diabetes
 - Smart watch EKG in arrhythmias
 - Sensor enabled inhalers in asthma or COPD
 - Bio-ingestible medication sensors

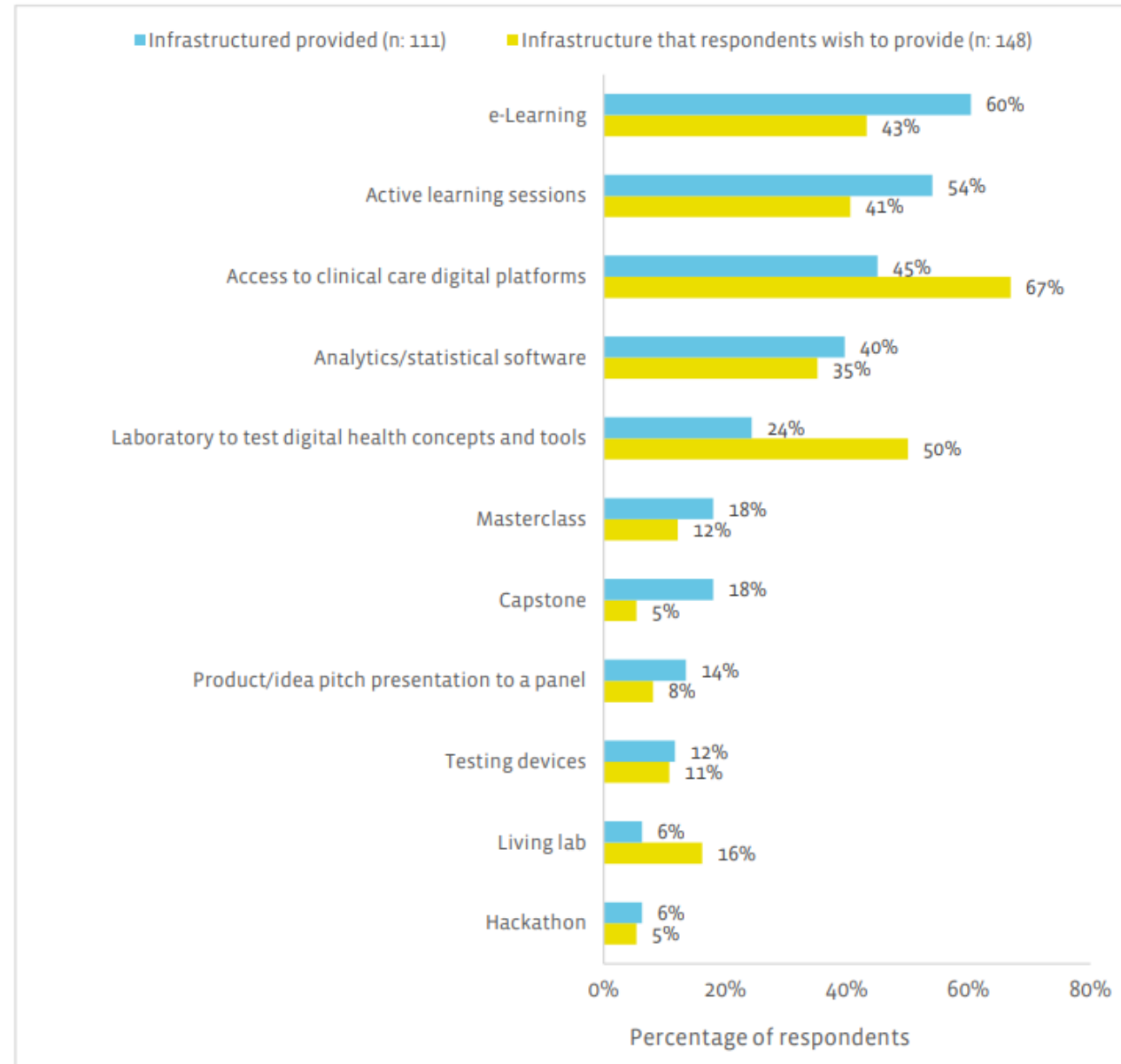
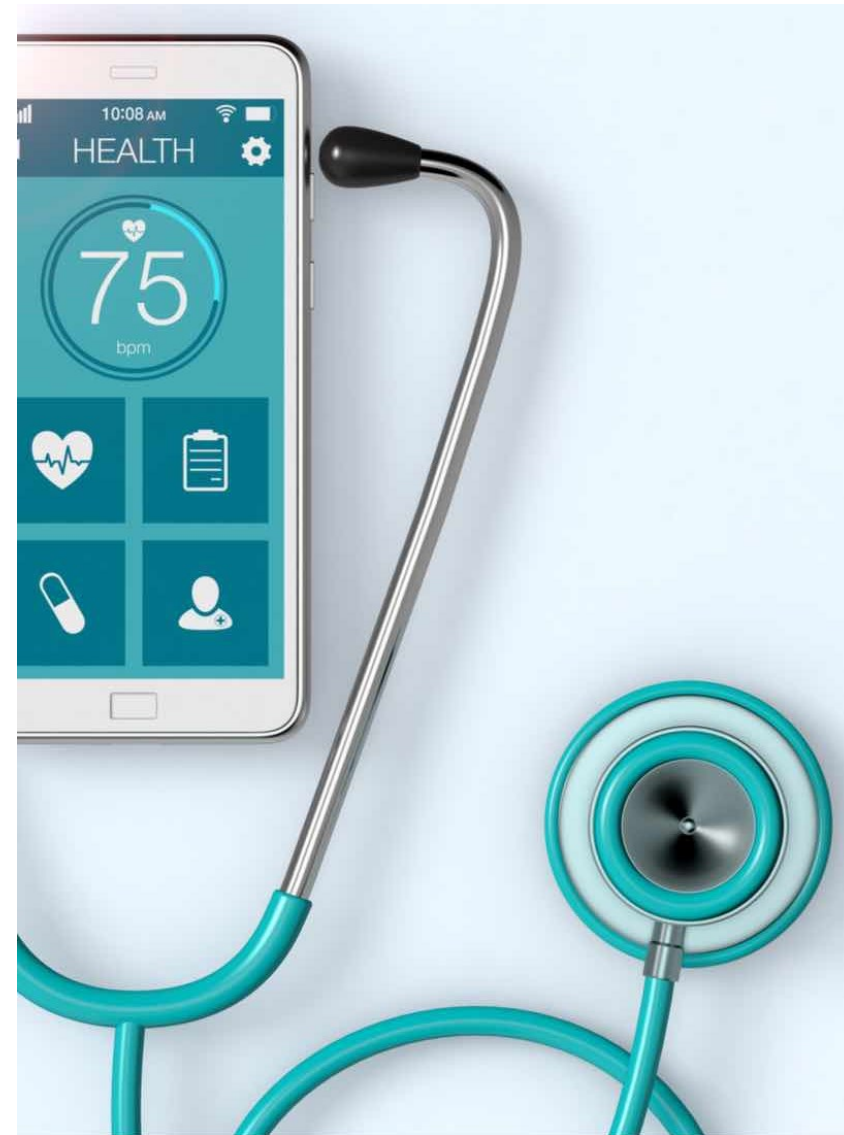


Figure 13. Overview of infrastructures provided to support digital health education

P1

- Didactic lecture in an introductory therapeutics course
- Incorporation into Pharmacist Patient Care Process (PPCP) cases

- Integration of digital health into a case conference series

P4

- Exposure to digital health in different APPE settings
- Reflection on experiential rotations and digital health

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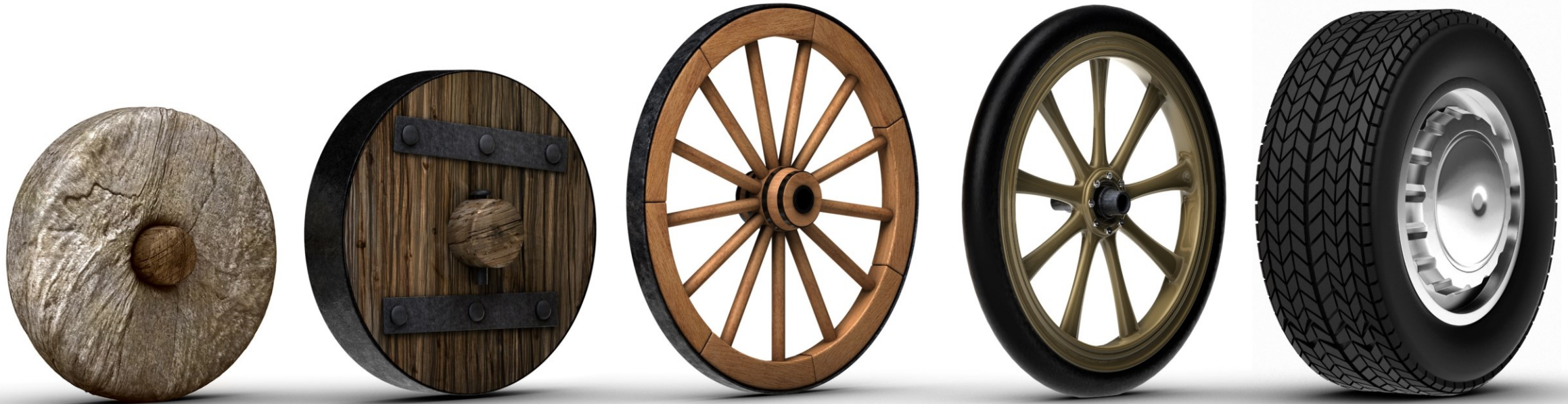

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Didactic (digital health-focused)

- Health Informatics^a / Digital Health^b
 - Importance of **established** (e.g., digital inhalers, wearables) AND **emerging** (e.g., artificial intelligence, blockchain, chatbots) **technologies**
 - **Hands-on** assignments (e.g., app design contest, Cryptozombies blockchain, Cognitive.ai certificates, FreeRice social good, Google Cardboard virtual reality, Grasshopper coding, Misfit wearables)
 - **Career planning** and industry indicators (e.g., resources for seeking digital health positions, review of opportunities)

- CVS's filing also includes the concept of offering non-emergency medical services, as well as nutrition and wellness counseling

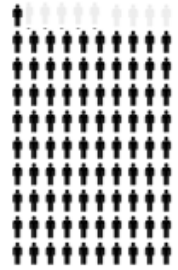
Symbiotic
