





We are more than halfway through winter, and it is 70 degrees out there. Yesterday I saw planters with tulips and daffodils. It makes me think of spring. This is a busy time in Scouting. Pinewood Derbies, Blue and Gold Dinners, Troop Courts of Honor, District Court of Honor, hikes, campouts, camporees and more.

These are all essential and important parts of the Scouting program. But at this time of year, don't forget about the most

important part of Scouting, **SCOUTS.** Now is the time to be thinking about Spring Recruiting. While we tend to think of Fall recruiting as a big and maybe the only deal, Scouts can join at any time of year. Now is an opportunity to bring new Scouts into your Pack or Troop. Some girls and boys may think they missed the boat when they could not get to your Fall join night. Let them know they can get on board now. You have lots of activities going on to invite them to. You don't need to have another join Scouts night. Scouting is a family affair. Reach out to the families you already have for new members. Have each family in your unit invite 1 new family who is not already in Scouts to visit.

Why recruit Cub Scouts in the Spring?

You get them to join before they overload with fall activities.

- You fill out all your dens with new members.
- You start them off with easy Summertime Pack activities.
- You have a couple of months to recruit new den leaders form the new families. You have time to get new leaders trained before the dens start meeting.



Troops, spring is your big time of year to secure the AOL Scouts who are crossing over. Make sure you keep in touch with your local Packs so you don't lose any Scouts in the transition. Those 5th grade Scouts are growing and the Scouts BSA program grows with them. Make sure they know that its not Cub Scouts anymore.

I know as Cubmasters and Scoutmasters you are busy helping put on the program. You need help. That is why every unit should have a **New Member Coordinator/Membership/Marketing Chair** or Team devoted to unit promotion, new membership and on boarding new families. While many Cubmasters end up performing this role, many hands make the work light and, ideally, someone from the committee or your designated New Member Coordinator/Membership/Marketing Chair should be focusing on this. Cubmasters and Scoutmasters have their own, distinct duties associated with their role.

Hey, its spring. Let's get out there and have fun and share the values of Scouting. I'll see you on the trail.





2023 Journey to Excellence – NEW INFO from BSA

Journey to Excellence is the Boy Scouts of America program to help Packs, Troops, Crews, Ships and Posts to plan, monitor and evaluate their performance and their ability to serve youth. There are specific criteria for the unit to plan and accomplish. These standards are reviewed each year and revised standards are published.

The 2022/2023 Journey to Excellence Standards are now available.

Here are the major changes in the JTE scorecards for 2022.

- 1. The standards are written as activities that the unit <u>will</u> do. This is to emphasize that JTE is primarily a planning tool.
- 2. The Cub Scout scorecard has many changed standards. This is because of changes in the Cub Scout program.
- 3. For standard #10, Gold now includes recruiting a new leader. We have found that the best units continually recruit parents and other adults who have never been involved in Scouting.

There is no requirement, no expectation and, in fact, we might discourage a unit from believing that they should achieve Gold in all JTE criteria. A great unit is balanced in the service that it provides to youth. There is no shame and no problem if a unit achieves Silver or Bronze. That unit is serving youth. We regard the various colors as meaning:

Bronze – Effective Silver – Excellent Gold – Exceptional




Reporting Service Hours
