Subject: Written report to the Board for the December 11, 2024 Board meeting

### 2024 Grants Administration:

# • Trail Ambassador Program:

- This is funded by both Clallam Co LTAC and Jefferson Co LTAC 2024 funds.
- Here's a snapshot of the spending and remaining budget:

The \$4,386.88 in the Jefferson County award will be spent on Hall Baetz Viewpoint instead, which was part of our original \$30,000 grant request, of which \$12,000 was awarded. We were going to spend that on the flail mower attachment, but that amendment was rejected because it violates RCW code to use LTAC dollars for things not part of the originally approved scope of work. That's important to remember moving forward.

It's also worth noting that it shows us going over budget in Clallam, but we have plenty of funds in that grant because we applied for more money than we needed or other aspects of the budget. We are hopefully planning better this round.

### • Closing out 2024 grants:

- Closed out:
  - Olympic Peninsula Visitors Bureau (OPVB) award for \$7,500.
  - City of Forks LTAC, \$3,000.
  - City of Sequim LTAC, \$1,800.
  - City of Port Townsend, \$1,500.

### Grants still to be closed out:

We are still spending down the City of Port Angeles LTAC award and Clallam County LTAC.

# Planning for 2025 grants coming up:

- A few opportunities are coming up in 2025, including:
  - City of Port Townsend
    - Deadlines for 2025 have not been released yet, but this was the 2024 schedule: The spring 2024 round of grant applications were due February 23, and the fall 2024 round of grant applications were due August 30.
    - Small requests will do better. In 2024, they whittled down our \$1,700 request to \$1,500. We applied to print the east ODT map, and will likely not need funding for this in 2025 as we requested enough funding for 2 years of maps.
    - What to apply for?
  - City of Sequim
    - Deadlines for 2025 have not been released yet, but this was the 2024 schedule: "Applications must be submitted for consideration by the 15th day of the month prior to a scheduled LTAC review meeting, usually the first Monday of March, June, August, and December".

- As of the 2024 guidelines, "grants will typically be between \$1000 and \$5000 per grantee"
- Apply for TdL-related support? What specifically?
- o OPVB
  - Max \$7,500 per project and \$15,000 total
  - Due dates March 3 and June 2
  - Apply for 2 TdL-related projects? What specifically?
- Review and ranking of projects
  - o How should this be done?
  - We could improve the process used so far by using an online tool like
     Google Forms. Other feedback on how to improve the ranking process?
  - o There will be a bigger discussion of this at the January Board meeting.

# • City of Forks 2025:

- We requested \$3,000 to print the western cycling map, which was designed with 2024 LTAC money from the City of Forks. This was discussed the week of Thanksgiving, and Erik Rohrer attended for the PTC. He shared that our proposal was spoken of favorably, and was optimistic it would be funded.
- We will know the outcome after the 2025 budget is reviewed and approved tonight, 12/9. They are considering funding our request in full. I hope to know the outcome of their decision by the 12/11 Board meeting.

### • Jefferson County LTAC 2025:

- We requested \$35,700, and the LTAC recommended full funding. The BOCC discussed this today, 12/9, and approved it. A contract is forthcoming.

Sanicans County-wide – There are currently 3 sanicans, at the Port of Port Townsend, Trailhead Park in Cape George trailhead, and at Milo Curry trailhead. Only 2 are ADA compliant. Taking over this responsibility will allow us to move the location of the Port of Port Townsend sanican proximal to the present location and be an ADA compliant one. PTC plans to install 2 more, one north of the Discovery Bay trains, and one at the Gardiner Community Center.  Each one cost \$2,300/year, with an additional \$400/month for units to be	
serviced twice a week, for a total cost of \$2,700 per sanican.	\$13,500.00
6 months of rental maintenance equipment.  In 2023, the Peninsula Trails Coalition spent \$1,090 for 6 months of renting maintenance equipment for work on the Larry Scott Trail. Costs are yet to be known for 2024, and the cost will likely increase in 2025.	\$1,200.00

### AARP:

- \$10-\$50K for flagship grant, 6th categories, and we would qualify for creating vibrant public places (HBV), delivering a range of transportation and mobility options. 80% of all grants are under \$20K.
